MINUTES OF DEBTOR – CREDITOR MEETING 7/8/10

A meeting was held on July 8th, 2010 to discuss and resolve problems with various outstanding loans as described below.

The officers present to discuss these issues were:

Robert Bernecker, as President of Bernecker's Nursery, Inc. and additionally as President of Bernecker Charitable Foundation, Inc., and Donald Bernecker, as Trustee of the Robert G Bernecker Irrevocable 2001 Trust.

The specifics and status of the following Notes were discussed at length:

1. A Mortgage Note in the amount of 1,000,000.00 was executed on October 4th, 2005 in favor of the Robert G Bernecker Irrevocable 2001 Trust by Helen Michael and Preferred Enterprises, Inc., and said note was due in full on October 4th, 2007. This note is currently in default, and funds are not available to pay principal or interest. The note is secured by real estate that has been on the market continuously since late 2005 to the present, and the asking price has been reduced many times during that period of time. The real estate market in the United States was unexpectedly depressed during this period, and, more specifically, the South Florida real estate market has suffered a severe decline and development properties such as the property secured by this note have nearly completely stopped selling during this period. Therefore, while the property remains on the market, there is not a reasonable expectation that it can or will be sold in the near future. If the Robert G. Bernecker Irrevocable 2001 Trust were to foreclose on the property, it would be thereby assuming the annual property tax liability for the property and any other current cash flow requirements, and yet would not have any reasonable expectation to be able to sell the property any faster than Mrs. Michael and/or Preferred Enterprises, Inc.
2. A Promissory Note in the amount of \$500,000.00 was executed on February 7th, 2007 by the Robert G. Bernecker Irrevocable 2001 Trust in favor of Bernecker's Nursery, Inc., and this note was due in full on February 8th, 2008. At the time the note was executed, the Robert G. Bernecker Irrevocable 2001 Trust had substantially no liquid funds available as a result of the investment made in the Mortgage Note referenced above as Item 1, and Bernecker's Nursery, Inc. had substantial cash reserves that were not needed for business purposes at the time and that were earning extremely low rates of return in money market type instruments. Therefore, it was judged in the best interests of both organizations for this Promissory Note to be executed. It was anticipated at the time that the real estate that was security for the Mortgage Note (Item 1, above) would be sold quickly within the next several months, and that the Trust would use the proceeds from the pay-off of the Mortgage Note (Item 1) to very quickly repay this loan

from Bernecker's Nursery, Inc. Unfortunately, the South Florida real estate market unexpectedly "crashed", the pending sale for the real estate fell through, and the real estate remains unsold despite numerous reductions in the asking price. The Robert G. Bernecker Irrevocable 2001 Trust has not had, and does not currently have, enough cash to pay either the principal or the interest due on this Promissory Note executed on February 7th, 2007 (Item 2), so the note is in default. Because the Trust is the 100% shareholder of Bernecker's Nursery, Inc., Bernecker's Nursery, Inc. has not pursued collection efforts, which would, in effect, be attempting to collect from itself.

3. Shortly following the execution of the Promissory Note described in Item 2 above, Bernecker's Nursery, Inc. begin to experience cash flow issues of its own. Anticipating a speedy sale of the real estate securing the Mortgage Note in Item 1 above (which would have resulted in the early pay-offs of both the Mortgage Note described in Item 1 and the Promissory Note described in Item 2), the Nursery borrowed cash from the Bernecker Charitable Foundation, Inc. The Bernecker Charitable Foundation had plenty of liquid funds at the time that were earning an extremely low yield in money-market type investments, so the considerable step-up in yield offered by Bernecker's Nursery, Inc. to the Foundation made this a desirable investment for the Bernecker Charitable Foundation, Inc., one that was considered at the time to be in the best interest of the Foundation. Two Promissory Notes were executed by Bernecker's Nursery, Inc. in favor of Bernecker Charitable Foundation, Inc.; the notes were in the amounts of \$300,000.00 and \$200,000.00, and were dated April 12th, 2007 and January 23rd, 2008 respectively. It was anticipated that both of these notes could and would be paid off by the proceeds that Bernecker's Nursery, Inc. would receive from the pay-off of the Promissory Note described in Item 2. In essence, Bernecker's Nursery, Inc. was now holding a note receivable in the amount of \$500,000.00 (Item 2) and notes payable in the amount of \$500,000.00 (Items 3); which was a wash on the Nursery's balance sheet. Unfortunately, since executing the two notes payable described as Items 3, Bernecker's Nursery, Inc. has experienced a severe decline in business revenue as a result of the national recession and economic turn-down, and is struggling to maintain adequate cash flow to even remain in business. As such, Bernecker's Nursery, Inc. is not able to currently pay or service the debt or interest expenses created by these two Promissory Notes, and these notes are currently in default.

