#### Report on the Financial Statements

### ATTORNEY GENERAL'S SEXUAL ASSAULT TASK FORCE NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

For the Year Ended June 30, 2013

#### 1. ORGANIZATION

Attorney General's Sexual Assault Task Force (Task Force) began as an advisory group to former Oregon Attorney General Hardy Myers. He initiated the Task Force in 1999 at the request of advocates and other responders from all regions in Oregon who believed there was a need for significant improvement in response and prevention efforts relating to sexual assault. The Task Force became a non-profit corporation in 2003 and is exempt from federal income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The Task Force continues to work closely with the Oregon Department of Justice and other state and federal agencies. During the year ended June 30, 2013 the Task Force received 36% of total income from the Oregon Department of Justice, 40% from Oregon Health and Human Services and 24% direct from the Federal Department of Justice. The revenue includes federal and state funds.

The mission of the Task Force is to facilitate and support a collaborative and victim-centered approach to the prevention and response to adolescent and adult sexual assault.

Major program areas of the Task Force include the Sexual Assault Training Institute, the Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner Program, the Prevention Program, and policy and legislative efforts.

#### 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### **BASIS OF ACCOUNTING**

The accounting records are maintained on the accrual basis of accounting. Revenues are recognized when earned and expenses are recognized when incurred.

#### **CASH AND CASH EQUIVALENTS**

Cash and cash equivalents consist of cash on hand, cash in checking accounts, and cash in money market accounts and financial instruments with maturity of ninety days or less from the date of purchase.

#### VACATION PAY

Vacation pay is recorded as an expense when earned.

#### **INCOME TAXES**

The Task Force, which is not a private foundation, is exempt from income taxes under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. It is management's opinion that none of the Task Force's present activities are subject to unrelated business income taxes. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been recorded in the accompanying financial statements.

#### ATTORNEY GENERAL'S SEXUAL ASSAULT TASK FORCE NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS For the Year Ended June 30, 2013

#### **USE OF ESTIMATES**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual amounts could differ from those estimates.

#### **NET ASSETS**

The Task Force classifies net assets into three categories: unrestricted, temporarily restricted and permanently restricted. Net assets is considered available for unrestricted use unless specifically restricted by the donor or by law. There was no temporary or permanently restricted net assets as of June 30, 2013.

Grants made in the form of expense reimbursements are recognized when the covered expense is incurred and reported as unrestricted net assets.

#### 3. PROPERTY AND EQUIPMENT

Purchased property and equipment are stated at cost. Donated assets are recorded at their fair market value at the date of donation. Small equipment purchases under \$1,000 are expensed. Depreciation is provided by use of the straight-line method for financial reporting purposes over the estimated useful lives of the related assets ranging from three to five years. For income tax purposes, depreciation is computed using the modified accelerated cost recovery system. Expenditures for major improvements and betterments that extend the useful lives of property and equipment are capitalized. Expenditures for maintenance and repairs are charged to expense as incurred.

#### 4. RECEIVABLES

All grant funds receivable at June 30, 2013 are current and considered collectible. Therefore, there is no allowance for bad debts accrued at June 30, 2013.

#### 5. OPERATING LEASE

The Task Force has entered into a lease for office space with an expiration date of June 30, 2014. Monthly payments were \$1,593 through June 30, 2013. Lease expense for the year ended June 30, 2013 was \$19,117.

#### 6. RETIREMENT PLAN

The Task Force has initiated a SIMPLE IRA retirement plan. The plan covers all employees who have met the minimum service and hour requirements during the year. Employees have the option to have a portion of their salaries withheld and contributed to the plan. Annual employer contributions match the lesser of 3% of employee compensation, or the employee contribution. Employer contributions for the year ended June 30, 2013 was \$2,210.

#### 7. CONTINGENT LIABILITY

Certain grantors may conduct audits of the expenditures of funds under contracts to determine allowability under applicable regulations and contract provisions. In the event unallowable expenditures have been made, a liability for repayment of those funds could exist. The amount, if any, of expenditures which may be disallowed by the grantor cannot be determined at this time although the Task Force expect such amounts, if any, to be immaterial.

#### 8. CONCENTRATION OF RISK

The Task Force operates in the State of Oregon. The Task Force receives a majority of its funding through the State of Oregon. If this revenue were discontinued it could have a significant adverse effect on the Task Force.

#### 9. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

The Task Force follows the provisions of Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 165, "Subsequent Events" (ASC 855). ASC 855 established new accounting and disclosure requirements for subsequent events. Management has evaluated subsequent events through January 13, 2014, the date on which the financial statements were issued. Management is not aware of any subsequent events that require recognition or disclosure in the financial statements.

In planning and performing our audit of compliance, we considered the Attorney General's Sexual Assault Task Force's internal control over compliance with the types of requirements that could have a direct and material effect on major federal program to determine the auditing procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances for the purpose of expressing an opinion on compliance for the major federal program and to test and report on internal control over compliance in accordance with OMB Circular A-133, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of internal control over compliance. However, we identified certain deficiencies in internal control over compliance, as described in the accompanying schedule of findings and questioned costs as items 2013-1 and 2013-2 that we consider to be significant deficiencies.

