Vans/Other Clinics - MobileMed delivers effective, efficient primary and preventive care in fixed-site clinics and on mobile vans at nine accessible locations throughout Montgomery County. Diverse clinical staff and volunteers serve 5,500 low-income County residents who are uninsured or enrolled in Medicaid. Our model includes integrated, bilingual behavioral health therapists on-site. Through generous hospital and public partners, we arrange for diagnostic testing, medications, and specialty referrals. Relationships with ethnic and faith-based community organizations expand our outreach and cultural competence. Our services (16,000 annual encounters) enable disadvantaged adults to get timely care in an appropriate setting, in order to manage their chronic conditions, identify diseases early through preventive screening, and address illnesses helping patients return to work sooner. Clinics sites are accessible by public transit and operate on a regular schedule every weekday and two evenings, with a mix of walk-in and scheduled appointments. Our patients come from 100 different countries and speak 25 different languages. Primary languages in addition to English include Spanish, French, and Farsi. No one is turned away for inability to pay. Shady Grove Adventist Hospital, Washington Adventist Hospital, and Suburban Hospital donate significant diagnostic testing services. Beyond primary care, we conduct a Womens Clinic, plus a Heart Clinic and Endocrine Clinic through collaborations with NIH at Suburban Hospital.

UpCounty - The Organization opened its first clinic offering daily services at a fixed site location in 2008 with support from Montgomery County, Shady Grove Adventist Hospital, Adventist HealthCare, the State of Maryland, Kaiser Permanente and others. This six-exam room clinic provides a full array of primary care services, including behavioral health. It is also the principal site for expanded patient services to the Korean and Chinese immigrant communities. Open five and one-half days per week, it has grown to serve forty percent of the agency's total caseload.

Head Start - MobileMed contracts with the Montgomery County Dept. of Health and Human Services to provide health management services to children 3 to 5 years old enrolled in the Head Start program. The Organizations nurses track the childrens growth and development, and provide information about nutrition and healthy lifestyles. The nurses assess the primary healthcare needs of these children, refer appropriately to Maryland Childrens Health Insurance Program (MCHIP) and the Countys Care for Kids, and link them with program providers. Uninsured parents in need of primary care may be referred to the Organization or other resources. Case management services are offered to all Head Start Program children and their families. During the 2012-2013 school year, the Organization provided services to children in 100 classes in 60 Montgomery County Public Schools and community-based centers.

Note 1

Organization

Mobile Medical Care, Inc (the “Organization”) is a nonprofit charitable organization. The Organization provides comprehensive health care services for low-income, uninsured and underinsured populations. The major sources of funding are contracts paid by government agencies as well as charitable contributions and grants from private and corporate sectors.

Vans Other Clinics

The Organization provides medical care to the low-income and uninsured residents of Montgomery County, Maryland at little or no charge. The program is designed to provide access to quality health care to all residents age 18 and over who are unable to pay for these services and have no third-party reimbursement available. Patients are seen regardless of the ability to pay. The majority of patients are between 30 and 65 years of age. Clinics are conducted at various locations – at fixed sites and in medical vans – at scheduled times during each week. The newest clinic opened during 2012 in Rockville in a County-owned building. The clinics are staffed primarily by volunteer physicians and paid nurse practitioners, physician assistants and nurses. Patients are provided services on an appointment or walk-in basis that removes barriers around accessibility. Clinic schedules tend to be at full capacity. The Organization continues to recruit volunteers for both professional and support staff positions to assist in the delivery of services.

Head Start

The Organization has renewed its contract with the Montgomery County Department of Health and Human Services to provide health management services to children 3 to 5 years old who are enrolled in the Head Start Program. Through this contract, the Organization assesses the primary health care needs of children enrolled in the Head Start Program and refers them to Maryland Children’s Health Insurance Program (MCHIP) and Care for Kids. Once the children are accepted into these programs, the nurses link them with a program provider. In the process of assessing the needs of children, the parents in need of primary care are identified and referred to the Organization, if they have no insurance. Case management services are offered to all Head Start Program children and their families. During the 2012-2013 school year, the Organization provided services to children in 100 classes in about 60 Montgomery County Public Schools and community-based centers.

UpCounty

The UpCounty clinic serves 40 percent of the organization's total caseload since it was opened in 2008 with support from Montgomery County, Shady Grove Adventist Hospital, Adventist Health Care, the State of Maryland, Kaiser Permanente and others. This six-exam room clinic, open five and one-half days per week, provides a full array of primary care services, including behavioral health. For the year ended June 30, 2013, functional expenses relating to the Asian immigrant community clinic sessions that are held at this site are included in the "UpCounty" category.

Note 2 Expenditures

Of the total costs (including in-kind expenses) incurred for the year ended June 30, 2013 and 2012, the Organization incurred 94.34% and 93.36% for program services, 3.69% and 4.54% for management and general operations, and 1.97% and 2.10% for fundraising, respectively.

