The visit is a chance for the applicant to flesh out parts of the proposal, answer and ask questions, and get to know more about the Foundation. - Grants are generally awarded for a 12-month period.
- Once the contract for an approved grant has been executed by the Board Chair and Staff Executive Officer and returned to the Foundation, grant payment will be scheduled.
- No commemorative gifts should be provided to the Foundation.
- The Foundation considers it important to inform the public of the work of philanthropy and therefore encourages grant recipients to acknowledge publicly the support the Foundation gives to a grant project
- If a proposal is declined, the Foundation sends a notification letter to the organization that will also indicate the organization must wait one year to reapply.
