AMENDED AND RESTATED BYLAWS OF UNBOUND PHILANTHROPY

ARTICLE I

OFFICES AND AGENT

- Section 1.1 Registered Office and Registered Agent. The Corporation shall continuously maintain in the State of Hawaii a registered office and a registered agent whose business office is identical with the registered office. The registered agent may be an individual who resides on the state of Hawaii, or a Hawaii or foreign entity authorized to transact business or conduct affairs in the State of Hawaii. The Corporation may change its registered office, registered agent or both.
- Section 1.2 <u>Principal and Other Offices</u>. The principal office of the Corporation, being the office designated from time to time in the annual report where the principal executive offices of the Corporation are located, and other offices of the Corporation, if any, may be located at any place in or out of the State of Hawaii as the Board of Directors may designate or as the purposes of the Corporation may require.

ARTICLE 2

MEMBERS

- **Section 2.1** Membership. The Corporation has one class of members and two initial members, Deborah Keiko Berger and William Reeves, and who will be considered to be the members of the Corporation for the purposes of any statutory provision or rule of law relating to members of a non-stock not-for-profit corporation.
- Section 2.2 <u>Term and Succession of Members</u>. Each initial member will serve for life or until such time as either he or she becomes incapacitated. The term "incapacitated" will refer to an individual with respect to whom any member of the Board of Directors comes into possession of (i) a court order holding the individual to be legally incapacitated to act in his or her own behalf, (ii) certificates of two licensed physicians certifying that the individual is unable, for any reason, to act rationally and prudently in the conduct of his or her affairs or (iii) evidence that the recipient deems both credible and currently applicable that the individual has disappeared or is unaccountably absent. Notwithstanding the foregoing, any member may resign at any time by mailing or delivering written notice to the Secretary of the Corporation (any resignation to take effect as specified therein or, if not specified, upon receipt by the Secretary).

In the event that either Deborah Keiko Berger or William Reeves ceases to be a member for any reason (including death, incapacity, resignation or removal), the other member may appoint one

or more members to replace him or her. The consent of both members is required to add any other members.

- Section 2.3 Meetings. A meeting of the membership will be held annually for the election of directors and the transaction of such other business as may properly come before the membership. Unless otherwise fixed by the Board of Directors, the annual meeting of the membership will take place immediately preceding the annual meeting of the Board of Directors. At any time in the interval between annual meetings, a special meeting of the members may be called by the Chairman of the Board, by a majority of the Board of Directors or by the members by vote at a meeting or in writing (addressed to the Secretary of the Corporation).
- Section 2.4 Notice. In accordance with Section 414D-105 of the Hawaii Nonprofit Corporations Act, written notice which states the place, if any, date and hour of the meeting, and the means of remote communications, if any, by which members may be deemed to be present in person and vote at such meeting, will be made by first class mail, facsimile transmission, telegraph, telex, courier service, electronic mail or hand delivery and will be given not less than ten nor more than sixty days before the date of the meeting. Notice of special meetings will indicate the purpose for which they are called. Notice of meetings need not be given to any member who submits a signed waiver of notice whether before or after the meeting, or who attends the meeting without protesting, prior thereto or at its commencement, the lack of notice to him or her.
- Section 2.5 Quorum, Adjournment of Meetings. At all meetings of the members, both members must be present in person to constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. At any adjourned meeting for which a quorum was present at the original meeting, any business may-be-transacted-which might-have-been-transacted-at-the-original-meeting. If the-adjournment is for more than thirty days, notice of the adjourned meeting will be given.
- Section 2.6 <u>Voting</u>; Action of the Members. At all meeting of the members, each member present in person will be entitled to one vote. If a quorum is present, the affirmative vote of both members is the act of the members.
- Section 2.7 <u>Proxies</u>. In accordance with Section 414D-113 of the Hawaii Nonprofit Corporations Act, voting by proxy will be permitted.

