The purpose of Providence Health & Services Foundation SF&SCV SA is to raise funds primarily for Providence Saint Joseph Medical Center, Providence Holy Cross Medical Center, and Providence Tarzana Medical Center. The Medical Centers are owned and operated by the Sisters of Providence dba Providence Health System - Southern California. The Medical Centers are committed to their missions of continuing the healing ministry of Jesus in the world of today, with special concern for those who are poor and vulnerable. The Medical Centers work in partnership with community organizations to reach out to those in need. Through these collaborative efforts, they improve access to health care and provide health education resources in the surrounding communities. During 2012, some of the grants paid to the three Medical Centers were used for the neuroscience stroke / research center at St. Joseph (\$1,657,000), the new patient wing at Holy Cross (\$500,000), the integrative medicine center at St. Joseph (\$468,000), palliative care at St. Joseph (\$260,000), and critical care transport to the emergency room at St. Joseph (\$242,000). The Providence spirit of compassionate care radiated throughout every corner of the Valleys in 2012, as the three supported medical centers went about the business of healing and changing lives through excellence in healthcare each and every day. As the dedicated people at the Medical Centers embrace patients and families with care, and reach out to help the poor and vulnerable in the community, Providence Health & Services Foundation is a strong pillar of support that transforms the Mission of Providence into reality in so many ways each year. Despite the challenges evident in the economic climate during 2012, the Foundation's resourceful philanthropic initiatives and dedication distributed over \$5 million to the Valley hospital ministries during the year. The tangible impacts are seen clearly in the wonders of medical technology, new services and programs, and capital projects that are born from the seeds of this giving in pursuit of the Providence Mission. Providence Saint Joseph Medical CenterThe Medical Center was recognized for excellence in 2012 by earning five-star ratings in the following treatment areas - cardiac, orthopedic, and appendectomy. It also received the Blue Distinction+ designation in knee and hip replacement from Blue Cross and Blue Shield. The Foundation's fundraising gala netted almost \$800,000 for the Medical Center in 2012, which is a significant increase over prior year events. The Roy and Patricia Disney Family Cancer Center, which opened in 2010, continues to provide comprehensive cancer treatment to meet the needs of each patient. Providence Holy Cross Medical CenterThe Medical Center was recognized for excellence in 2012 by earning five-star ratings in the following treatment areas - cardiac, neurosciences, pulmonary, gastrointestinal, and critical care. During 2012 it was ranked among the top 5% in the nation for overall pulmonary service, the top 10% in the nation for gastrointestinal medical treatment, and the top 10% in the nation for treatment of stroke. Other awards during 2012 include the HealthGrades Stroke Care Excellence Award, the HealthGrades Pulmonary Care Excellence Award, and the Blue Distinction+ designation in knee and hip replacement from Blue Cross and Blue Shield. It has one of the only round-the-clock trauma centers in the San Fernando Valley. The beautiful four-story expansion which opened in 2011 continues to provide much-needed beds to alleviate overcrowding, and provides the community's first neonatal ICU and a new chapel. Providence Tarzana Medical CenterAs the only Providence ministry in the San Fernando Valley with a pediatric intensive care unit, the Tarzana Medical Center continues to support upgrading of its pediatric department, including a planned expansion and relocation of the Pediatric ICU. The Medical Center was recognized for excellence in 2012 by earning five-star ratings in the following treatment areas - cardiac, pulmonary, vascular, gastrointestinal, and critical care. During 2012 it was ranked among the top 5% in the nation for overall pulmonary services and vascular surgery. Other awards during 2012 include the HealthGrades Pulmonary Care Excellence Award and the HealthGrades Vascular Surgery Excellence Award. GeneralThe success of the programs at all the Medical Centers is a result of two things - the extraordinary health care provided by Providence Medical Centers and the very generous donors who have contributed funding to ensure expansion of offerings to serve the growing population and to equip the hospitals with the latest technology. Touching in their generosity have been the physicians, employees, volunteers, Guild members and former patients and their family members who reached out to thank the Medical Centers for the care they received. The Medical Centers also work collaboratively with other organizations and community stakeholders to address the unmet health needs in the area. Progress made over the last year in addressing those needs include providing resources to the uninsured and underinsured, expanding education opportunities and counseling, disease outreach efforts especially targeted towards diabetes, hypertension and obesity, and disease prevention and health promotion programs and activities in the community. The work at the Valley ministries of Providence Southern California relies on the Foundation's continuing commitment to giving, and its unwavering belief in the Mission, just as the patients and those who are not as fortunate in the community rely on the People of Providence to deliver the gift of high quality care.

Providence is one of the larger health systems in the country, and as such, the Board benchmarks executive compensation against other large, not-for-profit health systems whose revenue is similar to that of Providence. Base salaries for Providence executives are set at the median level of the market, as identified by the independent consultant and reviewed with the Human Resources Committee.</p> <p>Performance incentives allow executives to earn additional compensation if they achieve specific organizational and individual goals for furthering Providence operating principles - advancing the Providence Mission and core values, meeting benchmarks for charity care, achieving quality targets, delivering top-rated customer satisfaction, meeting employee satisfaction goals and reaching financial performance objectives. The Board of Directors conducts a thorough process to ensure performance incentives are aligned with appropriate practices for not-for-profit health care systems. The Board's process for executive compensation fully complies with IRS standards and mirrors the best practices recommended in the "Report to Congress and the Nonprofit Sector on Governance, Transparency, and Accountability" submitted to the Senate Finance Committee by the Panel on the Nonprofit Sector. The Foundation President is compensated by a related organization which uses a market based compensation program utilizing several independent third party compensation market surveys to establish pay ranges for the position. The related organization then establishes the individual rate of pay within the range based on relevant experience, skills and competencies. The rate offered to the President at the time of hire was determined through discussion between the Regional CEO, Regional Director of HR and the Administrative Director of HR. The ranges and rate of pay are reviewed on an annual basis by Regional HR.</p>
