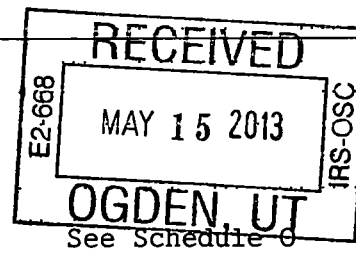

Parents/Caregivers were surveyed in 2012 and it was determined that 98% of The Next Stop members' social skills improved or remained stable and members who increased their friendships to three or more since starting almost doubled. Also, since beginning the program, 80% of the members showed a dramatic increase in having a positive mood. Improvement in self esteem and self confidence was 88%.
