THIS LIMITED LIABILITY COMPANY AGREEMENT (this "Agreement") of McNair Medical Institute, LLC, dated February 16, 2012, is adopted by the undersigned as the initial member (the "Member") of such limited liability company, for the regulation and management of such limited liability company pursuant to and in accordance with the Texas Business Organizations Code (the "Code"), and hereby provides as follows:

- 1. Name. The name of the limited liability company is McNair Medical Institute, LLC (the "Company").
- 2. Purpose. The purpose for which the Company is formed is for the transaction of any and all lawful purposes for which a limited liability company may be organized under the Code, subject to the additional restrictions contained in the Certificate of Formation and this Agreement.
- 3. Registered Office. The registered office of the Company in the State of Texas is 800 Brazos, Suite 400, Austin, Texas 78701.
- 4. Registered Agent. The name and address of the registered agent of the Company for service of process on the Company in the State of Texas is Capitol Corporate Services, Inc., 800 Brazos, Suite 400, Austin, Texas 78701.
- 5. Principal Office. The principal office of the Company (at which the books and records of the Company shall be maintained) shall be at such location or locations as determined by the Managers (as that term is defined herein).

7. Member Interest. The "Member Interest" of each Member shall be the percentage set forth opposite such Member's name on Exhibit A hereto. The Member Interests shall be adjusted from time to time as additional capital contributions are made by the Members, and as otherwise required, so that the Member Interest of each Member shall be equal to the total capital contribution made by such Member over the total capital contributions made by all the Members to the Company. From time to time the Members shall amend Exhibit A as necessary to reflect the Member Interests and aggregate capital contributions of the Members.

- 8. Powers. The Company shall have the power and authority to take any and all actions necessary, appropriate, proper, advisable, convenient or incidental to or for the furtherance of the purposes set forth in Section 2 of this Agreement.
- 9. Term. The term of the Company shall commence on the date of the filing of the Certificate of Formation in the Office of the Secretary of State of the State of Texas and shall be perpetual, unless it is dissolved sooner as a result of: (a) the written election of the Members or (b) any other event causing dissolution under the Code.
- 10. Capital Contributions. Each Member, in proportion to its Member Interest, has contributed to the Company such amount of money set forth opposite the Member's name on Exhibit A. Each Member, in proportion to its Member Interest, shall make additional capital contributions if approved by all Members.

11. Management.

(a) Managers. Subject to the provisions of the Code and any limitations in this Agreement as to action required to be authorized or approved by the Members, the business and affairs of the Company shall be managed and all its powers shall be exercised by or under the direction of a Board of Managers. However, at any time the Managers may appoint one or more officers pursuant to Section 12 of this Agreement, and any such officers shall have the authority prescribed by the Managers and by the provisions of this Agreement.

(b) Number, Classification and Qualifications of Managers.

- (i) The authorized number of Managers which shall constitute the Board of Managers shall be at least one (1) but no more than five (5). The initial number of Managers shall be three (3). The Members shall have the right to change from time to time the authorized number of Managers.
- (ii) A Manager must be a natural person who is at least eighteen (18) years of age.
 - (iii) The Members shall designate all Managers.
- (c) Removal of Managers. Any Manager or the entire Board of Managers may be removed at any time, with or without cause, by the Members.

court in any state or country (including, without limitation, any territory, dependency or possession of the United States of America) of any felony or any misdemeanor involving moral turpitude of any Manager; or if the authorized number of Managers be increased.

- (ii) Any Manager may resign effective upon written notice to the Members, unless the notice specifies a later time for the effectiveness of such resignation.
- (iii) The Members shall appoint or elect a successor thereto to take office upon the departure of the vacating Manager or at such later time as shall be designated by the Members.
- (f) Initial Managers. The initial Managers to hold office from and after the date of this Agreement until his or her removal pursuant to this Agreement or until his or her successor is appointed and qualified pursuant to this Agreement are as follows:

- (g) Meetings of Managers. Meetings of the Board of Managers for any purpose or purposes may be called at any time by any Manager.
- (h) Quorum; Votes; Participation in Meetings by Conference Telephone Permitted.
 - (i) Presence of seventy-five percent (75%) or more of the authorized number of Managers at a meeting of the Board of Managers constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business.
 - (ii) Each Manager shall have one (1) vote.
 - (iii) Managers may participate in a meeting through use of conference telephone or similar communications equipment, so long as all Managers participating in such meeting can communicate with and hear one another.

