Facts And Circumstances Test

DFW SEMICONDUCTOR & TECHNOLOGY EXECUTIVE COUNCIL (DFW S-TEC) SEEKS TO SIGNIFICANTLY INCREASE THE WORKFORCE PREPARED FOR CAREERS IN SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY, ENGINEERING AND MATH (COLLECTIVELY, "STEM") IN THE DALLAS-FORT WORTH REGION. DFW S-TEC ACCOMPLISHES THIS THROUGH VARIOUS EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS AND ACTIVITIES DESIGNED TO ENCOURAGE MIDDLE SCHOOL AND HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS TO PURSUE STEM CAREERS AND TO EDUCATE HIGH SCHOOL TEACHERS ON THE HIGH-DEMAND, HARD-TO-FILL TECHNOLOGY CAREERS AND THE EDUCATIONAL REQUIREMENTS FOR SUCH CAREERS. DFW S-TEC HOSTS AN AVERAGE OF EIGHT INDUSTRY INFORMATION SESSIONS EACH YEAR FOR HIGH SCHOOL MATH, SCIENCE, ENGINEERING AND TECHNOLOGY TEACHERS AS WELL AS FOR TEACHERS WHO SPONSOR CAMPUS CLUBS, PRINCIPALS, COUNSELORS, ADMINISTRATORS, PARENTS, STUDENTS AND PROFESSORS INTERESTED IN LEARNING MORE ABOUT CAREERS IN THE STEM INDUSTRY. PARTICIPANTS AT THE SESSIONS LEARN ABOUT OCCUPATIONS IN THE STEM INDUSTRY AS WELL AS THE EDUCATION AND SKILL SETS REQUIRED TO ACQUIRE THESE JOBS. DFW S-TEC ALSO HOSTS A TWO-WEEK AP EDUCATOR INDUSTRY INTERNSHIP PROGRAM FOR ADVANCED PLACEMENT MATH AND SCIENCE TEACHERS. THE TEACHERS HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO INTERN WITH SEMICONDUCTOR AND TECHNOLOGY COMPANIES IN THE DFW REGION SO THAT THEY MAY GAIN HANDS-ON EXPERIENCE AND CAN EXPLORE HOW WHAT THEY TEACH IN THE CLASSROOM IS USED ON A DAILY BASIS IN A REAL-WORLD SETTING. FURTHERMORE, DFW S-TEC ALSO OFFERS A FIVE-DAY INSTITUTE FOR HIGH SCHOOL EDUCATORS AND A THREE-DAY INSTITUTE FOR MIDDLE SCHOOL EDUCATORS. THESE INSTITUTES ARE HIGHLY INTERACTIVE PROGRAMS FOCUSED ON STEM INDUSTRIES IN THE DFW REGION. THE PROGRAMS ALLOW EDUCATORS TO LEARN CUTTING-EDGE, PROBLEM-SOLVING TECHNIQUES WHILE NETWORKING WITH PEERS ACROSS THE REGION. AS AN OUTCOME OF THE ADVANCED SUMMER INSTITUTES, EDUCATORS DEVELOP K-12 CURRICULUM-ALIGNED MATH AND SCIENCE LESSON PLANS THAT ARE ORIENTED TO ENGAGE STUDENTS AND GIVE THEM REAL-WORLD EXAMPLES OF WHY THEY NEED TO LEARN MATH AND SCIENCE. ADDITIONALLY, THESE INSTITUTES ALLOW EDUCATORS TO EARN UP TO 32 HOURS OF CONTINUING PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT CREDIT THAT MAY BE APPLIED TO THE 200 HOURS REQUIRED EVERY FIVE YEARS BY THE STATE OF TEXAS. ADDITIONALLY, DFW S-TEC HOST AN ANNUAL MATH, SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY READINESS INSTITUTE. HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS WHO ATTEND THIS INSTITUTE SPEND TWO WEEKS DURING THE SUMMER LEARNING ADVANCED MATH AND SCIENCE CURRICULUM FROM SOUTHERN METHODIST UNIVERSITY AND RICHLAND COLLEGE PROFESSOR, TOP MATH AND SCIENCE HIGH SCHOOL TEACHERS, AND COLLEGE STUDENTS WHO ACT AS MENTORS. ALL OF THESE ACTIVITIES ARE FUNDED PRIMARILY BY PUBLIC COMPANIES IN THE STEM INDUSTRY WITH A PRESENCE IN THE DALLAS-FORT WORTH REGION. DFW S-TEC CONTINUES TO REGULARLY SOLICIT CONTRIBUTIONS FROM THESE EXISTING COMPANIES AS WELL AS ANY COMPANIES NEW TO THE REGION.
