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

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

NOTE 1 ORGANIZATION AND SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Organization and Purpose

The purpose of Prairie Lakes Health Care System, Inc. and Affiliate (the Health System or Prairie Lakes) is to own and operate a unified hospital/health care system to provide a comprehensive range of health care services, both acute and non-acute, to the citizens of Watertown, South Dakota and the surrounding region. The consolidated financial statements include the operating activities and results of Prairie Lakes Health Care System, Inc. and Prairie Lakes Home Connections, Inc. (Home Connections). Home Connections provides homemaker services to the citizens of Watertown, South Dakota and the surrounding region and is wholly owned by Prairie Lakes Health Care System, Inc.

Basis of Accounting

The consolidated financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting All significant intercompany accounts and transactions are eliminated in consolidation

Tax Status

The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has determined that Prairie Lakes and Home Connections are tax-exempt, not-for-profit corporations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC)

The Health System follows the guidance in the accounting standards regarding the recognition and measurement of uncertain tax positions. The guidance clarifies the accounting for uncertainty in income taxes recognized in an entity's financial statements. The guidance further prescribes recognition and measurement of tax provisions taken or expected to be taken on a tax return that are not certain to be realized. The application of this standard has no impact on the Health System's financial statements.

The Health Systems income tax returns are subject to review and examination by federal, state, and local authorities. The information tax returns for the years ended 2010 to 2012 are open to examination by federal, local, and state authorities.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions, such as contractual allowances, allowances for doubtful accounts receivable, contractual settlements, and estimated incurred but not reported health claims, that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Estimates also affect the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Impairment of Long-Lived Assets

Management periodically reviews the carrying value of long-lived assets for potential impairment by comparing the carrying value of these assets to the estimated undiscounted future cash flows expected to result from the use of these assets. Should the sum of the related expected future net cash flows be less than the carrying value, an impairment loss would be recognized. There were no impairments recorded in 2013 or 2012.

NOTE 1 ORGANIZATION AND SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Prairie Lakes considers all unrestricted and undesignated, highly liquid investments with an original maturity of three months or less and fixed income investments that have no early withdrawal penalties to be cash equivalents. Cash equivalents are carried at cost which approximates fair value. Cash and cash equivalents held for long-term or restricted use are classified as investments.

Patient Accounts Receivable

Patient accounts receivable are reduced by an allowance for doubtful accounts. In evaluating the collectibility of patient accounts receivable, the Health System analyzes its past history and identifies trends for each of its major payor sources of revenue to estimate the appropriate allowance for doubtful accounts and provision for bad debts. Management regularly reviews data about these major payor sources of revenue in evaluating the sufficiency of the allowance for doubtful accounts. For receivables associated with services provided to patients who have third-party coverage, the Health System analyzes contractually due amounts and provides an allowance for doubtful accounts and a provision for bad debts, if necessary (for example, for expected uncollectible deductibles and copayments on accounts for which the third-party payor has not yet paid, or for payors who are known to be having financial difficulties that make the realization of amounts due unlikely) For receivables associated with self-pay patients (which includes both patients without insurance and patients with deductible and copayment balances due for which third-party coverage exists for part of the bill), the Health System records a significant provision for bad debts in the period of service on the basis of its past experience, which indicates that many patients are unable or unwilling to pay the portion of their bill for which they are financially responsible. The difference between the standard rates (or the discounted rates if negotiated) and the amounts actually collected after all reasonable collection efforts have been exhausted is charged off against the allowance for doubtful accounts

The Health System's allowance for doubtful accounts for self-pay patients decreased from 81% of self-pay accounts receivable at May 31, 2012, to 77% of self-pay accounts receivable at May 31, 2013 The Health System's self-pay write-offs did increase approximately \$546,000 from approximately \$2,399,000 for fiscal year 2012 to approximately \$2,946,000 for fiscal year 2013 The decrease in the allowance for doubtful accounts was the result of lower self-pay balances as of May 31, 2013 compared to May 31, 2012 See Note 8 for explanation of changes in the charity care and uninsured discount policies during fiscal year 2013 The Health System does not maintain a material allowance for doubtful accounts from third-party payors, nor did it have significant write-offs from third-party payors

Inventories

Inventories are stated at cost (principally on the first-in, first-out basis) not in excess of market value

NOTE 1 ORGANIZATION AND SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Prepaid Expenses and Other

Included in the prepaid expenses and other current assets are doctor and employee accounts receivable, an electronic health record incentive receivable (Note 6) and other miscellaneous receivables totaling \$162,836 and \$1,788,847 at May 31, 2013 and 2012, respectively

Investments

Investments in equity securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities are measured at fair value in the consolidated statement of financial position. Prairie Lakes has classified their investments as trading securities and, accordingly, has included realized and unrealized gains and losses on investments in the excess of revenues over expenses.

Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment are stated at cost, if purchased, or at fair market value on the date received, if donated, less accumulated depreciation. Major renewals and improvements are capitalized to the property accounts and depreciated accordingly Replacements, maintenance and repairs that do not improve or extend the lives of the assets are expensed currently. Depreciation on purchased or donated property is provided on a straight-line basis over the estimated useful lives as follows.

Buildings	20 to 40 Years
Land Improvements	5 to 20 Years
Fixed Equipment	5 to 25 Years
Movable Equipment	3 to 15 Years

Other Assets

Other assets include deferred financing costs incurred in connection with the issuance of the Series 2010 bond issuance (see Note 4), which are amortized on a straight-line basis over the life of the related debt. Deferred financing costs of \$409,272 at May 31, 2013 and 2012 are presented net of accumulated amortization of \$106,879 and \$62,676 as of May 31, 2013 and 2012, respectively

Also included within other assets is goodwill from the purchase of Mallard Pointe (a local surgical center) during 2005, with an original cost of \$291,208. At May 31, 2013 and 2012, the ending value of goodwill was \$209,508 and \$219,215, respectively. As of May 31, 2013 and 2012, management has determined that goodwill is not impaired.

Other assets also include investments in VHA for \$200,000 and Upper Midwest Consolidated Services Center for \$50,000, carried at cost as Prairie Lakes holds less than 20% of these equities and does not have significant influence

NOTE 1 ORGANIZATION AND SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Funds Held by Trustee under Debt Agreement

The debt agreement (Note 4) requires that certain funds be held by the trustee during the term of the bond issue. Prairie Lakes is required to make periodic deposits to funds maintained by the trustee for payment of bond interest and principal.

Net Patient Service Revenue

Net patient service revenue is reported at the estimated net realizable amounts from patients, third-party payors, and others for services rendered, including estimated retroactive adjustments under reimbursement agreements with third-party payors Retroactive adjustments are accrued on an estimated basis in the period the related services are rendered and adjusted in future periods, as final settlements are determined

Charity Care

Prairie Lakes provides care to patients who meet certain criteria under its charity care policy without charge or at amounts less than its established rates. Because Prairie Lakes does not pursue collection of amounts determined to qualify as charity care, the amounts are not reported as revenue.

Electronic Health Record Incentive Payments

As discussed in Note 6, Prairie Lakes had recorded a receivable for funds under the Electronic Health Records (EHR) Incentive Program during the year ended May 31, 2012 There is not a receivable recorded at May 31, 2013 Prairie Lakes recognizes revenue at the completion of the EHR reporting period when all meaningful use objectives and any other specific grant requirements that are applicable are met, e.g., electronic transmission of quality measures to CMS in the second and subsequent payment years. The Health system has not yet met all requirements for the second year incentive payment.

Employee Health Insurance

Prairie Lakes maintains a self-insured employee health benefit program. Stop-loss has been purchased for individual losses in excess of \$70,000 at May 31, 2013 and 2012, through an insurance company. Estimated unprocessed claims and claims incurred but not reported at May 31, 2013 and 2012 were approximately \$1,198,000 and \$1,570,000, respectively, and are included as accrued salaries and employee benefits in the consolidated statements of financial position.

NOTE 1 ORGANIZATION AND SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Donor-Restricted Gifts

Unconditional promises to give cash and other assets are reported at fair value at the date the promise is received, which is then treated at cost. The gifts are reported as either temporarily or permanently restricted support if they are received with donor stipulations that limit the use of the donated assets. When a donor restriction expires (that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished) temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified as unrestricted net assets and reported in the statement of operations as net assets released from restrictions. Donor-restricted contributions whose restrictions are met within the same year as received are reflected as unrestricted revenue in the statements of operations.

Capital Grants and Contributions

Grants and contributions received that are restricted specifically for capital acquisitions are reported on the statements of operations after excess of revenues over expenses as a direct increase to unrestricted net assets

Statements of Operations

Prairie Lakes' operating income includes all unrestricted revenue and expenses, including investment income on debt service trust investments. Nonoperating gains and losses include unrestricted and board-designated investment return, gains on other investments, loss on bond refinancing, and unrestricted contributions.

