

1. *Scholarship recipients from a previous year are eligible to re-apply and will be considered along with other applicants. There is a four-year maximum for any student to receive a Valley TeleCom Group scholarship.*
2. *Applicant must be a customer of Copper Valley Telephone or a minor child or legal dependent of a customer of the Copper Valley Telephone. (Dependents must have been claimed on the member's last tax return.)*
3. *Applicant must be in the graduating class of, or have graduated from, an accredited public, parochial or private high school or must have obtained a G E D. Applicant must have plans to enter, or presently be enrolled in a college, university, trade, technical or business school for the next year.*
4. *Applicant must maintain a minimum GPA of 2.5 on a scale of 4.0 and be a full-time student and must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 credit hours per semester.*
5. *Applicant must complete the scholarship application in its entirety and return same to Copper Valley Telephone headquarters by the date specified on the application. Faxed copies will not be accepted.*
6. *Applicant must submit either a transcript or counselor certification of their national test scores, grade point average, and class standing to be scored fairly.*
7. *Scholarship monies must be utilized in two consecutive semesters during the year awarded (monies will not be deferred)*
8. *Your application will be graded equally among the following areas: Academic Achievement, Involvement in School and Non-School Extra-curricular activities, Essay, Need for Scholarship and The Application.*
9. *Graduating High School Students and students who are home-schooled are REQUIRED to submit a national test score transcript taken within the last 12 months. Continuing Education Students must submit their most recent transcript of a national test score*
10. *Packets of scholarship materials may be viewed at your high school counselor's office, but original applications should be obtained in person, from the Valley TeleCom Group web site or by mail from Valley TeleCom Group headquarters*
11. *There are no restrictions or limitations in the selection procedure based on race, age, gender, religion, national origin or the employment status of the prospective recipient*

One-year scholarships are paid one semester at a time. There is a limit of four years a student may receive a Valley TeleCom Group scholarship. While many students compete for scholarships each year, it may help you to know something about our selection process. A five-member panel reviews all applications and scores them on a numerical basis. The Board of Directors makes the final selections from those scored. If a person is selected, they will be required to submit a photograph that will be used for publicity purposes.

As it says under the Eligibility Requirements, there are five areas considered for grading students' applications: Academic Achievement, Extra-Curricular Activities, the Essay, Need for Scholarship and the Application. Completeness, legibility and answers that show academic achievement, character, financial need and promise will help the panel determine your scores. Leaving any answers bland or incomplete will detract from your overall score, so do try to be honest and informative. You may use extra paper or the back of the application to continue any answers for which you need more room. Applications submitted after the March 11, 2011, deadline will not be considered.
