### INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

To the Board of Directors Oregon Tech Foundation

#### NOTE 1 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

**Purpose of Foundation** – The Oregon Tech Foundation (Foundation) is an Oregon nonprofit corporation chartered December 30, 1969. It secured exemption from federal income tax in accordance with Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3) and is classified as an organization other than a private foundation by letter dated October 10, 1992. Contributions to the Foundation are tax deductible as a charitable contribution under the Internal Revenue Code.

The purpose of the Foundation is to promote the educational, cultural, charitable, and service functions of the Oregon Institute of Technology. Funding for the Foundation's activities is primarily provided by public and corporate donations. Most expenses of the Foundation are paid directly by the Oregon Institute of Technology and then reimbursed through the Foundation. These expenses are categorized in the statement of activities and the supplemental schedule of management and general expenses.

The Foundation's Board of Directors consisted of 19 individuals during the 2012-2013 fiscal year. The Vice President of Development & Alumni Relations managed the day-to-day administration of the Foundation until April 2013. It has since been managed by an interim executive director.

Basis of Presentation – The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Net assets and revenues, gains, and losses are classified based on the existence or absence of donor-imposed restrictions. Accordingly, net assets of the Foundation and changes therein are classified and reported as follows:

- *Unrestricted* Support received that is not subject to donor-imposed restrictions and over which the Board of Directors has discretionary control is classified as unrestricted.
- Temporarily Restricted Support received subject to donor-imposed use restrictions or time
  restrictions that will be met either through actions of the Foundation or by the passage of
  time is classified as temporarily restricted. In the period donor restrictions are met,
  temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported in the
  statement of activities as net assets released from restrictions.
- Permanently Restricted Support received subject to donor-imposed restrictions stipulating
  that funds be invested in perpetuity is classified as permanently restricted. In accordance
  with purposes stipulated by donors, earnings from such funds may be either unrestricted or
  temporarily restricted.

#### NOTE 1 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (cont.)

#### **Basis of Presentation (Continued)**

Cash and Cash Equivalents – All highly liquid investments with an original maturity of three months or less at acquisition are considered to be cash and cash equivalents unless subject to donor-imposed restrictions that limits their use to long-term purposes such as endowments.

Accounts receivable – Accounts receivable are recorded at the amount management expects to collect. Management believes that all outstanding accounts receivable are collectible in full; therefore, no allowance for uncollectible receivables has been provided. Accounts receivable consist of an anticipated amount from lottery funds to reimburse the Alumni-Student Awards dinner.

Investments – Investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities are reported at their fair value. The alternative investments, which are not readily marketable, are carried at estimated fair values as provided by the investment managers. The Foundation reviews and evaluates the values provided by the investment managers and agrees with the valuation methods and assumptions used in determining the fair value of the alternative investments. Changes in unrealized gains and losses are reported in the accompanying statement of activities and changes in net assets.

Investment in privately held stock is accounted for under the cost method. Under this method, investments are carried at the lower of cost or market and are reviewed annually for impairment. A decline in the fair value of any available-for-sale security below cost that is deemed to be other-than-temporary results in an impairment reducing the carrying amount to fair value. The impairment is charged to earnings and a new cost basis for the security is established. For the year ended June 30, 2013, no impairment was recorded. For the year ended June 30, 2012, impairment was recorded as described in Note 5.

Investment in a limited partnership is accounted for under the cost method. Under this method, investments are carried at the lower of cost or market and are reviewed annually for impairment. Dividends received are recognized as income when received. For the years ended June 30, 2013 and 2012, no impairment was recorded.

#### NOTE 1 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (cont.)

Property and Equipment – It is the Foundation's policy to capitalize property and equipment with an original cost or value when donated of over \$1,000 with lesser amounts being expensed. Depreciation is computed on the straight-line method for all capitalized assets over the estimated useful service life of the various classes of property and equipment. Upon retirement or disposal of property and equipment, the costs and related accumulated depreciation amounts are eliminated, and any gain or loss is included in the Statement of Activities and Changes in Net Assets.

