BYLAWS of THE MORAN FOUNDATION

ARTICLE I OFFICES

Section 1. <u>Resident Agent</u>; <u>Registered Office</u>. The resident agent of this corporation shall be Incorp Services, Inc. The registered office of this corporation in the State of Nevada shall be located at the Incorp Services Nevada office, *2360 Corporation Circle, Suite 400, Henderson, Nevada 89074-7739*. This corporation shall keep a copy of this corporation's Articles of Incorporation and all amendments thereto, certified by the Nevada Secretary of State, a copy of these Bylaws, and all amendments hereto, certified by an officer of this corporation, and a copy of all this corporations tax returns online at the Incorp website of **incorp.com**.

Section 2. <u>Principal Office</u>. The principal office of this corporation shall be located in Henderson, Nevada, or such other place as the Board of Directors may determine from time to time.

ARTICLE II MEMBERSHIP

This corporation shall have no members within the meaning of Section 82.031 of the Nevada Revised Statutes, but the Board of Directors may, by resolution, establish one or more classes of nonvoting affiliates and provide for eligibility requirements for affiliation and rights and duties of affiliates, including the obligation to pay dues. Any reference to such persons as "members" shall not constitute such persons as members of this corporation under the Nevada Revised Statutes.

ARTICLE III BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. <u>Powers</u>. This corporation shall have powers to the full extent allowed by law, within the limits of the purposes of this corporation as stated in its Articles of Incorporation. All powers and activities of this corporation shall be exercised and managed by the Board of Directors of this corporation directly or, if delegated, under the ultimate direction of the Board.

Section 2. <u>Number of Directors</u>. The number of directors shall be not less than two nor more than nine, with the exact number of authorized directors to be fixed from time to time by resolution of the Board of Directors. Any change in the

number of directors outside the range stated in the preceding sentence shall require a corresponding amendment to these Bylaws.

- Section 3. <u>Election, Qualification, and Term of Office of Directors</u>. The directors in office shall elect their successors. Each director shall be elected for a term of one year. Each director shall hold office until a successor has been elected. Directors may serve an unlimited number of consecutive terms. All directors must be at least 18 years of age.
- Section 4. <u>Vacancies</u> A vacancy shall be deemed to exist on the Board in the event that the actual number of directors is less than the authorized number for any reason. Vacancies (including future vacancies which will occur upon the effectiveness of the resignation of a director) may be filled by the remaining directors for the unexpired portion of the term.
- Section 5. <u>Resignation and Removal</u>. Resignations shall be effective upon receipt in writing by the President, the Secretary, or the Board of Directors of this corporation, unless a later effective date is specified in the resignation. A majority of the directors entitled to vote for the director being removed may remove any director at any time, with or without cause.
- Section 6. <u>Annual Meetings</u>. A meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held at least once a year. Annual meetings shall be called by the President or any two directors, and noticed in accordance with Section 8.
- Section 7. <u>Special Meetings</u>. Special meetings of the Board of Directors may be called by the President or any two directors, and noticed in accordance with Section 8.
- Section 8. <u>Notice</u>. Notice of the annual meeting and any special meetings of the Board of Directors shall be given to each director at least four days before any such meeting if given by first-class mail or forty-eight hours before any such meeting if given personally or by telephone, email, or facsimile transmission, and shall state the date, place, and time of the meeting.
- Section 9. <u>Place of Meetings</u>. Meetings of the Board of Directors may be held at any place specified in an otherwise valid notice of any such meeting.
- Section 10. <u>Waiver of Notice</u>. The transactions of any meeting of the Board of Directors, however called and noticed and wherever held, shall be valid as though taken at a meeting duly held after proper call and notice, if a quorum is present, and if, either before or after the meeting, each of the directors not present signs a written waiver of notice, a consent to holding the meeting, or an approval of the minutes. Any such consent need not specify the purpose of the meeting, but if the consent excepts any business, such business may not be transacted. All waivers, consents, and approvals shall be filed with the corporate records or made a part of the minutes of the meeting. Notice

of a meeting shall also be deemed given to any director who attends the meeting and takes part in deliberations without objection to any defect in the call or notice.

Section 11. Quorum. A majority of the total number of directors then in office shall constitute a quorum. The act of a majority of the directors present at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the Board of Directors, except as otherwise provided in Article III, Sections 5 and 12; Article VII, Section 2; Article VIII, Section 1; and Article X, Section 3, of these Bylaws or in the Nevada Revised Statutes. A meeting at which a quorum is initially present may continue to transact business notwithstanding the withdrawal of directors, if any action taken is approved by at least a majority of the required quorum for such meeting.

