**UNANIMOUS CONSENT ACTION OF
THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF
CHICAGO 2016**

The undersigned, being all of the members of the Board of Directors (the "Board") of Chicago 2016, an Illinois not for profit corporation (the "Corporation"), waive all notice of the time, place or purpose of a meeting and consent to, approve and adopt the following resolutions without a meeting pursuant to Section 108.45 of the Illinois General Not for Profit Corporation Act of 1986, as amended (the "Act"):

WHEREAS, the mission of the Corporation is to improve and enhance the quality of life of the residents of Chicago, Illinois, and the surrounding metropolitan area through the promotion and sponsorship of Chicago as the site for the 2016 Olympic and Paralympic Games (the "2016 Games");

WHEREAS, on October 2, 2009, the International Olympic Committee (the "IOC") awarded the privilege of hosting the 2016 Games to Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, a competitor of the Corporation;

WHEREAS, in light of the IOC's decision, the Board desires to authorize the wind-up, liquidation and dissolution of the Corporation;

WHEREAS, during the bid for the 2016 Games, the Corporation formed and supported World Sport Chicago, an Illinois not for profit corporation ("WSC");

WHEREAS, the mission of WSC is to, among other things, enhance the image, awareness and participation in Olympic sport across Chicago;

WHEREAS, WSC intends to continue operating to serve the youth of Chicago and the surrounding metropolitan area;

WHEREAS, the Corporation desires to support the continuation and growth of WSC and its programs as a legacy of the bid for the 2016 Games;

WHEREAS, per the Applicant Committee Agreement between the United States Olympic Committee (the "USOC") and the Corporation, the USOC has provided its consent to the distribution of the Corporation's residual net assets to WSC; and

WHEREAS, it has been disclosed to the Board and the Board is aware that three members of the Board also serve as members of the Board of Directors of WSC.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board hereby determines that it is in the best interests of the Corporation that its operations be wound-up and that it be liquidated and dissolved;

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board hereby approves the dissolution of the Corporation upon such timetable as the officers of the Corporation (the "Authorized Officers") determine is reasonable, subject to the Plan of Distribution outlined below;

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board hereby determines that it is in the best interests of the Corporation that the Corporation's residual net assets be distributed to WSC, as set forth in the Plan of Distribution outlined below;

FURTHER RESOLVED, that to accomplish the wind-up, liquidation and dissolution of the Corporation, the following Plan of Distribution is adopted for the Corporation's assets:


1. Before the Corporation is dissolved, all liabilities and obligations of the Corporation will be paid, satisfied and discharged, or adequate provision will be made therefor.
2. To the extent feasible and not desired by WSC, the Authorized Officers are each authorized and directed to sell and convert into cash any and all assets of the Corporation.
3. To account for any remaining expenses, the Corporation will retain at least \$250,000 in cash (the "Reserve Amount") until the date of filing of the Articles of Dissolution with the Illinois Secretary of State (the "Final Dissolution Date"). Such retention may be in a greater amount if determined to be necessary or advisable by the Authorized Officers.
4. Subject to Paragraph 3 above, the assets of the Corporation will be distributed to WSC, a 501(c)(3) tax-exempt organization, as follows:
 - (a) all remaining personal property of the Corporation on January 15, 2010;
 - (b) \$3,000,000 in cash on January 15, 2010;
 - (c) all remaining cash assets of the Corporation, less the Reserve Amount, on April 15, 2010; and
 - (d) all remaining cash assets of the Corporation on or promptly following the Final Dissolution Date.
5. The Final Dissolution Date shall be a date as determined by any of the Authorized Officers, but shall not be before the satisfaction (whether by repayment, assignment or otherwise) of that certain Additional Note, dated June 30, 2009, issued by the Corporation in favor of MRL Acquisition, LLC. Such note is currently due and payable on December 31, 2010.
6. The Authorized Officers are each authorized and directed to take all other necessary action to effect the wind-up, liquidation and dissolution of the Corporation pursuant to applicable provisions of the Act, including the filing of Articles of Dissolution with the Illinois Secretary of State;

FURTHER RESOLVED, that any and all prior actions taken by the Authorized Officers consistent and in furtherance of the intent and purposes of the foregoing resolutions are hereby ratified and adopted as actions of the Corporation; and

FURTHER RESOLVED, that, the Authorized Officers are each hereby authorized to do, or cause to be done, all acts and things, including the execution, delivery and filing of any applications, certificates or other documents as may be necessary or desirable to carry out the wind-up, liquidation and dissolution of the Corporation (any such Authorized Officer's approval of the form, content, necessity or desirability of any such application, certificate or other document to be conclusively evidenced by such Authorized Officer's execution and delivery thereof on behalf of the Corporation) and to carry out the intent and purposes of the foregoing resolutions.