Collections – The Foundation capitalizes collection items displayed and used in the fulfillment of its purposes. Collection items are recorded at cost if purchased and at fair value at date of accession if donated. The Foundation does not depreciate collection items that are protected, kept unencumbered, cared for, and preserved.

Unconditional Promises to Give – Contributions are recognized when the donor makes a promise to give to the Foundation that is, in substance, unconditional. Contributions that are restricted by the donor are reported as increases in unrestricted net assets if the restrictions expire in the fiscal year in which the contributions are recognized. All other donor-restricted contributions are reported as increases in temporarily or permanently restricted net assets depending on the nature of the restrictions. When a restriction expires, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets. Promises to give expected to be collected in future years are recorded at the present value of estimated future cash flows using a discount rate of 0.20% and 0.42% as of June 30, 2013 and 2012, respectively.

The Foundation uses the allowance method to determine uncollectible unconditional promises receivable. The allowance is based on prior years' experience and management's analysis of specific promises to give. As of June 30, 2013 and 2012, the allowance was \$14,800 and \$10,363, respectively.

**Donated Services** – The Foundation receives donated services from a variety of unpaid volunteers assisting the Foundation in its program services. No amounts have been recognized in the accompanying statement of activities because the criteria for recognition of such volunteer efforts have not been satisfied. In addition, the Foundation receives services and facility use from Oregon Institute of Technology. No amounts have been estimated for these services.

#### **NOTE 1 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (cont.)**

In-Kind Contributions and Expenses – The Foundation received donated items which have been recorded at their estimated fair value. Total in-kind donations for the years ending June 30, 2013 and 2012, are \$45,783 and \$116,354, respectively.

Grants and Contributions – The Foundation receives some contributions as grants from private companies and non-profit organizations. These contributions have reporting requirements that the Foundation must comply with. These grants have been reported with contributions revenue.

Income Taxes – The Foundation is a not-for-profit organization which is exempt from income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The Foundation is required to pay income taxes on its unrelated business income received from a partnership interest and affinity program royalties. The Foundation accounts for income taxes under the asset and liability method. Under this method, deferred income taxes are established for the differences between the financial reporting and income tax basis of assets and liabilities as well as operating loss and tax credit carry-forwards. Deferred tax assets are reduced by a valuation allowance when, in the opinion of management, it is more likely than not that some portion of the deferred tax assets will not be realized. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are measured using enacted tax rates expected to apply to taxable income in the years in which those temporary differences are expected to be recovered or settled. The effect on deferred tax assets and liabilities in tax rates is recognized in income in the period that includes the enactment date.

Use of Estimates – Preparation of the financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect amounts reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimated. Significant estimates include allowance for uncollectible promises to give, fair value of alternative investments and other investments, actuarial assumptions used to compute annuity and life income obligations and estimated bequests.

**Reclassifications** – Certain accounts in the prior year financial statements have been reclassified to conform to the presentation of the current year financial statements. These reclassifications have no effect on previously reported changes in net assets.

At June 30, 2013, the Foundation had approximately \$3,567,277 in investments with underlying investments that are not readily marketable. These investments are in liability corporations, off-shore investment funds, partnerships and privately held stock. Such investments represent approximately 19.9% of the total investments and approximately 17.6% of net assets at June 30, 2013. These investments may contain elements of both credit and market risk. Such risks include, but are not limited to, limited liquidity, absence of regulatory oversight, dependence on key individuals, emphasis on speculative investments,

and nondisclosure of full portfolio composition. Because these investments are not readily marketable, their estimated values are subject to uncertainty and, therefore, may differ from the value that would have been used had a ready market for such investments existed. Such differences could be significant.

Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities could occur in the near term and such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the Statement of Financial Position.

