4a	(Code) (Expenses \$ 563,598 including grants of \$ 563,598) (Revenue \$ 0) Providence St Peter Hospital offers a wide range of services that provide health benefits to the uninsured and underserved in Southwest Washington community These services, most of which do not generate enough income to support themselves, include programs such as psychiatry, chemical dependency, a sexual assault clinic, and a pediatrics unit, free and low-cost health screenings and education events, support services for cancer patients, survivors and their families, and medical training and career development for current and future medical professionals. Providence St Peter Foundation supports these services by developing and receiving philanthropic resources from the generous individuals and businesses within the community In 2012, with these donations, the Foundation was able to provide over \$300,000 to fund the acquisition and upgrade of such necessary equipment as vital sign monitors, video scopes, patient lifts, pediatric cribs and a heating/cooling system for the Hospital's cardiovascular operating from The Foundation was also able to provide over \$100,000 to fund psychiatric resources and services, animal-assisted therapy, assistance to employees facing financial hardships and bedside companionship and grief counseling for dying patients and their families. The Foundation also funded over \$90,000 in continuing education and medical training activities for palliative care and hospice professionals, nurses and nurse technicians, and other medical personnel. The Foundation also supported various improvements throughout the hospital, such as the purchase of new furniture for waiting rooms, patient areas and conference rooms, maternity supplies and towels, sweatshirts and sweatpants for patients
4b	(Code) (Expenses \$ 420,219 including grants of \$ 420,219) (Revenue \$ 0) The population of Thurston County has grown by 22% over the last ten years Providence St Peter Hospital(PSPH) has seen admissions grow at a similar rate Thurston County has been one of the fastest growing counties in Washington State Due to population trends, PSPH can no longer accommodate the demand for inpatient admissions. The expansion project benefits the entire hospital as these beds can be used for many levels of care. The project funding was from a variety of sources including, debt financing, hospital operating budgets, and generous philanthropic support from the community. Hospital leadership and foundation support made a new Critical Care Unit (CCU) possible and it opened in October of 2012.

Access to its professional services is available 24 hours a day, every day. Serving Mason, Lewis and Thurston counties, Providence SoundHomeCare and Hospice is a non-profit, state licensed and Medicare certified agency. Foundation funding helps with respite care, comfort therapies, grief support, and education.

Patients and their families are then referred to community agencies for counseling and other services. The Sexual Assault Clinic is a certified specialty services provider. Victims of an assault that occurred within the last 96 hours should be seen at a hospital emergency room. The sexual assault nurse examiners are on call to the Providence St. Peter Hospital emergency room.

In 2012, the Foundation provided funds to this program to support staff training and conferences, educational materials (such as drug cessation books and DVDs) for clients and supplies for tobacco cessation treatment.