After complete discussion, it was concluded that:

- A. As a result of the huge reduction in revenue and losses experienced by Bernecker's Nursery, Inc. as a result of the national economic recession, Bernecker's Nursery, Inc. is not capable of paying the principal or the interest due on the Promissory Notes described in Item 3 above. Bernecker's Nursery, Inc. would only have enough assets to pay these notes in the event of a total liquidation and sale and/or auction of

- corporate assets and it is uncertain that there would be enough assets even in this eventuality. Further, the current economic situation makes it very unlikely that such a sale and/or liquidation could be accomplished in any manner in the foreseeable future.
- B. The Robert G. Bernecker Irrevocable 2001 Trust is the sole shareholder of Bernecker's Nursery, Inc., and as a result of the Promissory Note described in Item 2 above, also owes Bernecker's Nursery, Inc. an amount of principal equal to the amount of principal that is owed by Bernecker's Nursery, Inc. to the Bernecker Charitable Foundation, Inc. The Trust does not have the cash to pay the Promissory Note described in Item 2 above, and it would not make sense to liquidate the Nursery in order to raise cash to pay a debt owed to the Nursery.
 - C. None of the Notes (Items 1, 2, or 3) can be paid at this time, and will likely only be payable if and when the Mortgage Note described in Item 1 above is paid off as a result of the sale of the property securing that note. While the investment in the Mortgage Note is secure by virtue of the real property that is securing the note, the amount of interest, profit, or loss that may eventually be realized from this investment is very uncertain at this point in time as a result of the national recession and the downtown in the South Florida real estate market.
 - D. Bernecker Charitable Foundation, Inc. is holding Promissory Notes secured only by Bernecker's Nursery, Inc. and its assets, and the security interest of the Foundation would be increased and strengthened if it were holding notes secured by not just the Nursery corporation, but also by the owner of the Nursery (the Trust), thereby also gaining a security interest in the other assets of the Trust.
 - E. The Bernecker Charitable Foundation currently is holding sufficient liquid funds to carry out its regular operations in a normal manner, and is therefore able to carry the indebtedness that was created and is sustained by the Promissory Notes (Items 2 & 3 above) that were executed in anticipation of a timely (or only slightly delinquent) pay off of the Mortgage Note (Item 1 above). The Foundation is the only entity at this point in time that is financially able to carry this debt without forcing liquidation or impeding normal operations.
 - F. Therefore, it was decided that the following actions would be in the best interest of the Bernecker Charitable Foundation, Inc., Bernecker's Nursery, Inc., and the Robert G Bernecker Irrevocable 2001 Trust:
 - i. Bernecker's Nursery, Inc. will assign to the Bernecker Charitable Foundation, Inc. any and all interest it holds in the Promissory Note that it holds that is receivable from the Robert G. Bernecker Irrevocable 2001 Trust. This assignment will include any and all principal and interest payable from this note.
 - ii. In return, and in consideration of the note assignment received, the Bernecker Charitable Foundation, Inc. will deem satisfied the Promissory Notes described in Item 3 above, thereby cancelling these Notes.

- iii. As a result of these actions, the Robert G. Bernecker Irrevocable 2001 Trust, the sole shareholder of Bernecker's Nursery, Inc., will directly owe the Bernecker Charitable Foundation, Inc. the principal amount of \$500,000.00 and it would be anticipated by all parties that this indebtedness will be paid off upon the sale of the real estate securing the Mortgage Note in Item 1 above.
- iv. The Robert G. Bernecker Irrevocable 2001 Trust and the Bernecker Charitable Foundation will enter into an agreement regarding the sharing of any interest and/or profit or loss that may eventually be realized from the Mortgage Investment entered into by the Trust on October 4th, 2005. Said agreement would include the renegotiation of the existing assigned notes to reflect the reality of current economic and real estate market conditions, as well as current and historical interest rates.
