LYNETTE S. AND RICHARD D. MERILLAT ARTICLE II - PURPOSES

The Corporation is formed exclusively for charitable, religious, educational and scientific purposes, within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, (or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue Law), including the making of distributions for such purposes to organizations that qualify as exempt under Code Section 501(c)(3). These purposes include the following:

- a) to promote the general advancement of education;
- b) to promote and support religious organizations and other organization and activities that promote Christian values;
- c) to promote and support organizations that instruct or train individuals for the purpose of improving or developing their capabilities;
- d) to promote and support organizations that instruct the public on subjects useful to individuals and beneficial to the community;
- e) to promote and support organizations such as primary or secondary schools, colleges, or universities which have regularly scheduled curricula, a regular faculty and a regularly enrolled body of students in attendance at a place where educational activities are regularly carried on;
- f) to promote Christian values and the ministries of organizations designed to accomplish the above purposes;
- g) to receive and administer funds for the benefit of the Corporation, and to that end to take and hold, by bequest, devise, gift, purchase or lease, either absolutely or in trust, any property, real, personal or mixed, without limitation as to amount or value, except such limitations, if any, as may be imposed by law;
- h) to sell, lease, borrow, encumber, convey and dispose of any such property and to invest and reinvest principal and income thereof and to deal with and expend principal and income therefrom for the purposes set forth in this ARTICLE II without limitation, except such limitations, if any, as may be contained in the instrument under

- which such property is received or such limitations, if any, as may be imposed by law;
- i) to own, use, buy, sell, mortgage or encumber real and personal property as will tend to promote the objects of this Corporation and the doing of all things necessary or incident to the purposes of this Corporation; and
- j) to do such other lawful acts or activities to accomplish its charitable, religious, educational and scientific purposes as contemplated by Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law) and the nonprofit corporation laws of the State of Michigan.

BY-LAWS

OF

RICHARD D. AND LYNETTE S. MERILLAT

ARTICLE I

Purposes

The Corporation has been formed exclusively for charitable, religious, educational and scientific purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue Law). The Corporation promotes the general advancement of education through support to primary and secondary schools, colleges or universities, to organizations that instruct or train individuals for the purpose of improving or developing their capabilities and that instruct the public on subjects useful to individuals. The Corporation also promotes and supports religious organizations, and other organizations and activities that promote Christian values.

ARTICLE II

Offices

Section 1. <u>Principal Office</u>. The principal office of the Corporation shall be at such place in Michigan, as may be designated from time to time by the Board of Trustees.

Section 2. Other Offices. The Corporation shall also have offices at such other places without, as well as within, the State of Michigan, as the Board of Trustees may from time to time determine.

ARTICLE III

Members

The Board of Trustees of the Corporation shall act as the Members of the Corporation.

Meetings of the Board of Trustees shall constitute meetings of the Members.

ARTICLE IV

Board of Trustees

Section 1. Number, Term and Qualification. The Board of Trustees of the Corporation shall consist of no less than three (3) Trustees. The exact number of Trustees shall be the number fixed from time to time by the Board. A Trustee shall be elected for a term of one (1) year and until his or her successor is elected or until his or her earlier resignation, removal or death. The original Trustees of the Corporation since its incorporation have been Richard D. Merillat and Lynette S. Merillat. John Thurman was elected as a Trustee in 2008. Tricia L.M. McGuire is elected as a Trustee as of the date of adoption of these By-Laws. Upon the resignation, incapacity or death of Richard D. Merillat, Lynette S. Merillat or John Thurman, Wendy R. Lyon shall be appointed as a Trustee. Upon the resignation, incapacity or death of Richard D. Merillat, Lynette S. Merillat, John Thurman, or Tricia L.M. McGuire, Collette C. Cook shall be appointed as a Trustee. Once appointed as Trustees, Tricia L.M. McGuire, Wendy R. Lyon, or Collette C. Cook shall continue to hold office until their successors are elected or until their earlier resignation, removal or death, along with Richard D. Merillat, Lynette S. Merillat and John Thurman. If at any time while serving as a Trustee, Tricia L.M. McGuire, Wendy R. Lyon, or Collette C. Cook becomes unable or unwilling to serve as Trustee, she shall not be replaced, provided that the number of Trustees of the Corporation shall always not be less than three (3).

Section 2. <u>Meetings</u>. The annual meeting of the Trustees shall be held in each year on the day designated by the Trustees at the first annual meeting of the Board of Trustees after adoption of these By-Laws. Special meetings may be called at any time by the President.

Section 3. Quorum and Voting. A majority of Trustees shall constitute a quorum for any meeting of the Trustees, and the concurring vote of a majority of those present at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the Board except as a larger vote may be required by the Michigan Nonprofit Corporation Law, the Articles of Incorporation or the By-Laws of the Corporation. In addition to those Trustees who are actually present at a meeting, Trustees shall for purposes of this section be deemed present at such meeting if a conference telephone or similar communications equipment is used by means of which all persons participating in the meeting can hear each other at the same time. If at any meeting there

should be less than a quorum present, those present may adjourn the meeting without further notice, from time to time, until a quorum shall be present. Notice of an adjourned meeting shall be given to the extent practicable to other Trustees who are not present at the time of adjournment. After a quorum has been established at a meeting of the Board, the subsequent withdrawal of Trustees from the meeting so as to reduce the number of Trustees present at any meeting to fewer than the number required for a quorum shall not affect the validity of any action taken by the Board at the meeting or any adjournment thereof.