## NOTE 3 – FAIR VALUE OF FINANCIAL ASSETS AND FINANCIAL LIABILITIES

FASB ASC 820 establishes a hierarchy that prioritizes fair value measurements based on the types of inputs used for the various valuation techniques (market approach, income approach and cost approach). The levels of hierarchy are described below:

- Level 1: consists of financial instruments whose value is based on quoted market prices for identical financial instruments in an active market
- Level 2: consists of financial instruments that are valued using models or other valuation methodologies. These models use inputs that are observable either directly or indirectly; Level 2 inputs include (i) quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets, (ii) quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in markets that are not active, (iii) pricing models whose inputs are observable for substantially the full term of the financial instrument and (iv) pricing models whose inputs are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data through correlation or other means for substantially the full term of the financial instrument

## NOTE 3 – FAIR VALUE OF FINANCIAL ASSETS AND FINANCIAL LIABILITIES (continued)

• Level 3: consists of financial instruments whose values are determined using pricing models that utilize significant inputs that are primarily unobservable, discounted cash flow methodologies, or similar techniques, as well as instruments for which the determination of fair value requires significant management judgment or estimation

Our assessment of the significance of a particular input to the fair value measurement requires judgment and may affect the valuation of financial instruments and their classification within the fair value hierarchy. As required by FASB ASC 820, financial instruments are classified in their entirety based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

The fair market value of a split-interest agreement was transferred from a Level 3 measurement to Level 1 at June 30, 2013 after the terms of the trust agreement were evaluated and the current practice among other similar nonprofit entities was considered.

- Cash, cash equivalents, short-term unconditional promises to give, and notes payable: The carrying amounts reported in the statement of financial position approximate fair values because of the short maturities of those instruments.
- <u>Short-term and permanent investments</u>: The fair values of investments are based on quoted market prices for those or similar investments.
- Long-term unconditional promises to give: The fair value of promises to give that are due
  in more than one year is estimated by discounting expected future cash flows using a rate
  of return based on the yield of average daily treasury curve rates at June 30 of each year.

Management relies on third party fair value measurement valuation, including those for Level 3 recurring and nonrecurring measurements. The Foundation's Board of Directors, finance committee and management assesses and evaluates the reasonableness of the fair value measurements and at least annually, management determines if the current valuation techniques used in fair value measurements are still appropriate.

#### **NOTE 4 – ALTERNATIVE INVESTMENTS**

Alternative investments include limited liability corporations and off-shore investment funds. Included in investments of the limited liability corporations are investments in private funds that are invested in financial instruments including, among others, forward and future contracts, interest rate and currency swap agreements, written options and structured notes and stripped securities. These financial instruments, which involve varying degrees of off-balance-sheet risk, may result in loss due to changes in the market. The Foundation holds less than 1% of the stock noted above. For the years ended June 30, 2013 and 2012, the Foundation evaluated the stock for impairment. Evidence considered in this assessment includes the reason for impairment, the severity and duration of the impairment, market conditions, changes in value subsequent to year end, forecasted performance of the investee, and the general market condition in the geographic area or industry the investee operates in. For the year ended June 30, 2013, no impairment was recorded. The Foundation deemed the privately held stock to be impaired as of June 30, 2012 and recorded a write-down of \$953,149.

#### NOTE 6 - INVESTMENT IN PARTNERSHIP

The Foundation owns approximately 10% of a partnership which was a contributed asset. It is recorded at \$1,816,500, the fair market value at the time of the gift. For the years ended June 30, 2013 and 2012 the investment is recorded at the lower of cost or market.

#### NOTE 7 – ENDOWMENT AND OUASI-ENDOWMENT FUNDS

The Foundation's endowment pool includes contributed funds to be maintained in perpetuity, donor-restricted funds contributed for a specific purpose or term, and funds designated by the Board to function as endowments. As required by generally accepted accounting principles, net assets associated with endowment funds, including funds designated by the Board to function as endowments, are classified and reported based on the existence or absence of donor-imposed restrictions.