12. Officers.

(a) Appointment and Tenure.

- (i) The Managers may, from time to time, designate officers of the Company to carry out the day-to-day business of the Company.
- (ii) The officers of the Company shall be comprised of one or more individuals designated from time to time by the Managers. No officer need be a

resident of the State of Texas. Each officer shall hold his or her offices for such terms and shall have such authority and exercise such powers and perform such duties as shall be determined from time to time by the Managers. Any number of offices may be held by the same individual. The salaries or other compensation, if any, of the officers and agents of the Company shall be fixed from time to time by the Managers.

- (iii) The officers of the Company may consist of a president/chief executive officer, a secretary and a treasurer. The Managers may also designate one or more vice presidents, assistant secretaries, assistant treasurers, and medical directors. The Managers may designate such other officers and assistant officers and agents as the Managers shall deem necessary.

DEMANDS, ACTIONS, SUITS OR PROCEEDINGS, CIVIL, CRIMINAL, ADMINISTRATIVE OR INVESTIGATIVE, IN WHICH THE INDEMNITEE MAY BE INVOLVED, OR THREATENED TO BE INVOLVED, AS A PARTY OR OTHERWISE, BY REASON OF ITS STATUS AS (X) A MANAGER OF THE COMPANY OR (Y) AN OFFICER, DIRECTOR OR EMPLOYEE OF THE COMPANY OR THE MEMBERS OR AN AFFILIATE THEREOF, REGARDLESS OF WHETHER THE INDEMNITEE CONTINUES TO BE A MANAGER OR AN OFFICER, DIRECTOR OR EMPLOYEE OF A MEMBER OR AN AFFILIATE THEREOF AT THE TIME ANY SUCH LIABILITY OR EXPENSE IS PAID OR INCURRED, UNLESS THE ACT OR FAILURE TO ACT GIVING RISE TO INDEMNITY HEREUNDER WAS PERFORMED OR OMITTED FRAUDULENTLY OR CONSTITUTED GROSS NEGLIGENCE OR WILLFUL MISCONDUCT.

- (b) The Company may purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of the Managers and such other persons as the Managers shall determine against any liability that may be asserted against or expense that may be incurred by such person in connection with the Company's activities, regardless of whether the Company would have the power to indemnify such person against such liability under the provisions of this Agreement.

The Company shall not participate in or intervene in any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office (including publishing or distributing statements).
- (e) Notwithstanding any other provisions of this Certificate of Formation, the Company shall not carry on any activity not permitted to be carried on by: (i) a Section 501(c)(3) organization or (ii) a company, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(a) and (c)(2), 2055, and 2522 of the Internal Revenue Code.
- (f) In the event of dissolution, liquidation, or winding up of the affairs of the Company, whether voluntary, involuntary, or by operation of law, after paying adequately or providing for the debts, obligations, and liabilities of the Company, the remaining assets of the Company shall be distributed to the Foundation or, if the Foundation does not exist at the time of such dissolution, liquidation or winding up, another Section 501(c)(3) organization.
- (g) Any amendments to this Certificate of Formation shall be consistent with Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.
 - (h) The Company shall not merge with or convert into a for-profit entity.
- 17. Amendments to the Agreement. This Agreement may be amended by the unanimous consent of the Members; provided, however, that any amendment to this Agreement must be in writing and signed by all of the Members.
- 18. Governing Law. This Agreement shall be governed by, and construed under, the laws of the State of Texas, all rights and remedies being governed by said laws.

