The Executive Compensation Committee reports to the Executive Committee and makes recommendations for Executive Committee approval. The Executive Committee approves the CEO compensation and the ranges for each staff classification, ensures organizational compliance as part of the budget process and recommends a budget that reflects that compliance. The Board of Directors reviews and approves the full budget. The CEO and senior management will establish individual compensation for staff members within the ranges established. This process is documented in the minutes of United Way.
