



SurvivorVision (SV) is organized and operated to attract public support on a continuing basis. SV maintains continuous and bona fide programs for soliciting funds from the public, including a web site that facilitates online donations, donations by mail, collection of funds through PayPal, and the solicitation of donations at multiple fundraising events held throughout the year. SV is a small organization that was formed six years ago, and as such still has a limited number of fund sources. The organization continues to publicly solicit new sponsors and donors, and fundraising activities are reasonable in light of SV's charitable activities. Every year SV helps thousands of pediatric patients and their families, directly, and through grants issued to a wide spectrum of individuals and organizations who run programs or services that aim to improve the quality of life of pediatric cancer fighters and survivors. The organization pays no salaries, and generates very little investment income. Investment income was less than 1/2 of 1%.

SV's public support percentage for 2011, as calculated in Part II of Schedule A, was 15.4%. Had SV's public support percentage been calculated under Part III of Form 990-EZ Schedule A, which includes related revenues generated through fundraising activities, SV's public support percentage would have been 30.2%.

SV's governing body is composed of seven individuals with varying backgrounds and walks of life, including a salesperson, nurse, administrative assistant, and attorney representing the medical, financial and professional services industries. Two individuals also have health industry experience, and the founder of the organization is a pediatric cancer survivor, providing the expertise to manage SV's core mission.

SV assists thousands of children and their families each year through a number of programs, and grants applied for by organizations throughout the country. The Beads of Courage program is supported by SV through its relationship with 21 hospitals in 17 states across the country from New York, to Florida, to Minnesota, to California, to Hawaii, and 2 provinces in Canada. All of these participating or sponsoring organizations here have specialized knowledge or expertise in the medical industry, and specifically expertise in pediatric oncology and/or the effect cancer has on patients and survivors.

Baylor College of Medicine's (BCM's) Texas Children's Cancer Center (TCCC) is the largest pediatric hospital in the United States, and one of the largest pediatric care centers in the country, conducting over 35,000 outpatient visits and treating more than 2,000 new patients yearly. Survivors of childhood cancer face threats to their long-term health and quality of life due to the treatment they received. These challenges are magnified by the fact that most childhood cancer survivors receive follow-up care from community-based primary care providers who often have little knowledge of cancer related late effects or strategies for managing them. To address this challenge, the Children's Oncology Group (COG) developed a comprehensive set of evidence and consensus-based childhood cancer survivor screening guidelines. In order to make the evidence and consensus-based recommendations readily available to clinicians, BCM developed the Passport for Care portal - the internet source of the COG follow-up guidelines. The PFC clinician portal has been rolled out to 90 childhood cancer centers, with 60 additional centers in stages of implementation, but does not provide access to survivors. It is critical to engage survivors in their care to realize the best results of health risk management, and allow those survivors the ability to access critical information for themselves and their clinicians anywhere in the world. Survivor Vision is proud to provide BCM the support necessary to complete the development of the PFC Survivor Web portal that will provide essential information to survivors on the risks they face, as well as resources and strategies for managing these risks. The portal will be available via numerous browsers, and across a full range of platforms that are used by a growing number of individuals, particularly people from groups historically underserved in health settings, including racial and ethnic minorities and low income individuals.

- providing phone screenings regarding children's/patients' cognitive, academic, social and emotional function.
- providing pro bono testing to the large number of cancer patients and families participating in the state-funded Kid's Care program and/or

Medicaid, who do not have access to neuropsychological follow-up, as such services are not reimbursed by the Illinois Department of Health and Human Services.

In 2012, 41 different cancer patients or survivors applied for and received text book scholarships totaling \$28,695.