The Attorney General's Sexual Assault Task Force's responses to the internal control over compliance findings identified in our audit are described in the accompanying schedule of findings and questioned costs. The Attorney General's Sexual Assault Task Force's responses were not subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of compliance and, accordingly, we express no opinion on the responses.

The purpose of this report on internal control over compliance is solely to describe the scope of our testing of internal control over compliance and the results of that testing based on the requirements of OMB Circular A-133. Accordingly, this report is not suitable for any other purpose.

#### Note 1. General

The accompanying schedule of expenditures of federal awards presents the activity of all federal financial assistance programs of the Attorney General's Sexual Assault Task Force.

#### Note 2. Significant Accounting Policies

Reporting Entity: The reporting entity is fully described in Note 1 to the financial statements. The schedule includes all federal financial assistance programs administered by the Attorney General's Sexual Assault Task Force for the year ended June 30, 2013.

Basis of Presentation: The information in the Schedule is presented in accordance with OMB Circular A-133.

Federal Financial Assistance: Pursuant to the Single Audit Act and OMB Circular A-133, federal financial assistance is defined as assistance provided by a federal agency, either directly or indirectly, in the form of grants, contracts, cooperative agreements, loans, loan guarantees, property, interest subsidies, insurance or direct appropriations. Accordingly, nonmonetary federal assistance, including federal surplus property, is included in federal financial assistance and, therefore, is reported on the Schedule, if applicable. Federal financial assistance does not include direct federal cash assistance to individuals. Solicited contracts between the state and federal government for which the federal government procures tangible goods or services are not considered to be federal financial assistance.

Major Programs: The Single Audit Act and OMB Circular A-133 establish criteria to be used in defining major federal financial assistance programs. Major programs for the Attorney General's Sexual Assault Task Force are those programs selected for testing by the auditor using a risk-assessment model, as well as certain minimum expenditure requirements, as outlined in A-133. Programs with similar requirements may be grouped into a cluster for testing purposes.

Revenue Recognition: The receipt and expenditure of federal awards are accounted for under the modified accrual method of accounting. Revenues are recorded as received in cash or when measurable and available. Expenses are recorded when the liability is incurred.

Payments to Subrecipients: Amounts paid to subrecipients by the Attorney General's Sexual Assault Task Force from federal funds totaled \$254,034 for the year ended June 30, 2013.

<u>Federal Agency:</u> Department of Health and Human Services <u>Grant period:</u> Year ending June 30, 2013 and June 30, 2012

<u>Condition</u>: It was noted during testing that the Attorney General's Sexual Assault Task Force does not have adequate insurance coverage as required as part of the contract agreement.

<u>Criteria</u>: The contract agreement requires that recipients obtain insurance prior to performing work under the contract and shall maintain it in full force and at its own expense throughout the duration of the contract. The contract agreement specifies the type of insurance coverage and the minimum amounts required. These insurance requirements increase annually.

<u>Effect</u>: The Attorney General's Sexual Assault Task Force is out of compliance with the insurance requirements specified in the contract agreement.

<u>Cause</u>: The General's Sexual Assault Task Force has insurance coverage, but has not implemented a strategy for tracking the annual increase and ensuring that their coverage continues to meet the minimum threshold.

<u>Recommendation</u>: We recommend that the General's Sexual Assault Task Force develop a procedure that will allow them to track the coverage increases and obtain the minimum amounts of insurance that are required in the contract agreement.

<u>Current Status</u>: This finding was first reported in 2012, in attempts to remedy the finding, the SATF requested that the Department of Health and Human Services waive the insurance requirement due to the extremely high minimum coverage threshold. This request was denied and the Task Force increased their insurance during the fiscal year 2013, however this increase was inadequate and their insurance coverage failed to meet the minimum requirements. This finding remains unresolved as of June 30, 2013.

<u>Response:</u> The Task Force will obtain required coverage and implement policies and procedures to ensure such coverage's remain in place.

<u>Condition</u>: It was noted during testing that the Attorney General's Sexual Assault Task Force did not have adequate controls in place to ensure that the reports required by the contract agreement were being submitted, and submitted timely.

<u>Criteria</u>: The contract agreement requires that reports be submitted on or before specific dates throughout the contract period to the granting agencies program manager.

Effect: Required reports were not being submitted or filed timely.

<u>Cause</u>: The General's Sexual Assault Task Force has not developed or implemented procedures and controls around grant reporting.

<u>Recommendation</u>: We recommend that the General's Sexual Assault Task Force develop and implement procedures and controls around grant reporting.

<u>Current Status:</u> This finding was first reported in the fiscal year ending 2012, since then SATF has created a grant reporting calendar to aid the tracking of compliance deadlines and note report submission. However, due to a shift in key personnel during 2013, this reporting calendar was not utilized and one report was not submitted to the Department of Health and Human Services, and two others were submitted after the required deadline. As of June 30, 2013 this finding remains unresolved.

<u>Response:</u> The Task Force will utilize the tracking methodology previously developed coupled with oversight by the Board of Directors, the Task Force will implement procedures to ensure timely filing of all required reports.

<u>Current Status</u>: Closed. The Attorney General's Sexual Assault Task Force has developed a tracking form that allows them to monitor sub-recipients in a more effective manner. During 2012-13 SATF tracked all report submissions, notified sub-recipients of federal award information, and received OMB Circular A-133 reports from sub-recipient's that fell under these reporting requirements.