Section 4. <u>Notice</u>. Unless waived, a written, printed, typewritten or electronically transmitted notice of each annual or special meeting stating the day, hour and place, and the purpose or purposes thereof shall be given to or mailed to each Trustee not more than sixty (60) days nor less than ten (10) days before any such meeting. The Trustees shall be responsible for providing such notice in any manner that they agree to among themselves, including electronic transmission.

Section 5. Written Consents and Waivers of Notice. Any action required or permitted to be taken at any meeting of the Board of Trustees or of any committee thereof may be taken without a meeting, if a written consent to such action is signed by all members of the Board or of such committee, as the case may be, and such written consent is delivered to the Corporation, including delivery by electronic transmission, reproduced and filed with the minutes of proceedings of the Board or committee.

Section 6. <u>Committees</u>. The Board of Trustees may create such Committees as the Trustees may determine, the members of which Committees shall consist of not less than one Trustee. The Trustees may delegate to any such Committee any of the authority of the Trustees. A majority of the members of any such Committee shall constitute a quorum, and the act of a majority of the votes cast at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the Committee.

Section 7. <u>Transactions with Interested Persons</u>. No contract or other transaction is void or voidable because it is between the Corporation and the Trustees or Officers of the Corporation, or between the Corporation and any other person or entity in which one or more of the Corporation's Trustees or Officers are directors, trustees, or officers or have a financial or personal interest, nor because one or more interested Trustees or Officers participate in or vote at the meeting of the Trustees or of a Committee of the Trustees that authorizes the contract or transaction. The common or interested Trustees or Officers

may be counted in determining the presence of a quorum at a meeting of the Trustees or of a Committee of the Trustees that authorizes the contract or transactions.

Section 8. Powers of Trustees. The Board of Trustees shall have charge, control and management of the business, property, personnel, affairs and funds of the Corporation and shall have the power and authority to do and perform all acts and functions permitted for an organization described in Internal Revenue Code §501(c)(3) (or a comparable provision of subsequent legislation) not inconsistent with the Michigan Nonprofit Corporation Law, the Articles of Incorporation and the By-Laws of the Corporation.

Without limiting the generality of the duties of the Board of Trustees as set forth in the preceding paragraph, the Board of Trustees shall:

- (a) maintain corporate surveillance over all the Corporation's activities;
- (b) determine the Corporation's programs and policies and assure that such policies and programs are designed to serve the philosophies, objectives, and purposes of the Corporation;
- (c) approve organization and delegate to the President or his designee the authority to conduct the business of the Corporation and carry out the policies and programs approved by the Board of Trustees.

ARTICLE V

Officers

Section 1. Number, Title and Election. The officers of the Corporation shall consist of a President, a Secretary, a Treasurer, such number of Vice Presidents and other officers and assistant officers as the Board of Trustees shall deem advisable, each of whom shall be elected by the Board at the annual meeting of the Board. Such officers shall hold office for the term of one year, and until their successors are elected and qualified, except in the event of their earlier death, resignation or removal. Except where otherwise specified in these By-Laws, officers of the Corporation are not required to be Trustees and additional officers can be created at any Board meeting.

Section 2. <u>Vacancies</u>. A vacancy in any office because of death, resignation or removal of an officer shall be filled by the Board for the unexpired term of such office.

Section 3. Resignation or Removal of Officers. An officer of the Corporation may resign at any time by tendering his resignation in writing to the President or any member of the Board of the Corporation and such resignation may become effective immediately upon delivery of the written notice. An officer of the Corporation may be removed at any time by a vote of the Trustees at any meeting of the Board. The election of an officer for a term of office shall not be deemed to create contract rights.

Section 4. President. The President shall be the chief executive officer of the Corporation with all the authority of such a position in a business corporation. The President shall have all authority and responsibility necessary to operate the Corporation in all its activities and departments, subject only to such policies as may be issued by the Board. The President shall act as the fully authorized representative of the Board and the Corporation in all matters in which the Board has not formally designated some other person to act. The President shall report as directed to the Board at each meeting. The President shall sign, with the Secretary or any other proper officer of the Corporation authorized by the Board, any deeds, mortgages, bonds, or other instruments which the Board has authority to execute except in cases where signing an execution shall have been expressly delegated by the Board or these By-laws, or by statute, to some other officer or agent of the Corporation.

Section 5. <u>Secretary</u>. The Secretary shall keep or cause to be kept all of the records of the Corporation except the financial records, shall record the minutes of the meetings of the Board, send out all notices of meetings, and perform such other duties as may be prescribed by the Board.

