The Dottie Kirkley Weaver Scholarship

The Dottie Kirkley Weaver Scholarship Information

The Dottie Kirkley Weaver Scholarship was established in 1999 by the Victoria Susan Sutton Charitable Trust. Mrs. Weaver served as women's basketball coach of Fort Mill High School during the late 1960's and early 1970's, instilling in her players a strong sense of honesty, equality and fair play. All whose lives she touched came away richer, having received the invaluable gift of a kind and devoted mentor.

Vicki Sutton established the Weaver Scholarship on behalf of all those who had the privilege of a knowing Dottie Kirkley Weaver. Ms. Sutton believes that the scholarship is an apt way to remember a special teacher, coach and friend while affording deserving female athletes from Fort Mill High School the opportunity to continue their education.

Eligibility

To be eligible for the Dottie Kirkley Weaver Scholarship, an applicant must:

- (a) be a female graduating senior of Fort Mill High School;
- (b) have participated in a sport at Fort Mill High School for at least one semester;
- (c) have been accepted at an accredited two- or four-year college or university, including a community college; and
- (d) have an overall high school grade point average of 2.5 through the first semester of her high school senior year.

Nature of the Award

One scholarship will be awarded each academic year. The amount of the scholarship will equal the recipient's actual tuition and fees at any accredited college or university in the United States, including a community college, up to the cost of in-state tuition and fees charged by the University of South Carolina at Columbia for each year of the award. The award will be paid directly to the educational institution on the recipient's behalf. A recipient may receive the scholarship for up to four years of study so long as she remains a full-time student and maintains a grade point average of at least 2.5 for each academic year. A recipient shall provide to the Trust an official transcript prior to each annual renewal.

Selection Process and Criteria

A committee composed of one teacher, one representative from the athletic department, one guidance counselor and one Board Member of the Victoria Susan Sutton Charitable Trust will review each application and will select the top three candidates. The selection committee then may

elect to interview the top three candidates, and members of the Board of the Victoria Susan Sutton Charitable Trust will be invited to attend those interviews. The committee and any Board member who wishes to participate then will select the scholarship recipient.

In making its decision, the committee will consider the following:

- (a) the applicant's role as a leader in athletic programs at Fort Mill High School, with particular emphasis placed on the applicant's sportsmanship and character;
- (b) the applicant's ability and promise of future achievement; and
- (c) evidence of the applicant's financial need.

Applicants are asked to indicate on the application form whether they have applied, or intend to apply, for any similar scholarships. The selection committee reserves the right to abate the Weaver scholarship if a Weaver Scholar is the beneficiary of other significant scholarships, awards or prizes.

Application Process

Application packets are available in the guidance office. They should be completed and submitted to the guidance office no later than March 15. The Dottie Kirkley Weaver Scholar will be selected by and announced at the Spring Sports Banquet or by May 31.

In addition to completing the attached scholarship application form, applicants should submit a high school transcript. Applicants also should ensure that their recommendation forms are submitted before the deadline by their chosen coach and teacher.