ARTICLE 3

DIRECTORS

- Section 3.1 <u>Authority of the Board of Directors</u>. All corporate powers shall be exercised by or under the authority of its Board of Directors including the management of the Corporation's affairs.
- Section 3.2 Qualifications and Number of Directors. All directors shall be individuals. However, a director need not be a resident of Hawaii. The Board of Directors shall

consist of three (3) individuals. The number of directors may be increased or decreased (but to no fewer than three (3)) from time to time by the Board of Directors.

- Section 3.3 <u>Election</u>. Except for the initial directors, all the directors shall be elected at each annual meeting of the members, or at any regular or special meeting of the members held for that purpose.
- Section 3.4 <u>Classes of Directors and Term of Office</u>. There shall be one class of directors. Directors shall have a term of one (1) year. Despite the expiration of a director's term, the director continues to serve until the director's success or is elected. The term of a director filling a vacancy in the office of a director expires at the end of the unexpired term that the director is filling.
- Section 3.5 Resignation of Directors. A director may resign at any time by delivering written notice to the Board of Directors, the chair of the board, the president, or the secretary. Unless the notice specifies a later effective date, the resignation is effective at the earliest of the following: when the notice is received; five (5) days after its deposit with the U.S. Postal Service as evidenced by the postmark, provided the notice is correctly addressed with first class postage; on the date shown on the return receipt, if sent by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested and the receipt is signed by or on behalf of the addressee; or thirty (30) days after its deposit with the U.S. Postal Service as evidenced by the postmark, if correctly addressed but with other than first class, registered, or certified postage. If a resignation is made effective at a later date, the Board of Directors may fill the pending vacancy before the effective date if the Board of Directors provides that the successor does not take office until the effective date.
- Section 3.6 Removal of Directors. A director may be removed without cause by the vote of the members.
- Section 3.7 <u>Vacancy on Board</u>. If a vacancy occurs on the Board of Directors, including a vacancy resulting from an increase in the number of directors, the Board of Directors may fill the vacancy. If the directors remaining in office constitute fewer than a quorum, the Board of Directors may fill the vacancy by the affirmative vote of a majority of all the directors remaining in office. A vacancy that will occur at a specific later date (by reason of a resignation effective at a later date or otherwise) may be filled before the vacancy occurs but the new director may not take office until the vacancy occurs.
- **Section 3.8** Compensation of Directors. The Board of Directors may fix the compensation of directors.
- Section 3.9 Meetings of the Board of Directors. A regular meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held without notice other than this bylaw for the purpose of appointing officers and transacting such other business as may come before the meeting. The Board of Directors may hold other regular meetings or special meetings in or out of the State of Hawaii. The Board of Directors may permit any or all directors to participate in a regular or special meeting by, or conduct the meeting through the use of, any means of communication by which all directors participating may simultaneously hear each other during the meeting. A director participating in a meeting by this means is deemed to be present in person at the meeting.