Note 3 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The Organization maintains its records on the accrual basis of accounting.

Accounts Receivable

Receivables are stated at amounts estimated by management to be the net realizable value. The Organization charges off accounts receivable when it becomes apparent based upon age or customer circumstances that amounts will not be collected.

Property and Equipment

Property and equipment are recorded at cost. Fixed assets donated to the Organization are recorded at fair value at the date of donation. The cost of maintenance and repairs is recorded as an expense when incurred. The Organization capitalizes major acquisitions with a cost of \$500 or greater and useful life of greater than one year. The Organization also capitalizes leasehold improvements that add to the life and value of the real property. Depreciation and amortization are calculated using the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the assets as follows:

Revenue Recognition

Revenue from grants and contracts is recognized as related qualifying expenses are incurred. Revenue is deferred when funds are received but not yet expended for the restricted purpose.

Contributions are recognized as revenue when received or when an unconditional promise to give has been received and sufficient documentation exists. All contributions are considered to be available for unrestricted use unless specifically restricted by the donor. Amounts received that are designated for future periods or restricted by the donor for specific purposes are reported as temporarily restricted or permanently restricted support that increases those net asset classes. When a donor restriction expires, that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or a purpose restriction is accomplished, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported in the statement of activities as net assets released from restrictions. Donor restricted contributions whose restrictions are met in the same reporting period are reported as unrestricted support.

Contributions of land, buildings and equipment are reported as unrestricted support unless explicit donor stipulations specify how the donated assets must be used. Gifts of long-lived assets with explicit restrictions are reported as restricted support. Absent explicit donor stipulations, the Organization reports expirations of donor restrictions when the long-lived assets are placed into service.

Donated Materials and Services

The Organization uses in-kind contributions to support its programs. These donated services, materials and uses of facilities are reported as in-kind contributions on the statement of activities and statement of functional expenses. Total donated medical professional services, other professional services, materials and use of facilities for the years ended June 30, 2013 and 2012 were valued at \$4,711,059 and \$4,523,261, respectively. In addition, over 100 individuals volunteered over 2,500 non-professional hours to perform a variety of tasks that assist the Organization. No amounts have been reflected in the financial statements for these non-professional services. The Organization recognizes contributed services to the extent the services received create or enhance non-financial assets or require specialized skills that would be purchased if not provided by donation.

Charity Care

The Organization provides care to clients who meet certain criteria either without charge or at amounts less than its established rates. Total charity care for the years ended June 30, 2013 and 2012 was \$118,888 and \$132,137, respectively.

Functional Allocation of Expenses

The costs of providing the various programs and other activities have been summarized on a functional basis in the accompanying statements of activities. Accordingly, certain costs have been either directly charged to the programs and supporting services as incurred or allocated based on usage for items such as depreciation and salaries.

Income Taxes

The Organization is exempt from federal income taxes on related income under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and is classified as other than a private foundation. Income determined to be unrelated business income is taxable.

Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make certain estimates and assumptions that affect specific amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Reclassifications

Certain amounts in the prior year financial statements may have been reclassified to conform to the current year presentation.

Subsequent Events

For the year ended June 30, 2013, the organization has evaluated subsequent events for potential recognition and disclosure through January 13, 2014, the date of financial statement issuance.

Note 6 Line of Credit

The Organization maintains a line of credit with a maximum borrowing of \$500,000. Interest is payable monthly at the prime rate with a minimum rate of 4.25%. The line is secured by the Organization's assets. The line of credit is subject to annual review and is payable upon demand. The outstanding balance on the line as of June 30, 2013 and 2012 was \$94,819 and \$299,108, respectively.

Note 7 Net Assets

Board Designated

During fiscal years 2013 and 2012, the Board of Directors designated \$10,000 of cash to be used as a reserve for emergencies.

Note 8 Operating Leases

Note 9 Defined Contribution Plan

The Organization sponsors a defined contribution plan covering substantially all of its employees. To be an eligible participant of the plan, employees must be 21 years of age and complete one month of service. Matching contributions to the plan are at the discretion of the Board of Directors. In addition, employees may make elective deferrals to the plan. During fiscal years 2013 and 2012, the Organization did not make a matching contribution.

Note 10 Concentrations

During 2013, the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act provided unlimited insurance coverage up to at least \$250,000 for the aggregation of deposits in transaction accounts held at Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) insured institutions. At June 30, 2013, the Organization exceeded insured levels by \$79,934.

During 2012, the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act provided unlimited insurance coverage on non-interest bearing accounts regardless of balance of all Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) insured institutions. The FDIC insures interest bearing accounts up to \$250,000 at each insured institution. At June 30, 2012, the Organization did not exceed the insured level in their interest bearing accounts.

The Organization receives a substantial portion of revenue excluding donated services, from local governments. During fiscal years 2013 and 2012, the Organization received approximately 42% and 48%, respectively, of its revenue from the Montgomery County Government.
