The closing of the sale and transfer of NPCI's assets and contract with the National Park Service took place on February 1, 2001. NPCI appreciates all of the efforts of you and your staff in assisting with the approval by the Director, especially during this period of pressing issues besieging the the Division of Concessions at this time.

As we discussed during our telephone conversation last month, it was felt that the National Park Service would not be prepared to nominate the improvements to our Board of Directors at its originally scheduled Annual Meeting the second Monday in February. The Annual Meeting therefore, has been re-scheduled for March 16, 17 and, if necessary, the morning of March 18, 2001. These dates were selected in order for one member of the Board to avoid a conflict which would have prevented her attendance earlier in the week.

As I noted during our conversation, the meeting will be held as stated in our By-Laws in Washington, D. C. We have made arrangements for our meeting to be held at the Madison Hotel, 15th and "M" Streets. We are arriving in mid-afternoon on Thursday.

In our conversation, you suggested that you would be in the office that week and that either yourself or a member of your staff would be available to meet with the Board to nominate the projects to be initially funded by National Park Concessions, Inc. in accordance with our Agreement dated January 25, 2001. The Board is prepared to make itself available to meet with you or members of your staff any time on Friday, March 16, 2001 or Saturday, March 17, 2001 to review and consider the projects the NPS will nominate. After consideration selection of a project, NPCI is prepared to make the initial \$500,000.00 contribution to fund the first project selected by our Board.

Our board is also prepared to propose a financial institution

which has in the past demonstrated its ability to prudently invest the Corporation's assets and pension fund while we were still an operating entity. An investment proposal had been prepared for presentation last fall when we anticipated the approval for the transfer would be forthcoming by year-end. Due to changes in the financial markets late last year, we have requested that the proposal be updated. This proposal should be completed next week and we will forward a copy to your office for review. Our assets are currently invested in a mutual fund, Northern Government Portfolio, which invests only in government backed securities (Federal Home Loans, Fannie Maes, etc.).

National Park Concessions, Inc. looks forward to assuming its new role in assisting the National Park Service in improving concessioner facilities in the five parks in which we formerly operated.

#### AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made as of the 25<sup>th</sup> day of conumber 1, 2001, by and between the National Park Service, U.S. Department of the Interior (NPS), and National Park Concessions, Inc., a Delaware non-profit corporation (NPCI).

WHEREAS, NPCI has operated concessions in five national parks pursuant to Concession Contract No. CC-WASO001-82; and

WHEREAS, on May 30, 2000, NPCI agreed to assign its contract and sell related property to Forever NPC Resorts, LLC (Forever), all such transactions being approved by the NPS on invitary 25, November 8, 2000, with the date of closing being on or before February 1, 2001 and

WHEREAS, NPCI has ceased being an operating company in national parks as of such closing; and

WHEREAS, the membership and Board of Directors have no proprietary interest in the assets or earnings of NPCI, which have been devoted exclusively to the furnishing of facilities necessary to the well-being and convenience of the visiting public in areas administered by the National Park Service; and

WHEREAS, NPCI wishes to utilize its assets to benefit visitors to national parks by assisting in the upgrading of facilities in national parks through donations to the National Park Service; and

WHEREAS, the NPS has authority to accept the assets dedicated under this Agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing, of the mutual promises herein contained, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, it is hereby agreed by the parties as follows:

- 1. NPCI will dedicate its assets for improvements in Big Bend National Park, Texas, Isle Royale National Park, Michigan, Mammoth Cave National Park, Kentucky, Olympic National Park, Washington, and Blue Ridge Parkway, Virginia and North Carolina in which it operated prior to the above referenced assignment and sale. The NPS shall nominate such improvements which will be selected by the Board of Directors of NPCI. The NPS may nominate any improvements, but will give preference to improvements which are related to concession facilities available to the public.
- For purposes of this Agreement, the assets dedicated to such improvements, to be held in a separate segregated fund, shall include the proceeds of the sale of possessory interest and related property to Forever and all cash or other assets existing at the time of closing convertible into cash plus the amounts received under the Settlement Agreement, less annual operating expenses as set forth in paragraph 5 hereof. The parties agree that the expenditure

of Settlement Agreement funds pursuant to this Agreement is consistent with the Settlement Agreement.