- Section 3.10 Action Without a Meeting. Action required or permitted to be taken at a Board of Directors' meeting may be taken without a meeting if the action is taken by all members of the Board of Directors. The action must be evidenced by one or more written consents describing the action taken, signed by each director, and included in the minutes filed with the corporate records reflecting the action taken. Action taken by unanimous written consent of the directors is effective when the last director signs the consent, unless the consent specifies a different effective date. A unanimous written consent as described above has the effect of a meeting vote and may be described as such in any document.
- Section 3.11 <u>Call and Notice of Meetings</u>. Regular meetings of the Board of Directors may be held without notice of the date, time, place, or purpose of the meeting. Special meetings of the Board of Directors must be preceded by at least two (2) days' notice of the date, time, and place of the meeting. The notice need not describe the purpose of the special meeting. Any board action to remove a director; approve a sale, pledge or transfer of all or substantially all of the assets of the Corporation; or approve a plan of merger, conversion, or dissolution shall not be valid, unless each director is given at least seven (7) days written notice that the matter will be voted upon at a Board of Directors' meeting, unless notice is waived pursuant to section 2.12. The chair of the board, the president, or twenty (20) percent of the directors then in office may call and give notice of a meeting of the Board of Directors.
- Section 3.12 <u>Waiver of Notice</u>. A director may waive any required notice before or after the date and time stated in the notice. The waiver shall be in writing, signed by the director entitled to the notice and filed with the minutes or corporate records; except that a director's attendance at or participation in a meeting waives any required notice to the director of the meeting unless the director at the beginning of the meeting or prior to the vote on a matter not noticed in conformity with the law or the bylaws objects to lack of notice and does not thereafter vote for or assent to the objected to action.
- Section 3.13 Quorum and Voting. A quorum of the Board of Directors consists of a majority of the directors then in office immediately before a meeting begins, provided that a quorum is not fewer than the greater of one-third of the number of directors in office or two (2) directors. If a quorum is present when a vote is taken, the affirmative vote of a majority of directors present is the act of the board, unless the Hawaii Nonprofit Corporation Act, the articles of incorporation, or these bylaws require the vote of a greater number of directors.
- Section 3.14 <u>Committees of the Board</u>. The Board of Directors may create one or more committees and appoint members of the board to serve on them. Each committee must have two or more members, who serve at the pleasure of the Board of Directors. The creation of a committee and appointment of members to it must be approved by the greater of: (a) a majority of all the directors in office when the action is taken, or (b) the number of directors required to take action under Section 3.13 of these bylaws. Sections 3.9 to 3.13 of these bylaws, which govern meetings, action without meetings, notice and waiver of notice, and quorum and voting requirements of the Board of Directors, apply to committees and their members as well. To the extent specified by the Board of Directors, each committee may exercise the authority of the Board of Directors, provided, however, a committee may not:

Authorize distributions;

Approve dissolution, merger, or the sale, pledge or transfer of all or substantially all of the Corporation's assets;

Elect, appoint, or remove directors or fill vacancies on the Board of Directors or on any of its committees; or

Adopt, amend, or repeal the articles of incorporation or bylaws.

ARTICLE 4

OFFICERS

- **Section 4.1** Required Officers. The Corporation shall have the officers as shall be appointed from time to time by the Board of Directors. The same individual may simultaneously hold more than one office in the Corporation. One of the officers shall have responsibility for preparation and custody of minutes of the directors' meetings and for authenticating records of the Corporation. Each officer shall have the authority and shall perform the duties prescribed by the Board of Directors or by direction of an officer authorized by the Board of Directors to prescribe the duties of other officers. The officers may include one or more of the following:
- Section 4.1.1 <u>Chair of the Board</u>. The chair of the board shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors and shall perform other duties as are required of the chair of the board by the Board of Directors.
- Section 4.1.2 <u>President</u>. The president (in the absence of a chair of the board) shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors. Unless the Board of Directors shall decide otherwise, the president shall be the chief executive officer of the Corporation and shall have general charge and supervision of the business of the Corporation. The president shall perform other duties as are incident to the president's office or are required of the president by the Board of Directors.
- Section 4.1.3 <u>Vice Presidents</u>. In the absence of the president, the vice president or vice presidents shall, in order designated by the president or the Board of Directors, perform all of the duties of the president. When so acting a vice president shall have all the powers of and be subject to all the restrictions upon the president. The vice president or vice presidents shall have powers and perform other duties as may be prescribed by the chair of the board, the president, the Board of Directors or these bylaws.
- Section 4.1.4 Secretary. The secretary shall keep the minutes of all meetings of the Board of Directors and committees of the Board of Directors (if any). The secretary shall give notice in conformity with these bylaws of all meetings of the Board of Directors. In the absence of the chair of the board and of the president and any vice president, the secretary shall have the power to call meetings the Board of Directors and committees of the Board of Directors. The secretary shall also perform all other duties assigned to the secretary by the president or the Board of Directors. The assistant secretary or assistant secretaries shall, in the order prescribed by the Board of Directors or the president, perform all the duties and exercise all the powers of the secretary during the secretary's absence or disability or whenever the office is vacant. An assistant secretary shall perform all the duties assigned to the assistant secretary or assistant secretaries by the president or the Board of Directors.

