- Focus E+Co on Africa, the market where it could have the greatest impact (based on both opportunity and need for clean energy)
- Provide the opportunity to learn from E+Co's past and build a more effective organization utilizing smallto-medium enterprise investing to provide access to clean energy in emerging markets

The restructuring of E+Co was completed on November 5, 2012, with the following results:

- Creditors received a projected \$4 million upon restructuring or approximately \$0.16 on the dollar. The Lemelson Foundation received \$88,800.01 from the initial disbursement of cash.
- E+Co contributed its primary investment assets to the following three entities (the "LLCs"):
 - 1. Persistent Energy Partners Fund, LLC Africa core assets
 - 2. Non-Core Liquidation, LLC non-core Africa and other assets to be liquidated by the fund manager, Persistent Energy Partners.
 - 3. Outsourced Assets, LLC assets to be managed by third parties and to be liquidated
- Note holders who did not agree to the restructuring continue to be creditors of E+Co after the effective date of the restructuring.
- The Lemelson Foundation agreed to the restructuring and exchanged its E+Co debt for available cash and ownership in Persistent Energy Partners Fund, LLC; Non-Core Liquidation, LLC; and Outsourced Assets, LLC. The Lemelson Foundation holds no further interest in E+Co.