Section 12. <u>Action Without a Meeting</u>. Any action required or permitted to be taken by the Board may be taken without a meeting if, before or after the action, a majority of the directors then in office (or such other portion as may be required given the nature of the action) shall individually or collectively consent to such action. Such written consents shall be filed with the minutes of the proceedings of the Board and shall have the same force and effect as a majority vote of such directors, provided notice of any action taken by written consent must be given to all non-consenting directors within five working days after the required consents have been obtained.

Section 13. <u>Telephone Meetings</u>. Directors may participate in a meeting through use of conference telephones or similar communications equipment so long as all directors participating in such meeting can hear one another. Participation in a meeting pursuant to this Section constitutes presence in person at such meeting.

Section 14. <u>Inspection</u>. Every director shall have the right during normal business hours, in person or by agent or attorney, to inspect and copy the books of account and all financial records of this corporation and, at such director's own cost, to make extracts therefrom; provided, however, that this right may be denied to any director who refuses, upon the request of an officer of the corporation, to furnish the corporation with an affidavit that such inspection is not desired for any purpose not related to the director's interest in the corporation.

Section 15. <u>Compensation</u>. The Board of Directors may fix, by resolution, the compensation of directors for services in any capacity. In addition, the Board of Directors may authorize the reimbursement to directors of reasonable and necessary out-of-pocket expenses incurred in the performance of their duties as directors.

ARTICLE IV COMMITTEES

Section 1. <u>Board Committees</u>. The Board of Directors may, by resolution, create any number of Board Committees (each including at least one director, and which may include persons who are not directors) to serve at the pleasure of the

Board; name or rename such committees; and appoint the members of such committees. To the extent provided in the Board resolution creating any Board Committee, Board Committees may exercise all the authority of the Board, except for the powers to:

- (a) elect, appoint, or remove any directors or officers of this corporation;
- (b) amend, alter, or repeal these Bylaws or adopt new Bylaws;
- (c) adopt amendments to or repeal the Articles of Incorporation of this corporation;
- (d) amend, alter or repeal any resolution of the Board of Directors which by its express terms is not so amendable or repealable;
- (e) create any other Board Committees or elect, appoint, or remove the members of any Board Committees;
- (f) approve or revoke approval of any plan of merger or consolidation with another corporation, any voluntary dissolution, or any sale, lease, exchange, or other disposition of all of the property and assets of this corporation; or
 - (g) adopt a plan for the distribution of the assets of this corporation.

Section 2. <u>Advisory Committees</u>. The Board of Directors may establish one or more Advisory Committees to the Board. The members of any Advisory Committee may consist of directors or non-directors and may be appointed as the Board determines. Advisory committees may not exercise the authority of the Board to make decisions on behalf of this corporation, but shall be restricted to making recommendations to the Board or Board Committees, and implementing Board or Board Committee decisions and policies under the supervision and control of the Board or Board Committee.

Section 3. Meetings.

- A. Of Board Committees. Meetings and actions of Board Committees shall be governed by and held and taken in accordance with the provisions of Article III of these Bylaws concerning meetings and actions of the Board of Directors, with such changes in the content of those Bylaws as are necessary to substitute the Board Committee and its members for the Board of Directors and its members. Minutes shall be kept of each meeting of any Board Committee and shall be filed with the corporate records.
- B. Of Advisory Committees. Advisory Committees shall determine their own meeting rules and whether minutes shall be kept.

The Board of Directors may adopt rules for the governance of any Board or Advisory Committee not inconsistent with the provisions of these Bylaws.

ARTICLE V OFFICERS

- Section 1. <u>Officers</u>. The officers of this corporation shall be a President, a Vice President, a Secretary, and a Treasurer. The corporation may also have, at the discretion of the directors, such other officers as may be appointed by the Board of Directors. Any number of offices may be held by the same person. The President of the Board shall be elected from among the directors of the corporation.
- Section 2. <u>Election</u>. The officers of this corporation shall be elected annually by the Board of Directors, and each shall serve at the pleasure of the Board, subject to the rights, if any, of an officer under any contract of employment.
- Section 3. <u>Removal</u>. Subject to the rights, if any, of an officer under any contract of employment, any officer may be removed, with or without cause, by the Board of Directors or by an officer on whom such power of removal may be conferred by the Board of Directors.
- Section 4. <u>Resignation</u>. Any officer may resign at any time by giving written notice to this corporation. Any resignation shall take effect on receipt of that notice by such officer or at any later time specified by that notice and, unless otherwise specified in that notice, the acceptance of the resignation shall not be necessary to make it effective. Any resignation is without prejudice to the rights, if any, of this corporation under any contract to which the officer is a party.
- Section 5. <u>Vacancies</u>. A vacancy in any office for any reason shall be filled in the same manner as these Bylaws provide for election to that office.
- Section 6. <u>President</u>. The President shall be the chief executive officer of this corporation and shall, subject to control of the Board, generally supervise, direct and control the business and other officers of this corporation. The President shall have the general powers and duties of management usually vested in the office of President of the corporation and shall have such other powers and duties as may be prescribed by the Board or these Bylaws.
- Section 7. <u>Vice President</u>. The Vice President shall, in the absence of the President, carry out the duties of the President and shall have such other powers and duties as may be prescribed by the Board or these Bylaws.
- Section 8. <u>Secretary</u>. The Secretary shall supervise the keeping of a full and complete record of the proceedings of the Board of Directors and its committees,