- Section 4.1.5 Treasurer. The treasurer shall be the chief financial and accounting officer of the Corporation. The treasurer shall exercise general supervision over the receipt, custody and disbursement of corporate funds and the keeping of corporate financial records. The treasurer shall perform all other duties assigned to the treasurer by the president or the Board of Directors. The assistant treasurer or assistant treasurers, shall, in the order prescribed by the Board of Directors or the president, perform all the duties and exercise all the powers of the treasurer during the treasurer's absence or disability or whenever the office is vacant. An assistant treasurer shall perform all the duties assigned to the assistant treasurer or assistant treasurers by the president or the Board of Directors.
- **Section 4.2** Resignation of Officers. An officer may resign at any time by delivering notice to the Corporation. Unless a written notice specifies a future effective date, the written notice is effective at the earliest of the following: when the notice is received; five (5) days after its deposit with the U.S. Postal Service as evidenced by the postmark, provided the notice is correctly addressed with first class postage; on the date shown on the return receipt, if sent by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested and the receipt is signed by or on behalf of the addressee; or thirty (30) days after its deposit with the U.S. Postal Service as evidenced by the postmark, if correctly addressed but with other than first class, registered or certified postage. Unless an oral notice specifies a future effective date, an oral notice is effective when communicated if communicated in a comprehensible manner. If a resignation is made effective at a future date and the corporation accepts the future effective date, the Board of Directors may fill the pending vacancy before the effective date if the Board of Directors provides that the successor does not take office until the effective date.
- **Section 4.3** Removal of Officers. The Board of Directors may remove any officer at any time with or without cause.

ARTICLE 5

CONFLICT OF INTEREST POLICY

Section 5.1 The Corporation will adopt and maintain a conflict of interest policy. The policy is attached to these bylaws as Exhibit A.

ARTICLE 6

MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

Section 6.1 <u>Corporate Records</u>. The Corporation shall keep as permanent records minutes of all meetings of the members, all meetings of the Board of Directors, a record of all actions taken by the directors without a meeting, and a record of all actions taken by committees of the Board of Directors. The Corporation shall maintain appropriate accounting records. The Corporation shall maintain its records in written form or in another form capable of conversion into written form within a reasonable time. The Corporation shall keep a copy of the following records at its principal office:

Articles or restated articles of incorporation and all amendments to them currently in effect;

Bylaws or restated bylaws and all amendments to them currently in effect;

A list of the names and business or home addresses of its current directors and officers;

The most recent annual report delivered to the Hawaii Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs;

A copy of the Corporation's application for recognition of exemption under section 501(c) of the Code filed with the Internal Revenue Service with all supporting documents and any letter issued by the Internal Revenue Service in response; and

A copy of the Corporation's three most recent annual tax returns.

ARTICLE 7

EMERGENCY BYLAWS

- Section 7.1 <u>Emergency Bylaws</u>. The provisions of this Section shall be effective only in an emergency where a quorum of directors cannot readily be assembled because of some catastrophic event. All provisions of the other Sections of these bylaws consistent with this Section remain effective during the emergency.
- Section 7.2 Notice of Emergency Board Meeting. Any one member of the Board of Directors or any one of the officers may call a meeting of the Board of Directors. Notice of such meeting need be given only to those directors whom it is practicable to reach, and may be given in any practical manner, including by publication and radio. Such notice shall be given at least two (2) days before commencement of the meeting.
- Section 7.3 <u>Temporary Directors and Quorum</u>. One or more officers present at a meeting of the Board of Directors shall be deemed to be directors for the meeting, in order of rank, and within the same rank, in order of seniority, as necessary to achieve a quorum. In the event that less than a quorum (as determined by Section 3.13 of these bylaws) of the directors are present (including any officers who are to serve as directors for the meeting), those directors present (including the officers serving as directors) shall constitute a quorum.
- **Section 7.4** Permitted Actions. The board as constituted in Section 7.3 and after notice as set forth in Section 7.2 may:

Prescribe emergency powers to any officer;

Delegate to any officer or director, any of the powers of the Board of Directors;

Designate lines of succession of officers and agents, in the event that any of them are unable to discharge their duties;

Relocate the principal place of business, or designate successive or simultaneous principal places of business; and

Take any other action, convenient, helpful, or necessary to carry on the purposes of the Corporation.