- 3. In the first quarter of 2001, applicable to the year 2000, NPCI shall distribute to the NPS for improvements an amount no less than \$500,000. In the first quarter of 2002 and in the first quarter of each year thereafter, applicable to the preceding calendar year, NPCI shall distribute to the NPS for improvements no less than \$500,000, increased by the CPI factor until the fund is exhausted. The NPS may elect to defer any such payments to a subsequent year.
- 4. After consultation with the NPS, NPCI will engage an investment manager for advice with regard to the investment of the assets held in the separate segregated fund which shall be invested in equities and fixed income instruments. NPCI shall have a target of investing no more than 60% in equities, understanding that appreciation or depreciation in asset classes and liquidation requirements to fund improvements under this Agreement may result in a higher investment percentage for some time periods. Investment-expenses-will-be-deducted from such fund balance.
- 5. For the years 2000 and 2001, NPCI shall draw from the fund to the extent necessary to pay for remaining obligations of the company, contingent or otherwise, (and add to the fund deposits and other payments received which are attributable to NPCI's operations) as well as reasonable operating expenses associated with its new role including, but not limited to, office rent, general office expense, secretarial and administrative expense, independent licensed or certified public accountant fees, and meeting expenses including board of directors fees. For years 2002 and for each year thereafter until termination, NPCI shall draw from the fund an amount not to exceed \$50,000, increased by the CPI factor, as necessary to pay for the expenses referenced in this paragraph. In addition, during this period, NPCI may draw from the fund any additional amounts necessary to satisfy any claims or obligations arising from its operations as an active business prior to the date of closing and reasonable costs associated with its corporate dissolution.
- 6. Other than the investment transactions enumerated in paragraph 4 above, NPCI's assets will not be transferred, sold or assigned without the consent of the NPS.
- 7. Upon dissolution, NPCI's assets will be donated to the "United States of America, to be expended by the Secretary of the Interior" as stated in the ninth section of its Certificate of Incorporation.
- 8. All activities pursuant to this Agreement and the provisions of Executive Order No. 11246, 3 CFR 339 (1964-65) shall be in compliance with the requirements of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (78 Stat. 252; 42 U.S.C. §2000d et seq.); Title V, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (87 Stat. 394; 29 U.S.C. §794); the Age Discrimination Act of 1975 (89 Stat. 728, 42 U.S.C. §6101 et seq.); and with all other Federal laws and regulations prohibiting discrimination on grounds of race, color, national origin, handicap, religion or sex in providing for facilities and services to the public.

- 9. Nothing contained in this Agreement shall be construed as binding the NPS to expend in any one fiscal year any sum in excess of appropriations made by Congress, and available for the purposes of this Agreement for that fiscal year, or as involving the United States in any contract or other obligation for the further expenditure of money in excess of or in advance of receipts of such appropriations or other funds. No Federal funding for this project is anticipated.
- 10. No member of, or Delegate to, or Resident Commissioner in, Congress shall be admitted to any share or part of this Agreement or to any benefit to arise therefrom, unless the share or part or benefit is for the general benefit of a corporation or company.
- 11. NPCI must obtain prior approval from the NPS before:
  - A. Commencing any fundraising campaign;
  - B. Holding special events on Federally owned land within the park boundary;
  - C. Entering into third-party agreements of a material nature;
  - D. Assigning this Agreement or any part thereof;
  - E. Constructing any improvements on park lands; or
  - F. Releasing any public information that refers to the Department of the Interior, any Bureau or employee (by name or title), or to this Agreement. The specific text, layout, photographs, etc., of the proposed release must be submitted to the park along with the request for approval.

#### 12. NPCI shall:

- A. Maintain accounting books and records in accord with recognized accounting principles and shall make those records available for audit by the NPS, its designee, or the Comptroller General of the United States;
- B. Annually furnish to the NPS a financial report of NPCI's activities under this Agreement in a form acceptable to the NPS. The report shall be prepared by an independent licensed or certified public accountant and shall be in such detail that all gross receipts realized and expenses incurred by, or accruing to, NPCI in connection with activities under this Agreement will be included; and
- C. Permit the NPS, or its designee, to verify and audit the financial reports from the books, correspondence, memoranda, and other records of NPCI, during the period of this Agreement, and for such time thereafter as may be necessary to accomplish such verification.

13. The CPI factor shall be computed by using the December 2000 Consumer Price Index as the base amount and calculating, in December of each year, the cumulative increase from that base amount and expressing that difference as a percentage of the base amount.

### Statement Of Current Affairs

National Park Concessions, Inc. for approximately sixty years provided concession facilities and services to visitors at national parks. During the past twenty years, these services were provided at Mammoth Cave National Park, Blue Ridge Parkway National Park, Big Bend National Park, Isle Royale National Park, and Olympic National Park.

The Articles of Incorporation for National Park Concessions, Inc. provide that upon the termination or liquidation of the corporation, the assets would be used for the benefit of the United States of America. All during its existence National Park Concessions, Inc. has operated as a tax free organization under the provisions of Internal Revenue Code Section 501C4.

National Park Concessions, Inc. ceased operating as a concessions contractor in national parks at midnight, January 31, 2001. Forever/NPC Resorts, LLC of 7501 East McCormick Boulevard, Scottsdale, Arizona 85248, assumed the concession contract rights of National-Park Concessions, Inc. and began serving the national park visitor February 1, 2001:

The assignment of the concession contract rights from National Park Concessions, Inc. to Forever/NPC Resorts, LLC was done with the prior knowledge of and written approval of the United States of America, Department of Interior, National Park Service.

The National Park Service directed that the funds of National Park Concession, Inc. held after the assignment of the contract rights would be properly handled, invested, reported, and spent on projects in national parks of the United States of America that would benefit visitors to the national parks. The national parks to benefit would be primarily those five national parks served by National Park Concessions, Inc. at the time of the assignment of the concession contract rights.

National Park Concessions, Inc., therefore, will be continuing its work to benefit visitors to national parks of the United States of America. It will still operate under its tax exemption of Internal Revenue Code Section 501C4.

National Park Concessions, Inc. looks forward to working with the National Park Service, Department of the Interior, and United States of America in completing the terms and conditions of its agreement and obligations.