Derivative Instruments and Hedging Activities

All contracts that contain provisions meeting the definition of a derivative also meet the requirements of, and have been designated as, normal purchases or sales

Beneficial Interest in Net Assets of Prairie Lakes Health Care Foundation

Prairie Lakes and Prairie Lakes Health Care Foundation (Foundation) are financially interrelated organizations. Accordingly, Prairie Lakes is required to recognize its interest in the net assets of the Foundation and adjust that interest for its share of the change in net assets of the Foundation. The IRS has determined that the Foundation is a tax-exempt, not-for-profit corporation under Section 501(c)(3) of the IRC and qualifies for the charitable contribution deduction under Section 170(b)(1)(A) and is classified as an organization that is not a private foundation under Section 509(a)(1)

Prairie Lakes periodically requests funds from the Foundation for capital or other needs Such requests are received by the Foundation and, if approved, funds are transferred to Prairie Lakes Such transfers of funds are reported in the consolidated financial statements as contributions from the Foundation Prairie Lakes' beneficial interest in the unrestricted and temporarily restricted net assets of the Foundation and its share of the change in those net assets are reported in the consolidated financial statements in temporarily restricted net assets

NOTE 1 ORGANIZATION AND SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Subsequent Events

In preparing the consolidated financial statement, the Health System has considered events and transactions that have occurred through August 21, 2013, the date in which the consolidated financial statements were available to be issued

Fair Value of Financial Instruments

The Health System adopted accounting standards regarding the fair value measurement of financial assets and liabilities. Fair value measurement applies to reported balances that are required or permitted to be measured at fair value under an existing accounting standard. The Health System emphasize that fair value is a market-based measurement, not an entity-specific measurement. Therefore, a fair value measurement should be determined based on the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability and establishes a fair value hierarchy. The fair value hierarchy consists of three levels of inputs that may be used to measure fair value as follows.

Level 1 – Inputs that utilize quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the Health System has the ability to access

Level 2 – Inputs that include quoted prices for similar assets and liabilities in active markets and inputs that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, for substantially the full term of the financial instrument. Fair values for these instruments are estimated using pricing models, quoted prices of securities with similar characteristics, or discounted cash flows.

Level 3 – Inputs that are unobservable inputs for the asset or liability, which are typically based on an entity's own assumptions, as there is little, if any, related market activity

In instances where the determination of the fair value measurement is based on inputs from different levels of the fair value hierarchy, the level in the fair value hierarchy within which the entire fair value measurement falls is based on the lowest level input that is significant to the fair value measurement in its entirety. See Note 2 to the consolidated financial statements for the fair market value disclosures of the Health System's financial instruments as of May 31, 2013 and 2012.

Trading Securities Trading securities are recorded at fair value on a recurring basis Fair value measurement is based upon quoted prices, if available. If quoted prices are not available, fair values are measured using independent pricing models or other model-based valuation techniques such as the present value of future cash flows, adjusted for the security's credit rating, prepayment assumptions, and other factors such as credit loss assumptions. Securities valued using Level 1 inputs include those traded on an active exchange, such as the New York Stock Exchange, as well as U.S. Treasury and other U.S. government and agency mortgage-backed securities that are traded by dealers or brokers in active over-the-counter markets. Securities valued using Level 2 inputs consist of the beneficial interest in net assets of Prairie Lakes Health Care Foundation. The Health System does not have any securities that are valued using Level 3 inputs.

NOTE 1 ORGANIZATION AND SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Fair Value of Financial Instruments (Continued)

Additionally, from time to time, the Health System may be required to record at fair value other assets on a nonrecurring basis in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. These adjustments to fair value usually result from the application of the lower-of-cost-or-market accounting or write down of individual assets. Nonfinancial assets measured at fair value on a nonrecurring basis would include nonfinancial assets and nonfinancial liabilities measured at fair value in the second step of a goodwill impairment test, other real estate owned, and other intangible assets measured at fair value for impairment assessment.

Adoption of Accounting Standard Update

During 2013 the Health System adopted an accounting standard update "Presentation and Disclosure of Patient Service Revenue, Provision for Bad Debts, and the Allowance for Doubtful Accounts" in the consolidated financial statements. The update results in net patient service revenue being presented net of the provision for uncollectible accounts for patient accounts the Health System did not believe were collectible at the time the service was provided. The change in the presentation results in net patient service revenue (after any provision for bad debts) that is more consistent to the actual revenue that the Health System expects to collect. The added disclosures will assist the users of the consolidated financial statements to better understand how the Health System recognizes patient service revenue and assesses uncollectible accounts. This standard was retroactively applied to the consolidated financial statements for the year ending May 31, 2012. The adoption has no impact, other than presentation, on the consolidated financial statements for the fiscal year ended May 31, 2012.