ARTICLE-8

AMENDMENTS OF ARTICLES AND BYLAWS

- **Section 8.1** Amendment of the Articles of Incorporation. The Board of Directors may amend its articles of incorporation at any time to add or change a provision that is required or permitted in the articles or to delete a provision not required in the articles by a vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the directors in office.
- Section 8.2 <u>Amendment of the Bylaws</u>. The Board of Directors may alter, amend, repeal, or adopt new bylaws.

CONFLICT OF INTEREST POLICY

- Section 1 What is the Purpose of This Policy? Unbound Philanthropy (the "Foundation") appreciates and encourages the active involvement of its directors, officers, advisory council and committee members, and staff in the community. At the same time, actual or apparent conflicts of interest can harm the Foundation and its grantees, directors, advisory council and committee members, and staff and, in some cases, these conflicts can violate the law if not administered properly. Compliance with this conflict of interest policy (the "Policy") will help to mitigate these risks and ensure that the Foundation maintains high ethical standards.
- **Section 2** Who Does the Policy Apply To? The Policy applies to the Foundation's directors, officers, staff, committee members, and members of the <u>advisory council</u> (the "Covered Persons").
- Section 3 What is a Conflict of Interest? Conflicts of interest can take different forms. Conflicts of interest include situations in which a Covered Person has a significant financial interest in a Foundation vendor (i.e. one who provides services to, collects fees from, or otherwise engages in business with the Foundation, such as counsel, accountant, consultant, or investment advisor), or when a Covered Person has a relationship with a grantee.

Specifically, for purposes of the Policy, a Covered Person has a conflict of interest if the Foundation considers a transaction or arrangement with a current or prospective grantee or vendor that has or within the past five years had a close association with (a) the Covered Person or (b) a member of his or her immediate family.

A "close association" with a grantee or vendor is one in which the person:

Owes a fiduciary duty to the organization or one of its affiliates, for example, as a director, trustee, or officer;

Holds a significant ownership, investment, or other financial interest in the organization or one of its affiliates, for example, as a shareholder, limited partner, vendor, pensioner, or other creditor (including an investment in a fund or other vehicle in which the Foundation has or is considering an investment in as well); or

Receives compensation or other significant personal benefit from the organization or one of its affiliates as an employee or independent contractor.

A financial interest or personal benefit is "significant" when it could influence the Covered Person's decisions on behalf of the Foundation. Compensation or other personal benefit includes direct and indirect remuneration as well as gifts or favors that are substantial.

Section 4 <u>Duty to Disclose</u>. When Covered Person discovers that the Foundation is considering a transaction with a vendor or grantee with whom the Covered Person has a close association, he or she must disclose the existence of a "close association," and disclose all

material facts to the Executive Director, if the Covered Person is a staff member, or to the Chair of the Board, if the Covered Person is a director, officer, advisory council or committee member, or the Executive Director.1 The Executive Director or Chair of the Board will share this information with the staff, directors, or advisory council or committee members who are considering the underlying transaction or arrangement. Covered Persons who are unsure whether they have an interest to disclose should err on the side of disclosure.

Section 5 Procedures. If a Covered Person has close association with a potential grantee or vendor, as defined in Section 3, the Foundation will follow the following procedures to address the conflict:

Conflicts of Interest relating to a Grantee:

The Covered Person may, at the discretion of the Chair of the Board, make a presentation at the Board meeting and participate in preliminary discussions regarding the potential grant.

If the Covered Person is a staff member of the potential grantee, he or she must recuse himself or herself and leave the meeting during the final discussion of, and the vote on, the proposed grant.

If the Covered Person is a director, trustee, or officer of the potential grantee, recusal is generally not required, but the Chair of the Board may ask the Covered Person to recuse himself or herself from the final discussion of, and vote on, the proposed grant.

