

**NOTE A – NATURE OF ACTIVITIES AND SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING
POLICIES**

St. Monica's Senior Citizens Home, Inc. (the Home) is accredited as a community based residential facility (CBRF) providing residential care and meals for senior citizens. The corporation that runs the Home is a non-stock non-profit corporation organized under the laws of the state of Wisconsin.

The Home is entitled to exemption from federal and state income tax according to section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The Home has also been classified as an entity that is not a private Foundation within the meaning of section 509(a) and qualified for deductible contributions as provided in section 170(b)(1)(A)(vi). (See Note M)

The Home maintains its books on the accrual basis of accounting and reports the residential rental operation similar to that of a for-profit entity. Contributions are not a significant portion of revenues. The Home is not defined as a voluntary health and welfare organization.

Property and equipment are recorded at cost. Depreciation is provided on the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the respective assets. Maintenance and repairs are charged to expense as incurred; major betterments are capitalized. When items of property or equipment are sold or retired, the related cost and accumulated depreciation are removed from the accounts and any gain or loss is reported in current results of operations.

Unrestricted contributions received since formation of the corporation have been in the form of cash or other property. Other property, when received, is recorded at the fair market value of the donation.

In accordance with the Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 117, Financial Statements of Not-for-Profit Organizations, the Home is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets, and permanently restricted net assets. In addition, the Home is required to present a statement of cash flows. These statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles, as generally accepted in the United States of America.

NOTE D – INVESTMENTS

Under Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP), investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair value and all investments in debt securities are valued at their fair value in the comparative statements of financial position. Unrealized gains and losses are included in the change in net assets.

In addition, GAAP defines fair value, establishes a framework for measuring fair values in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and expands disclosures about fair value measurements. GAAP clarifies that the exchange price is the price in an orderly transaction between market participants to sell an asset or transfer a liability at the measurement date. The statement emphasizes that fair value is a market-based measurement and not an entity-specific measurement. Adoption of this standard has not had a material impact on the Home's financial statements. GAAP establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs, which are summarized as follows:

Level 1—Quoted prices in active markets, e.g. NYSE, NASDAQ, etc., for assets identical to the securities to be valued. If a Level 1 input is available, it must be used.

Level 2—Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for securities, either directly or indirectly. Examples include matrix pricing utilizing yield curves, prepayment speeds, credit risks, etc...; quoted prices for similar assets in active markets; and inputs derived from observable market data by correlation or other means.

Level 3—Unobservable inputs, which contain assumptions by the party valuing those assets. For Level 3 inputs there is no market data or correlations with market assumptions. Examples would include limited partnership interests, closely held stock, etc.

NOTE E – PREPAID EXPENSES

Prepaid supplies represents inventory of operating supplies on hand and based on physical inventory listings at cost of \$41,266.

Prepaid insurance represents the unexpired portion on existing policies of \$17,105.

Prepaid expenses represent major repairs incurred during the current year being amortized over variable lives from twelve to twenty-four months. Total at March 31, 2013 is \$12,279.

NOTE F – CURRENT LIABILITIES

Trade payables at balance sheet date represent vendors' invoices due and payable from one to thirty days.

Accrued expenses include amounts due for pension contributions of \$30,038 for March 31, 2012 and \$29,887 for March 31, 2013.

NOTE G – BASIS OF LAND

The land at 3920 North Green Bay Road was acquired from the Sisters of St. Rita at a cost of \$95,000 plus \$5,784.66 for improvements. Additional realty at 4046 North Green Bay Road was acquired in 1988-89 at a cost of \$82,615 of which \$55,517 has been allocated to land. During 1999-2000 the Home at 4046 North Green Bay Road was razed to make room for new construction. Net book value of the realty was added to land at a cost of \$17,715. In addition, site preparation costs for the new construction were \$46,669 and land received from the Sisters of St. Rita for the new link was valued at \$2,304.

NOTE I – ENDOWMENT FUND

In the year ended March 31, 1998, a bequest was received by the Home for \$60,000 with the stipulation that the money is restricted to assist residents of the Home who cannot afford to remain without some form of financial aid. The board has resolved that the earnings generated by this fund be used to benefit residents who have lived in the Home a minimum of two years and find themselves in need of financial assistance in order to remain. As of March 31, 2013 earnings to date are \$66,582. The Home has not had a need to draw on this fund to date.

NOTE J – PENSION PLAN

All employees who qualify are participants in a defined contribution plan, approved by the Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporation. Contributions to the plan are at the discretion of the board of directors. The board of directors has approved a contribution of \$31,482 for the current fiscal year that approximates 3.5% of the payroll of eligible participants.

NOTE K – CONTRIBUTED SERVICES

The Home receives some services donated by outsiders in carrying out its mission. No amounts have been reflected in the financial statements for those services since they do not meet the criteria for recognition under SFAS No. 116, Accounting for Contributions Received and Contributions Made.

NOTE L – ADVERTISING COSTS

The Home expenses advertising costs as they are incurred. During the current fiscal year, advertising costs were \$12,314.

NOTE M – INCOME TAXES

The Home is exempt from federal and state income taxes on related exempt-function income under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and has been classified as other than a private foundation. The Home does not consider any of its support and revenues to be unrelated business income and accordingly, no provision for income taxes has been provided in the accompanying financial statements.

The Home has never been the subject of U.S. federal income tax examinations, however the books of the Home remain open for review by the Internal Revenue Service for three prior years.

NOTE N – SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Management has evaluated subsequent events for possible recognition or disclosure through the date the financial statements were available to be distributed (June 6, 2013). There are no transactions that occurred subsequent to this date that require recognition or disclosure.