NOTE 2 INVESTMENTS

Investments, funds designated by the board of directors (Board) for future plant replacement and expansion, funds designated by the board of directors for community benefit, and funds held by the trustee under debt agreement are stated at fair value, which is based upon the quoted market prices at the reporting date

NOTE 5 NET PATIENT SERVICE REVENUE

The Health System has agreements with third-party payors that provide for payments to the Health System at amounts different from its established rates. A summary of the payment arrangements with major third-party payors follows

Medicare

Inpatient acute care services rendered to Medicare program beneficiaries are paid at prospectively determined rates per discharge. These rates vary according to a patient classification system that is based on clinical, diagnostic, and other factors. Inpatient non-acute services and certain outpatient services related to Medicare beneficiaries were paid based upon a cost reimbursement methodology. The Health System was reimbursed for cost reimbursable items at a tentative rate with final settlement determined after submission of annual cost reports by the Health System and audits thereof by the Medicare fiscal intermediary. The Health System's classification of patients under the Medicare program and the appropriateness of their admission are subject to an independent review by a peer review Health System under contract with the Health System. Most outpatient services are paid to Medicare program beneficiaries under an outpatient prospective payment system, with predetermined rates based on a patient classification system that is based on clinical diagnostic and other factors. Outpatient services subject to the outpatient prospective payment system are not subject to cost report settlement.

Medicaid

Inpatient services rendered to Medicaid program beneficiaries are reimbursed under a reimbursement methodology similar to inpatient Medicare. Outpatient Medicaid services are reimbursed under the lower of usual or customary charge fee structure.

Net revenue from the Medicare and Medicaid programs accounted for approximately 54% and 5%, respectively, of the Health System's net patient revenue for the year ended 2013, and 53% and 5%, respectively, of the Health System's net patient revenue for the year ended 2012 Laws and regulations governing the Medicare and Medicaid programs are extremely complex and subject to interpretation. As a result, there is at least a reasonable possibility that recorded estimates will change by a material amount in the near term.

Uninsured Patients

The Health System recognizes patient service revenue associated with services provided to patients who have third-party payor coverage on the basis of contractual rates for the services rendered. For uninsured patients that do not qualify for charity care, the Health System recognizes revenue on the basis of its standard rates for services provided (or on the basis of discounted rates, if negotiated or provided by policy). On the basis of historical experience, a significant portion of the Health System's uninsured patients will be unable or unwilling to pay for the services provided. Thus, the System records a significant provision for bad debts related to uninsured patients in the period the services are provided.

NOTE 6 ELECTRONIC HEALTH RECORD INCENTIVE PROGRAM

The Electronic Health Record (EHR) incentive program was enacted as part of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA) and the Health Information Technology for Economic and Clinical Health (HITECH) Act These Acts provided for incentive payments under both the Medicare and Medicaid programs to eligible hospitals that demonstrate meaningful use of certified EHR technology. The incentive payments are made based on a statutory formula and are contingent on the Health System continuing to meet the escalating meaningful use criteria. For the first payment year, the Health System must attest, subject to an audit, that it met the meaningful use criteria for a continuous 90-day period.

For the subsequent payment year, the Health System must demonstrate meaningful use for the entire year. The incentive payments are generally made over a four year period. For hospitals that do not start receiving meaningful use payments until federal fiscal year 2014 or 2015, the base payment amount will reduce in subsequent years by 1/4, 1/2, and 3/4

The Health System demonstrated meaningful use to the 90-day period ended April 14, 2012 in the year ended May 31, 2012 As of May 31, 2012 the Health System had recorded a receivable from Medicare for approximately \$1,550,000. The receivable is included in prepaid expenses and other on the consolidated statements of financial position. The incentive payment was received during the year ended May 31, 2013. The amount receivable in the fiscal year 2012 was recognized as other operating revenues in the consolidated statements of operations for the year ended May 31, 2012. The Health System recognizes revenue using the grant accounting model. The final amount of the incentive payment was determined during the year ended May 31, 2013 based on the cost report filed for the year ended May 31, 2012. The final payment materially agreed to the recorded receivable, and any difference in estimate was recorded as other operating revenues in the current year. The Health System has not yet met the full 365-day meaningful use attestation period for the second year of payment as of May 31, 2013, therefore, no receivable has been recorded as of year-end.