If the Covered Person is a director, trustee, or officer of a proposed grantee, any grant made to the proposed grantee should contain a clause in the grant agreement stating that the grant does not fulfill-any-obligation-to-raise funds-on-the part-of-the Covered-Person-(e.g. a "give-or-get" obligation).

Conflicts of Interest relating to a Vendor:

In general, the Covered Person will recuse himself or herself from the final discussion of, and vote on, the proposed transaction or arrangement. However, if determined to be unnecessary or inadvisable in the Chair's discretion, the Covered Person will not be required to be recused.

At the discretion of the Chair of the Board, the Covered Person may make a presentation at the Board meeting and may participate in preliminary discussions regarding the proposed transaction or arrangement.

The Chair of the Board, if appropriate, may appoint a disinterested committee to determine whether the proposed transaction or arrangement is on terms that are fair and reasonable to the Foundation.

If the Chair of the Board is Covered Person, he or she must disclose the interest to another director.

The Board or committee will determine, by majority vote, whether the transaction or arrangement is in the Foundation's best interest, for its own benefit, and whether it is fair and reasonable.

Other relationships that might not necessarily fit into the definition of "close association" may still give rise to conflicts of interest. Covered Persons who are unsure if they have an interest should err on the side of disclosure. After disclosure of a potential interest and the surrounding facts and circumstances, and after any discussion with the Covered Person, the Executive Director, if the Covered Person is a staff member, or the Chair of the Board, if the Covered Person is an officer, director, advisory <u>council</u> or committee member, or the Executive Director, will decide whether the interest rises to the level that merits application of the above procedures to address the conflict.

Section 6 <u>Documentation</u>. The minutes of the meeting of the Board of Directors or of the committee will reflect (a) that the interest was disclosed, (b) the name(s) of the Covered Person(s), (c) that, if required by the Policy or by request of the Chair of the Board, the Covered Person(s) was not present during the final discussion or vote on the proposed transaction or arrangement, (d) that the Covered Person(s) abstained from voting; and (e) details of the discussion regarding the terms of the proposed transaction or arrangement, and any alternatives to the proposed transaction or arrangement.

Section 7 Annual Statements. Each Covered Person will annually sign a statement which affirms that he or she has received a copy of the Policy, has read and understands the Policy, agrees to comply with the Policy, and understands that the Foundation is charitable, and in order to maintain its federal tax exemption, must engage primarily in activities which accomplish one or more of its-tax-exempt purposes.—Each-new Govered Person will receive a copy of the Policyand will sign a statement upon undertaking the duties of his or her position at the Foundation.

Section 8 <u>Violations of the Policy</u>. Directors, officers, advisory <u>council</u> or committee members, or staff members who believe that a Covered Person has violated this Policy should promptly express their concerns to the Executive Director, in the case of staff members, or to the Chair of the Board, in the case of directors, officers, advisory <u>council</u> or committee members, or the Executive Director. If the staff is not comfortable reporting to the Executive Director, they should disclose their concerns to the Chair of the Board. The Foundation will investigate these reports carefully and, on completing its investigation, promptly take appropriate action.

Section 9 Periodic Reviews. To ensure that the Foundation operates in a manner consistent with its charitable purposes, and does not engage in activities which could jeopardize its tax-exempt status, the Foundation will conduct periodic reviews. The reviews will, at a minimum, include whether transactions or arrangements with grantees and vendors conform to the Foundation's written policies, are properly recorded, reflect reasonable investment or payments for goods and services, further charitable purposes, and do not result in inurement, impermissible private benefit, or in an excess benefit transaction.

Section 10 Compliance with Law. This Policy supplements laws that regulate conflicts of interest and impose fiduciary duties, such as a duty of loyalty to the Foundation when conducting foundation business.

Section 11 Coordination with Self-Dealing Rules. As the Foundation is classified as a private foundation under Section 509 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), no conflict of interest transaction may be entered into or approved unless the transaction also complies with Section 4941 of the Code, and is determined not to be a self-dealing transaction.