shall supervise the giving of such notices as may be proper or necessary, shall supervise the keeping of the minute books of this corporation and such other corporate records as may be required by law, and shall have such other powers and duties as may be prescribed by the Board or these Bylaws. The Secretary shall supervise the keeping of a copy of the Articles of Incorporation and a copy of these Bylaws at this corporation's registered office as provided in Article I, Section 1, of these Bylaws.

Section 9. <u>Treasurer</u>. The Treasurer shall supervise the charge and custody of all funds of this corporation, the deposit of such funds in the manner prescribed by the Board of Directors, and the keeping and maintaining of adequate and correct accounts of this corporation's properties and business transactions, shall render reports and accountings as required, and shall have such other powers and duties as may be prescribed by the Board or these Bylaws.

ARTICLE VI STANDARD OF CARE FOR DIRECTORS AND OFFICERS AND PERSONAL LIABILITY

Section 1. <u>Standard of Care</u>. Directors and officers shall exercise their powers in good faith and with a view to the interests of this corporation.

In performing their respective duties, directors and officers shall be entitled to rely on information, opinions, reports, books of account, or statements, including financial statements and other financial data, that are prepared or presented by:

- (a) one or more directors, officers, or employees of this corporation reasonably believed to be reliable and competent as to the matters prepared or presented;
- (b) counsel, public accountants, or other persons as to matters reasonably believed to be within such person's professional or expert competence; or
- (c) a committee upon which the person relying thereon does not serve, established in accordance with Article IV, Section 1, of these Bylaws, as to matters within the committee's designated authority and on which the committee is reasonably believed to merit confidence;

but a director or officer is not entitled to rely on such information, opinions, reports, books of account, or statements if he or she has knowledge concerning the matter in question that would cause reliance thereon to be unwarranted.

Section 2. <u>Personal Liability</u>. Except as provided in Section 82.136 of the Nevada Revised Statutes (which bars this corporation from issuing stock, operating

for the pecuniary gain of members, and distributing profits to members), Section 82.536 of the Nevada Revised Statutes (which grants general supervisory authority over this corporation to the Attorney General of the State of Nevada), and Chapter 35 of the Nevada Revised Statutes (which concerns actions brought against this corporation or its officers in the name of the State of Nevada), no action may be brought against an officer or director of this corporation based on any act or omission arising from failure in his or her official capacity to exercise due care regarding the management or operation of the corporation unless the act or omission involves intentional misconduct, fraud, or knowing violation of the law.

ARTICLE VII PROHIBITED TRANSACTIONS

Section 1. <u>Transactions Involving Interested Directors or Officers</u>. No contract or other transaction between this corporation and one or more of its directors or officers, or between this corporation and any corporation, firm, or association in which one or more of its directors or officers are directors or officers or are financially interested, is void or voidable solely for this reason or solely because any such director or officer is present at the meeting of the Board or a Board Committee which authorizes or approves the contract or transaction, or because the vote or votes of common or interested directors are counted for such purpose, if the circumstances specified in any of the following paragraphs exist:

- (a) The fact of the common directorship, office, or financial interest is disclosed or known to the Board or Board Committee and noted in the minutes, and the Board or Board Committee authorizes, approves, or ratifies the contract or transaction in good faith by a vote sufficient for the purpose without counting the vote or votes of the common or interested director or directors; or
- (b) The fact of the common directorship, office, or financial interest is not disclosed or known to the director or officer at the time the transaction is brought before the Board for action; or
- (c) The contract or transaction is fair as to this corporation at the time it is authorized or approved.
- Section 2. <u>Approval Procedure</u>. Common or interested directors may be counted in determining the presence of a quorum at a meeting of the Board or Board Committee which authorizes, approves, or ratifies a contract or transaction, which action shall require the vote of a majority of the disinterested directors then in office.
- Section 3. <u>Compliance with Private Foundation Rules</u>. Any provision of these Bylaws or the Articles of Incorporation of this corporation to the contrary

notwithstanding, so long as this corporation is deemed to be a "private foundation" as defined in Section 509 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), this corporation:

- (a) shall distribute its income for each taxable year (and principal, if necessary) at such time and in such manner as not to subject this corporation to tax under Section 4942 of the Code;
- (b) shall not approve of, or engage in, any act of self-dealing as defined in subsection (d) of Section 4941 of the Code;
- (c) shall not retain any excess business holdings as defined in subsection (c) of Section 4943 of the Code;
- (d) shall not make any investments in such a manner as to subject this corporation to tax under Section 4944 of the Code; and
- (e) shall not make any taxable expenditure as defined in subsection (d) of Section 4945 of the Code.

ARTICLE VIII INDEMNIFICATION AND INSURANCE

Section 1. <u>Indemnification</u>. This corporation shall indemnify its current and former officers and directors to the fullest extent permitted by, and in accordance with procedures stated in, Section 78.751 of the Nevada Revised Statutes, as applicable to this corporation.

Section 2. <u>Insurance</u>. This corporation may purchase and maintain insurance or make other financial arrangements on behalf of any person who is or was a director, officer, employee, or agent of this corporation, or is or was serving at the request of this corporation as a director, officer, employee, or agent of another corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust, or other enterprise, for any liability asserted against such person and liability and expenses incurred by such person in his or her capacity as a director, officer, employee, or agent, or arising out of his or her status as such, whether or not this corporation has the authority to indemnify such person against such liability and expenses, as and to the extent provided in Section 78.752 of the Nevada Revised Statutes.

ARTICLE IX GRANTS ADMINISTRATION

Section 1. <u>Purpose of Grants</u>. This corporation shall have the power to make grants and contributions and to render other financial assistance for the purposes expressed in this corporation's Articles of Incorporation.

- Section 2. <u>Exclusive Power in the Board of Directors</u>. The Board of Directors shall have exclusive control over grants, contributions, and other financial assistance given by this corporation. The Board shall review all requests for funds and shall require that such requests specify the use to which the funds will be put. If the Board approves a request for funds, the Board shall authorize payment of such funds to the approved grantee.
- Section 3. <u>Refusal</u>; <u>Withdrawal</u>. The Board of Directors, in its absolute discretion, shall have the right to refuse to make any grants or contributions, or to render other financial assistance, for any or all of the purposes for which the funds are requested. In addition, the Board, in its absolute discretion, shall have the right to withdraw its approval of any grant at any time and use the funds for other purposes within the scope of the purposes expressed in this corporation's Articles of Incorporation.
- Section 4. <u>Accounting Required</u>. The Board of Directors may require that grantees furnish a periodic accounting to show that the funds granted by this corporation were expended for the purposes that were approved by the Board.
- Section 5. Restrictions on Contributions. This corporation shall retain complete control and discretion over the use of all contributions it receives. Contributions received by this corporation from solicitations for specific grants shall be regarded as for the use of this corporation and not for any particular organization or individual mentioned in the solicitation. This corporation may accept contributions earmarked by the donor exclusively for allocation to one or more foreign organizations or individuals only if the Board of Directors of this corporation: (1) has determined that the specific charitable activity for which the donation was made furthers this corporation's exempt purposes; (2) has approved in advance disbursements of funds to support such charitable activity; (3) retains discretion and control as to the use of the contributions received by this corporation; and (4) exercises appropriate supervision to ensure funds are actually spent for the intended purposes.

ARTICLE X MISCELLANEOUS

- Section 1. <u>Fiscal Year</u>. The fiscal year of this corporation shall end each year on December 31.
- Section 2. <u>Contracts, Notes, and Checks</u>. All contracts entered into on behalf of this corporation must be authorized by the Board of Directors or the person or persons on whom such power may be conferred by the Board from time to time, and, except as otherwise provided by law, every check, draft, promissory note, money order, or other evidence of indebtedness of this corporation shall be signed by the person or persons on whom such power may be conferred by the Board from time to time.

Section 3. <u>Amendments</u>. Proposed amendments to these Bylaws shall be submitted in writing to the directors for adoption. The vote of a majority of the directors then in office or the majority written consent of the directors shall be required to adopt a bylaw amendment.

Section 4. <u>Governing Law</u>. In all matters not specified in these Bylaws, or in the event these Bylaws shall not comply with applicable law, Chapter 82 of the Nevada Revised Statutes as then in effect shall apply.