#### Board Interpretation of Relevant Law

The Board of Directors of the Foundation has interpreted the Uniform Prudent Management of Institutional Funds Act (UPMIFA) as requiring the preservation of the fair value of the original gift as of the gift date of the donor-restricted endowment funds absent explicit donor stipulations to the contrary. As a result of this interpretation, the Foundation classifies as Permanently Restricted net assets (a) the original value of gifts donated to the permanent endowment, (b) the original value of subsequent gifts to the permanent endowment, and (c) accumulations to the permanent endowment made in accordance with the direction of the applicable donor gift instrument at the time the accumulation is added to the fund. The remaining portion of the donor-restricted endowment fund that is not classified in Permanently Restricted net assets is classified as Temporarily Restricted net assets until those amounts are appropriated for expenditure by the Foundation in a manner consistent with the standard of prudence prescribed by UPMIFA. In accordance with UPMIFA, the Foundation considers the following factors in making a determination to appropriate or accumulate donor-restricted endowment funds:

- a. The duration and preservation of the fund
- b. The purposes of the Foundation and the donor-restricted endowment fund
- c. General economic conditions
- d. The possible effect of inflation and deflation
- e. The expected total return from income and the appreciation of investments
- f. Other resources of the Foundation
- g. The investment policies of the Foundation

Split-Interest Agreement funds are held in separate accounts and are maintained by independent trustees and do not operate under the return objectives and risk parameters or the strategies employed for achieving endowment objectives and therefore, are not included in the changes in the following tables.

#### **Funds with Deficiencies**

From time to time, the fair value of assets associated with individual donor-restricted endowment funds may fall below the level that the donor or UPMIFA requires the Foundation to retain as a fund of perpetual duration. In accordance with FASB ASC, deficiencies of this nature are reported in unrestricted net assets. These deficiencies resulted from unfavorable market fluctuations that occurred after the investment of permanently restricted contributions and continued appropriation for certain programs that was deemed prudent by the finance committee of the Foundation.

#### **NOTE 8 – SPLIT-INTEREST AGREEMENTS**

The Foundation has entered into charitable remainder unitrust (CRUT) agreements whereby assets are made available on the condition that income is paid periodically to designated individuals. The unitrusts provide a lifetime benefit for the beneficiaries. Upon the death of the beneficiaries, all remaining assets of the trust pass to the Foundation to be added to specified scholarship funds. The agreements each provide a required annual distribution percentage which is based on the trust value as of the first day of the trust year. Remainder trust obligations are an actuarially determined liability recorded by the Foundation which represents the present value of estimated future payments to beneficiaries, discounted at applicable interest rates.

The Foundation has entered into charitable gift annuity (CGA) agreements whereby donors contribute assets in exchange for the Foundation's promise to pay a fixed amount to donor-determined beneficiaries for their life, with the remaining assets reverting to the Foundation upon

the death of the beneficiaries to be used to support the charitable purposes of the Foundation. The difference between the amounts received and the present value of future annuity payments is recorded as a contribution. The liability for the present value of the future annuity payments is determined annually based on the ages and life expectancies of the donors as of the statement of financial position date, discounted at applicable interest rates.

Charitable gift annuity contributions included in the contribution revenue for the year ended June 30, 2013 and 2012 were \$9,652 and \$10,472 respectively.

#### NOTE 14 – LINE OF CREDIT AND TERM LOAN

As of June 30, 2013 and 2012, the Foundation had one unsecured line of credit. The line of credit matures May 1, 2014. The loan carries a variable interest rate based on the prime rate and a minimum stated rate of 5.00%. This resulted in a rate of 5.00% at June 30, 2013 and 2012. Interest is due quarterly. #### **NOTE 16 – PROVISION FOR INCOME TAXES**

For the years ended June 30, 2013 and 2012, the income tax expense was \$150 and \$150, respectively. For June 30, 2013 and 2012, the income tax expense consisted entirely of Oregon tax where \$150 is the minimum tax. The Foundation's federal tax rate effective for 2013 would range from 15% to 38% of taxable income. The Foundation's Oregon tax rates are 6.6% of Oregon taxable income of \$250,000 or less plus 7.6% of the Oregon taxable income over \$250,000 with a minimum of \$150.

As of June 30, 2013 and 2012, the Foundation had available net operating loss carryforwards of approximately \$3,081,536 and \$2,782,932, respectively, for income tax reporting. The net operating loss carryforwards give rise to a deferred tax asset of \$1,170,983 and \$1,057,514, which are reduced by valuation allowances of \$1,170,983 and \$1,057,514 as of June 30, 2013 and 2012, respectively. The net operating losses will expire in various years from June 30, 2017 through June 30, 2032.

