




Article 2 of the Articles of Incorporation of the corporation is hereby amended in its entirety to read as follows:

“Respiratory Health Association, the ‘Association,’ is a community based voluntary health organization. The purposes of the Association previously known as the ‘Respiratory Health Association of Metropolitan Chicago,’ ‘American Lung Association of Metropolitan Chicago,’ ‘Chicago Lung Association,’ ‘The Tuberculosis Institute of Chicago and Cook County,’ and ‘The Chicago Tuberculosis Institute’ are:

- (a) To work with the community to promote health and work toward the understanding, prevention, control, elimination and/or eradication of respiratory diseases.
- (b) To assemble, publish and disseminate facts, statistical data and medical nursing knowledge concerning the prevention, treatment and control of respiratory diseases
- (c) To conduct, alone or in cooperation with others, programs designed to detect and treat respiratory diseases.
- (d) To stimulate and assist financially research affecting respiratory diseases.
- (e) To conduct demonstrations designed to illustrate effective methods for the control, prevention and treatment of respiratory diseases.
- (f) To assist in the rehabilitation of persons with respiratory diseases.
- (g) To evaluate programs, projects, incidence and deaths relating to respiratory diseases.
- (h) To cooperate with other agencies, organizations, and societies, official and voluntary, in any of the above programs of work, or any other related project.
- (i) To do all other things as may from time to time be deemed necessary to effectuate the purposes set forth above.”