NOTE 7 RETIREMENT PLANS

Pension Plan

Prairie Lakes has a defined contribution retirement plan covering substantially all employees Prairie Lakes matches 100% of the employees' contributions up to 3% of their salary and contributions are made biweekly into the plan For fiscal 2013 and 2012, pension expense was \$533,885 and \$559,972, respectively, and is included in salaries and benefits expense on the consolidated statements of operations

NOTE 7 RETIREMENT PLANS (CONTINUED)

Deferred Compensation Plan

Prairie Lakes offers a select group of management or highly compensated employees a 457(b) deferred compensation plan created in accordance with applicable provisions of the IRC. The plan permits employees to defer a portion of their salary until future years. The accumulated deferred compensation balance is not available to employees until termination, retirement, death, or unforeseeable emergency. All amounts of compensation deferred under the plan, and all income attributable to those amounts are (until paid or made available to the employee or other beneficiary) solely the property of Prairie Lakes, and Prairie Lakes has all the related rights of ownership (not restricted to the payment of benefits under the plan), subject only to the claim of Prairie Lakes' general creditors. Participants' rights under the plan are equal to those of general creditors of Prairie Lakes in an amount equal to the fair market value of the deferred account for each participant. The plan is fully funded and the related assets and liabilities are reported at fair market value within other assets and other liabilities on the consolidated statements of financial position.

NOTE 8 COMMUNITY BENEFIT AND CHARITY CARE

Prairie Lakes provides a wide range of benefits to the community, including offering various community health education programs, health screening and promotion services, counseling and referral services, and hospice

Prairie Lakes also provides medical care without charge or at a reduced charge to the residents of the community it serves. In October 2005, the Charity Care policy was modified by allowing for more residents to qualify for charity benefits. The revised policy increased eligibility for charity benefits by changing the patient income threshold to 200% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines. In addition, the eligibility formula now excludes some assets and limits the percent of income used in the calculation. In the year ended May 31, 2013, the charity care was modified to comply with the provisions of IRS 501(r), which provides for a discount from billed charges to those that qualify for financial assistance for medically necessary services. The level of charity care provided, as defined by services rendered without charge or at a reduced charge was approximately \$3,630,000 and \$3,227,000 for the years ended May 31, 2013 and 2012, respectively. The cost related to these services was approximately \$1,780,000 and \$1,534,000 for the years ended May 31, 2013 and 2012, respectively. The cost of charity care is estimated using the Health System's overall cost to charge ratios.

NOTE 9 CONCENTRATIONS OF CREDIT RISKS

Prairie Lakes grants credit without collateral to its patients, many of whom are local residents and are insured under third-party payor agreements. The mix of receivables from patient and third-party payors at May 31, 2013 and 2012 was as follows

The fair value of Prairie Lakes' refunding revenue bonds are estimated based on the quoted market prices for similar issues or by discounting expected cash flows at the rates currently offered to Prairie Lakes for debt of the same remaining maturities, as advised by investment bankers. NOTE 12 COMMITMENTS AND CONTINGENCIES

Operating Leases

Prairie Lakes leases certain space and equipment under both cancelable and noncancelable operating lease agreements. Rent expense, including operating expenses, under both cancelable and noncancelable operating leases was \$127,773 and \$162,810 for fiscal 2013 and 2012, respectively

Healthcare Legislation and Regulation

The healthcare industry is subject to numerous laws and regulations of federal, state, and local governments. These laws and regulations include, but are not necessarily limited to, matters such as licensure, accreditation, government healthcare program participation requirements, reimbursement for patient services and Medicare and Medicaid fraud and abuse. Recently, government activity has increased with respect to investigations and allegations concerning possible violations of fraud and abuse statutes and regulations by healthcare providers. Violation of these laws and regulations could result in expulsion from government healthcare programs together with the imposition of significant fines and penalties, as well as significant repayments for patient services previously billed.

NOTE 12 COMMITMENTS AND CONTINGENCIES (CONTINUED)

Healthcare Legislation and Regulation (Continued)

Management believes that the Health System is in substantial compliance with fraud and abuse as well as other applicable government laws and regulations. While no regulatory inquiries have been made, compliance with such laws and regulations is subject to government review and interpretation, as well as regulatory actions unknown or unasserted at this time.

Malpractice Insurance

The Health System has malpractice insurance coverage to provide protection for professional liability losses on a claims-made basis subject to a limit of \$1 million per claim, an annual aggregate limit of \$3 million, with umbrella coverage up to \$5 million. Should the claims-made policy not be renewed or replaced with equivalent insurance, claims based on occurrences during its term, but reported subsequently, will be uninsured. Coverage under the current policy extends to April 2014.

NOTE 13 ADOPTION OF NEW ACCOUNTING STANDARD

During the year ended May 31, 2013, the Health System adopted an accounting standard update for the "Presentation and Disclosure of Patient Service Revenue, Provision for Bad Debts, and the Allowance for Doubtful Accounts" in the consolidated financial statements, as described in Note 1. This standard was retroactively applied to the consolidated financial statements for the year ended May 31, 2012.
