On October 26, 2006, the New Jersey educational facilities authority issued its capital improvement fund bonds, 2006A to refund part of the capital improvement fund 2004A bonds and part of several other issues of capital improvement bonds. Debt service on the 2004A bonds was adjusted to take account of the debt service savings that resulted from the refunding.