Section 6. <u>Treasurer</u>. The Treasurer shall receive, and be custodian of, all money received and expended. The Treasurer shall present to the Board of Trustees at the regular meetings a report of the financial condition of the Corporation. The Treasurer also shall present any information required at other meetings, with the approval of the President.

ARTICLE VI

Indemnification of Trustees, Officers, Employees and Agents

Each person who at any time is or shall have been a Trustee, officer, employee or agent of the Corporation, or is or shall have been serving at the request of the Corporation as a member, principal, trustee, director, officer, employee or agent of another corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust or other enterprise, and his heirs, executors and administrators, shall be indemnified by the Corporation in accordance with and to the full extent permitted by the Michigan Nonprofit Corporation Law as in effect at the time of the adoption of these By-Laws or as amended from time to time thereafter. The foregoing right of indemnification shall not be deemed exclusive of other rights to which any Trustee, officer, employee, agent or other person may be entitled in any capacity as a matter of law under any By-Laws, agreement, vote of Trustees, or otherwise. If authorized by the Trustees, the Corporation may purchase and maintain insurance against liability on behalf of any such person to the full extent permitted by law in effect at the time of the adoption of these By-Laws or as changed from time to time.

ARTICLE VII

Fiscal Year

The fiscal year of the Corporation shall end on the day fixed from time to time by a majority vote of the Trustees.

ARTICLE VIII

Grant Policy

This Article sets forth the Corporation's policy relating to grants and the Corporation's goals and objectives relating to said grants. This Grant Policy shall remain in effect until modified or rescinded by the unanimous action of Richard D. Merillat and Lynette S. Merillat as Trustees of the Corporation. Pursuant to this Grant Policy, 80% percent of all grants made by the Corporation each fiscal year will be distributed to religious, educational and charitable organizations that promote and support Christian causes and values provided that each recipient organization is then exempt from tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 as amended (or the corresponding provision of any future U.S. Internal Revenue Law) and a public charity under Code Section 509(a).

ARTICLE IX

Conflicts of Interest

Section 1. <u>Disclosure</u>. Each Trustee, Officer, and any employee or agent of the Corporation shall disclose in writing all conflicts of interest with the Corporation. Without limiting the

generality of what may be a conflict of interest, all transactions between the Corporation and any Trustee, Officer, employee or agent of the Corporation or any person or entity in which any Trustee, Officer, employee or agent of the Corporation has a personal or financial interest or a possible or potential personal or financial interest shall be considered conflicts of interest for purposes of this Article.

All persons having conflicts of interest required to be disclosed under this section shall make the required disclosure when the conflict of interest arises, before the transaction in question is consummated, and once each calendar year, so long as the conflict exists. All disclosures shall include a description of the relationship or interest causing the conflict, the role in the transaction played by the person having the conflict of interest, and the benefits and detriments accruing to the Corporation and to the person having the conflict of interest from the transaction.

Conflicts of interest involving a Trustee or any employees or agents of the Corporation shall be reported to the Board of Trustees and recorded in the minutes of the meetings of the Board of Trustees.

Section 2. Benefits to Corporation. Any contract involving a conflict of interest shall be fair and reasonable to the Corporation. The person or persons having the conflict of interest shall at all times act with good faith toward the Corporation. The Corporation shall recover from the person having the conflict of interest and the party to the transaction other than the Corporation any benefit accruing to the person or party from any transaction that has not been consummated and performed in compliance with this section. All contracts involving a conflict of interest shall contain a provision making the contract subject to this section.

Section 3. <u>Approval of Transaction</u>. No person who has a conflict of interest arising out of a transaction may participate in the authorization by the Corporation of the consummation or performance of the transaction, except to make the disclosures required by this Article and, for Trustees only, except to be counted in determining the presence of a quorum at any meeting of the Board of Trustees that authorizes the transaction. Any transaction involving a conflict of interest that is otherwise required to

be approved by the Board of Trustees shall be specifically approved at a meeting held for that purpose and

for other purposes, if any, by the affirmative vote of a majority of the disinterested Trustees. Any interested

Trustees may be counted in determining whether a quorum exists.

Section 4. Compensation. Regardless of any personal or financial interest, the

Trustees may establish reasonable compensation for services rendered to the Corporation by the Trustees

(for non-Trustee services) and by the Officers or delegate the authority to do so to one or more Officers or

Trustees by the unanimous vote of the Trustees. Without limiting what may be considered compensation,

compensation may include reimbursement for out-of-pocket expenses incurred by Trustees and Officers in

performing the duties of their offices and pension, disability or death benefits.

Section 5. <u>Publication</u>. A copy of this Article shall be given to each Trustee, Officer,

employee authorized to enter into contracts on behalf of the Corporation, or agent of the Corporation when

the person first becomes a Trustee, Officer, employee or agent and periodically thereafter when deemed

appropriate by the Trustees.

ARTICLE X

Amendments

Except for the Grant Policy set forth in Article VIII hereof, the Trustees at a meeting held

for such purpose may amend these By-Laws by the affirmative vote of the majority of the Trustees present

at the meeting if a quorum is present. These By-Laws may also be amended by the Trustees acting by

written consent pursuant to Article IV, Section 5.