THIS LIMITED LIABILITY COMPANY AGREEMENT (this "Agreement") of McNair Medical Institute, LLC, dated February 16, 2012, is adopted by the undersigned as the initial member (the "Member") of such limited liability company, for the regulation and management of such limited liability company pursuant to and in accordance with the Texas Business Organizations Code (the "Code"), and hereby provides as follows:

- 1. Name. The name of the limited liability company is McNair Medical Institute, LLC (the "Company").
- 2. Purpose. The purpose for which the Company is formed is for the transaction of any and all lawful purposes for which a limited liability company may be organized under the Code, subject to the additional restrictions contained in the Certificate of Formation and this Agreement.
- 3. Registered Office. The registered office of the Company in the State of Texas is 800 Brazos, Suite 400, Austin, Texas 78701.
- 4. Registered Agent. The name and address of the registered agent of the Company for service of process on the Company in the State of Texas is Capitol Corporate Services, Inc., 800 Brazos, Suite 400, Austin, Texas 78701.
- 5. Principal Office. The principal office of the Company (at which the books and records of the Company shall be maintained) shall be at such location or locations as determined by the Managers (as that term is defined herein).
 - 6. Member. The name and mailing address of the Member is as follows:

7. Member Interest. The "Member Interest" of each Member shall be the percentage set forth opposite such Member's name on Exhibit A hereto. The Member Interests shall be adjusted from time to time as additional capital contributions are made by the Members, and as otherwise required, so that the Member Interest of each Member shall be equal to the total capital contribution made by such Member over the total capital contributions made by all the Members to the Company. From time to time the Members shall amend Exhibit A as necessary to reflect the Member Interests and aggregate capital contributions of the Members.

- 8. Powers. The Company shall have the power and authority to take any and all actions necessary, appropriate, proper, advisable, convenient or incidental to or for the furtherance of the purposes set forth in Section 2 of this Agreement.
- 9. Term. The term of the Company shall commence on the date of the filing of the Certificate of Formation in the Office of the Secretary of State of the State of Texas and shall be perpetual, unless it is dissolved sooner as a result of: (a) the written election of the Members or (b) any other event causing dissolution under the Code.
- 10. Capital Contributions. Each Member, in proportion to its Member Interest, has contributed to the Company such amount of money set forth opposite the Member's name on Exhibit A. Each Member, in proportion to its Member Interest, shall make additional capital contributions if approved by all Members.

11. Management.

(a) Managers. Subject to the provisions of the Code and any limitations in this Agreement as to action required to be authorized or approved by the Members, the business and affairs of the Company shall be managed and all its powers shall be exercised by or under the direction of a Board of Managers. However, at any time the Managers may appoint one or more officers pursuant to Section 12 of this Agreement, and any such officers shall have the authority prescribed by the Managers and by the provisions of this Agreement.

(b) Number, Classification and Qualifications of Managers.

- (i) The authorized number of Managers which shall constitute the Board of Managers shall be at least one (1) but no more than five (5). The initial number of Managers shall be three (3). The Members shall have the right to change from time to time the authorized number of Managers.

court in any state or country (including, without limitation, any territory, dependency or possession of the United States of America) of any felony or any misdemeanor involving moral turpitude of any Manager; or if the authorized number of Managers be increased.

- (ii) Any Manager may resign effective upon written notice to the Members, unless the notice specifies a later time for the effectiveness of such resignation.
- (iii) The Members shall appoint or elect a successor thereto to take office upon the departure of the vacating Manager or at such later time as shall be designated by the Members.
- (f) Initial Managers. The initial Managers to hold office from and after the date of this Agreement until his or her removal pursuant to this Agreement or until his or her successor is appointed and qualified pursuant to this Agreement are as follows:

- (g) Meetings of Managers. Meetings of the Board of Managers for any purpose or purposes may be called at any time by any Manager.
- (h) Quorum; Votes; Participation in Meetings by Conference Telephone Permitted.
 - (i) Presence of seventy-five percent (75%) or more of the authorized number of Managers at a meeting of the Board of Managers constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business.
 - (ii) Each Manager shall have one (1) vote.
 - (iii) Managers may participate in a meeting through use of conference telephone or similar communications equipment, so long as all Managers participating in such meeting can communicate with and hear one another.

12. Officers.

(a) Appointment and Tenure.

- (i) The Managers may, from time to time, designate officers of the Company to carry out the day-to-day business of the Company.
- (ii) The officers of the Company shall be comprised of one or more individuals designated from time to time by the Managers. No officer need be a

resident of the State of Texas.
