Strategic Grantmaking Guidelines

Established in 1977, the State Street Foundation is the charitable grantmaking arm of State Street Corporation. Supporting the communities in which we live and work around the world is one of State Street's fundamental values. The Foundation is dedicated to enriching these communities through contributions to charitable organizations and supporting causes important to State Street employees. Specifically, we administer the funds for Strategic Grantmaking, Matching Gifts and Disaster Relief Emergency Assistance.

STRATEGIC GRANTMAKING

Mission

The mission of the State Street Foundation's Strategic Grantmaking program is to contribute to the sustainability of communities where State Street operates, primarily by investing in education and workforce development for disadvantaged populations. The Foundation also provides grants to organizations and programs that deliver critical services to help people along the path to economic self-sufficiency.

Vision

The State Street Foundation believes that increasing an individual's ability to earn and maintain a living contributes to the overall health and well-being of our communities around the world. By investing resources with this in mind, the Foundation strives to resolve issues of skill shortages, regional competitiveness and income disparity between those with and without education and job skills. We collaborate with peers, educational institutions and charitable organizations to help ensure that populations where we operate are economically thriving and that a pipeline of entry- and intermediate-level talent is available to meet employer needs.

Investment Focus

The State Street Foundation's primary focus is on initiatives that ultimately help disadvantaged populations, both adult and youth, obtain the skills required to compete in the 21st-century, knowledge-based global economy. Prioritization of funding will reflect the varying needs of our communities in the distinct geographic regions where we operate. Special attention will be given to:

Educational programs as they relate to employability:

- Public school education retention through secondary school graduation
- Pathways to post-secondary education and graduation
- Adult basic education, including math, reading and language proficiency

Job readiness and life-skills education related to career development:

- Youth development, mentoring and career awareness
- Youth employment programs
- Adult job-training and job-placement programs

Career pathways and sector partnership initiatives

- Vocational and technical training
- Career progression training programs focused on specific industries

Our secondary focus is to provide limited support for organizations and programs that deliver critical support services necessary to achieve individual and regional economic sustainability, as well as funding flexibility to respond to rapidly changing community needs. Special attention will be given to:

- Comprehensive or systemic approaches to affordable housing and hunger reduction
- Strategic community improvement investments

Eligibility and Types of Support**Disadvantaged Populations**

Grant support is focused on supporting disadvantaged groups that may include:

- Low-income
- Undereducated
- Unemployed and underemployed
- Secondary school dropouts, including at-risk/high-risk youth
- Disabled seeking employment or advancement
- Immigrants entering or advancing within the workforce

Eligible Organizations

Grant support is focused on the communities where State Street has a business presence and is limited to organizations that hold charitable status in their country. Eligible organizations must operate on a not-for-profit basis and stand by a mission to benefit the local community. To be eligible, an organization must be operated and organized so that it does not discriminate in the hiring of staff or provision of services on the basis of race, citizenship, creed, disability, gender, sexual orientation, marital status, age or religion. Consideration is given only to organizations and pursuits that complement the funding priority areas outlined in the Investment Focus section.

Types of Support

The State Street Foundation considers three principal types of grants.

PROJECT SUPPORT GRANTS The Foundation supports specific projects or programs aligned with the Foundation's primary investment focus. These requests may include some funds earmarked for the overhead costs associated with running a project, including staff.

GENERAL OPERATING SUPPORT GRANTS The Foundation will provide limited general operating support for the core operations of organizations whose missions and activities are highly aligned with the Foundation's primary investment focus. These grants will often help the grantee build organizational, programmatic and fundraising capacity. Operating support is not intended to help organizations in fiscal crisis. Applicants must have a current strategic or business plan that clearly outlines the organization's goals and presents a plan for achieving results. Operating support grants must not exceed 10–15 percent of an organization's total agency budget.

CAPITAL SUPPORT GRANTS The Foundation will provide limited support for capital campaigns to fund the acquisition and construction of facilities, existing property renovation or the purchase of major equipment. The Foundation has a comprehensive approach to funding capital initiatives, which also includes funding for increased program capacity. Generally, an 80/20 split is recommended with the majority going toward capital support. To be eligible for capital support, applicants must have an ongoing partnership with State Street and/or the Foundation. A feasibility study may be required for capital initiatives to be considered.

Foundation Restrictions

Funding is not considered for

- Endowments
- Political causes, candidates, organizations or campaigns
- Organizations whose primary purpose is to influence legislation
- Individual pursuits, including scholarships and other forms of financial aid
- Sectarian activities for religious organizations
- Travel for individuals or groups
- Political, labor or fraternal organizations
- Team sponsorships or sporting events
- Medical research and disease-specific initiatives
- Grant requests made in consideration of any benefit to State Street

Selection Criteria

The State Street Foundation conducts a disciplined review of each grant application received. Grant applicants should keep the following selection criteria in mind when completing a request. Although applicants are not required to meet all of these criteria, it will help to strengthen an application.

Strategic Fit

- Embraces a mission similar to the Foundation and aligns with the Foundation's funding priorities (preference given to strong and innovative programs that drive sustained impact on the needs of the population being served)

Measurable Results

- Tracks and reports program outcomes and other indicators of success, as well as specific results that demonstrate measurable community impact

Organizational and Programmatic Sustainability

- Effectively manages within the framework of a strategic business plan
- Possesses the experience and knowledge as applicable to the chosen field, given the social need and population being addressed
- Has a comprehensive and effective program design
- Operates and manages within the organization's capacity in the program and/or project for which funds are being requested
- Administers a sustainable operating budget and reasonable staffing numbers
- Contains a diversified and adequate fundraising plan, so the organization is not reliant on any one source
- Demonstrates sound financial management

Collaboration

- Works with strategic partners, such as communities, governments, businesses and field experts, to formulate and execute solutions for those efforts that may be beyond the capacity of a single organization

APPLICATION PROCESS

There is a two-step process governing the consideration of your request.

Step 1 You must first submit a two-page Letter of Interest. (If you have received State Street Foundation funding in the past three years, you may skip this step.) The letter should describe the reason you are seeking support, as well as the geographic area(s) and population(s) to be served. Once we review the letter, you will be notified as to how to proceed with the application process. Letters of Interest may be submitted at any time and are reviewed continually throughout the year. Please send the letter via e-mail to the Philanthropy Program contact in your area, which can be found on our [website](#).
