but it sounds like she has a job at (Grace Cottage Hospital) and is very well-liked."

Several searches were conducted during the weekend of the area near Holmes' Plumb Road residence, along with other places deemed personally significant for Holmes. The police also monitored her cellphone, social media and financial activity — without finding any leads, according to Zoynay.

Investigators continue to search for Holmes and speak with family members, friends and co-workers. They ask that anyone who has seen Holmes' vehicle or has information about her location contact the state police at 802-254-2382.