#### **NOTE 18 – LEASES**

The Foundation is obligated under operating leases covering equipment, which expire on various dates through 2013. The operating lease expense includes both lease payments and the related property tax payments. Future minimum non-cancelable operating lease payments for equipment are fully reimbursed from Oregon Institute of Technology.

As of July 1, 2010, the Foundation entered into an agreement with the Oregon Institute of Technology for reimbursement of the operating lease expense. For the years ended June 30, 2013 and 2012, non-cancelable operating lease expense was \$371,693 and \$617,231, respectively, with the entire amounts being reimbursed under the agreement. Thus, for the years ended June 30, 2013 and 2012, the net operating lease expense was zero.

#### NOTE 19 – CONCENTRATIONS OF CREDIT RISK

The Foundation maintains cash balances at one financial institution. The total of these accounts is insured up to \$250,000 by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation. For the fiscal years ended June 30, 2013 and 2012, the Foundation was under insured at various times during the year and at year end.

The Foundation also invests funds in professional managed mutual funds that contain various types of marketable securities. Such investments are exposed to various risks, such as fluctuations in market value and credit risk. Thus, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the near term could materially affect investment balances and the amounts reported in the financial statements.

To minimize risk, the Foundation's cash accounts are placed with high credit quality financial institutions and the Foundation's investment portfolio is diversified among a variety of asset categories, which are held by several investment managers. The Foundation regularly evaluates its depository arrangements and investment strategies.

#### **NOTE 20 – RELATED PARTY**

Oregon Institute of Technology (Oregon Tech) is a related party of the Foundation. The Foundation provides direct support to Oregon Tech for various program expenses. During 2013 and 2012, the Foundation provided program expense support to Oregon Tech of \$376,053 and \$15,620, respectively.

#### NOTE 20 - RELATED PARTY (continued)

The Foundation reimburses Oregon Tech for salaries of certain Foundation employees and other operating costs. The amount payable or "due to university", totaled \$144,347 and \$80,677 for the years ended June 30, 2013 and 2012, respectively.

As discussed in Note 18, the Foundation has a reimbursement agreement with Oregon Tech for operating lease expenses which became effective July 1, 2010. During 2013, the Foundation recorded \$371,693 in operating lease expense reimbursements. The amount receivable or "due from university" of this reimbursement, totaled \$0 for the year ended June 30, 2013.

#### **NOTE 21 – PRIOR PERIOD ADJUSTMENTS**

During 2013, it was found that a collection had been received in 2009 in the amount of \$49,825 that had not remained on the books of the Foundation. It had been properly reported as an in-kind donation in revenues during 2009. It had also been incorrectly reported as funds disbursed to Oregon Tech in the same amount. The Shaw Historical Library has a collection development agreement with the Foundation that specifically states that a collection received will remain titled with the Foundation as an asset of the Shaw Historical Library and the Foundation.


For the fiscal year ended June 30, 2009, Fund Disbursements were overstated by \$49,825 and Other assets – collections was understated by \$49,825. For the fiscal years ended June 30, 2010, 2011 and 2012, Other assets – collections were understated by \$49,825 and Net Assets, Temporarily Restricted were understated by \$49,825.

In addition, amounts have been reclassified to properly reflect the amount of Permanently Restricted Net Assets, Temporarily Restricted Net Assets and Unrestricted Net Assets at June 30, 2013. This has resulted in a decrease to Permanently Restricted Net Assets of \$143,241, an increase to Temporarily Restricted Assets of \$285,439 and a decrease to Unrestricted Net Assets of \$142,197. Net assets in total do not change as a result of this adjustment.

#### **NOTE 22 – SUBSEQUENT EVENTS**

The Foundation has evaluated subsequent events for disclosure and recognition through September 20, 2013, the date on which these financial statements were available to be issued.

On September 13, 2013 the foundation was notified that a previous gift of a life insurance policy was given back to the donor. During the year the Board agreed to give this gift back to the donor if certain conditions were met. Those conditions had been met. The cash value of this life insurance policy included in the Statement of Financial Position at June 30, 2013 was \$276,542.
