

Notes to Financial Statements

Note 1 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The Entity

Agnesian HealthCare Foundation, Inc. (the "Foundation") is a nonstock, nonprofit corporation sponsored by the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Agnes (the "Congregation"). The Foundation receives gifts and bequests, raises funds for specific projects or needs, administers and invests funds, and disburses payments to and for the benefit of Agnesian HealthCare, Inc. at the discretion of its Board of Directors. Operations of the St. Agnes Hospital gift shop are also included in the Foundation's financial statements.

Financial Statement Presentation

The Foundation follows accounting standards contained in the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC). The ASC is the single source of authoritative accounting principles generally accepted in the United States (GAAP) for nongovernmental entities.

Use of Estimates in Preparation of Financial Statements

The preparation of the accompanying financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenue and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

The Foundation considers all highly liquid debt instruments with an original maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents, excluding those held in the Foundation's investment portfolio as short-term investments and amounts whose use is limited or restricted.

Notes to Financial Statements

Note 1 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (Continued)

Investments and Investment Income

Investments are measured at fair value in the statements of financial position.

Investment income or loss (including realized and unrealized gains and losses on investments, interest, and dividends) is included in unrestricted revenue unless the income or loss is restricted by donor or law.

Inventories

Inventories consist of gift shop items and are valued at the lower of cost, determined on the first-in, first-out method, or market.

Net Assets

Net assets and revenue, expenses, gains, and losses are classified based on the existence or absence of donor-imposed restrictions. Accordingly, net assets of the Foundation and changes therein are classified and reported as follows:

- Unrestricted net assets consist of investments and otherwise unrestricted amounts that are available for use in carrying out the mission of the Foundation and include those expendable resources which have been designated for special use by the Foundation's Board of Directors.
- Temporarily restricted net assets are those whose use by the Foundation has been limited by donors to a specific time period or purpose.
- Permanently restricted net assets have been restricted by donors to be maintained by the Foundation in perpetuity.

Generally, the donors of these assets permit the Foundation to use all or part of the income earned on any related investments for general or specific purposes.

Contributions

Contributions are considered to be available for unrestricted use unless specifically restricted by the donor.

Unconditional promises to give cash and other assets are reported at fair value at the date the promise is received. Conditional promises to give and indications of intentions to give are reported at fair value at the date the gift is received. The gifts are reported as either temporarily or permanently restricted support if they are received with donor stipulations that limit the use of the donated assets. When a donor restriction expires, that is when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified as unrestricted net assets and reported in the statements of activities as net assets released from restrictions.

The Foundation considers all unconditional promises to give to be fully collectible; accordingly, no allowance for uncollectible promises to give has been provided. If amounts become uncollectible, they are charged to operations in the period in which that determination is made. All unconditional promises to give are receivable within one year; accordingly, no present value discount is necessary.

Fair Value Measurements

The Foundation measures fair value of its financial instruments using a three-tier hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs used in measuring fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

- Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Foundation has the ability to access.

Fair Value Measurements (Continued)

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets.
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets.
- Inputs, other than quoted prices, that are observable for the asset or liability.
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement. The Foundation does not have any financial instruments valued using Level 3 inputs.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Donated Services

The Foundation receives donated management and other general services from St. Agnes Hospital. The value of such services is reflected in the accompanying statements of activities at approximate cost.

Income Taxes

The Foundation is a tax-exempt corporation as described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (the "Code") and is exempt from federal income taxes on related income pursuant to Section 501(a) of the Code. The Foundation is also exempt from state income taxes on related income.

In order to account for any uncertain tax positions, ASC Topic 740, *Income Taxes*, requires an organization to assess whether it is more likely than not that a tax position will be sustained upon examination of the technical merits of the position, assuming the taxing authority has full knowledge of all information. If the tax position does not meet the more-likely-than-not recognition threshold, the benefit of the tax position is not recognized in the financial statements.

The Foundation recorded no assets or liabilities for uncertain tax positions or unrecognized tax benefits. Federal returns for the years ended 2010 and beyond remain subject to examination by the Internal Revenue Service.

Functional Allocation of Expenses

Expenses incurred for operations have been summarized on a functional basis in the accompanying statements of activities.

Subsequent Events

Subsequent events have been evaluated through September 16, 2013, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 5 Endowments

The Board of Directors of the Foundation has interpreted the Uniform Prudent Management of Institutional Funds Act (UPMIFA), as adopted by the Wisconsin state legislature, as requiring the Foundation to preserve the fair value of the donor's original gift, as of the date of the gift, absent explicit donor stipulations to the contrary. As a result of this interpretation, the Foundation classifies as permanently restricted net assets (a) the original value of the donor's gifts to the permanent endowment, (b) the original value of a donor's subsequent gifts to the permanent restricted endowment, and (c) accumulations to the permanent endowment made in accordance with the direction of the applicable donor gift instrument at the time the accumulation is added to the fund. The remaining portion of the donor-restricted endowment fund that is not classified in permanently restricted net assets is classified as temporarily restricted net assets until those amounts are appropriated for expenditure by the Foundation in a manner consistent with the standard of prudence prescribed by UPMIFA.

Note 5 Endowments (Continued)

The Foundation has adopted investment and spending policies for endowment assets that attempt to provide a predictable stream of funding to programs supported by its endowment while seeking to preserve the purchasing power of the endowment assets. Under the Foundation's investment policy, as approved by the Board of Directors, the endowment assets are invested in a manner that is intended to produce results that exceed the performance of the S&P 500 Stock Index while assuming a moderate level of investment risk. The Foundation expects its endowment funds, in a time period of no less than five years or greater than ten years, to provide an investment rate of return between 7% and 8%.

To achieve its investment goals, the Foundation targets an asset allocation that will achieve a balanced return of current income and long-term growth of principal while exercising risk control. The Foundation's asset allocations include a blend of equity and debt securities and cash equivalents.

Interest and dividend earnings on donor restricted endowment funds are classified as temporarily restricted net assets. Interest and dividends on donor restricted endowment funds are appropriated for distribution at the discretion of the Board of Directors.

Note 6 Fair Value Measurements

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value.

- Cash equivalents consist primarily of money market funds which are valued using a net asset value (NAV) of \$1.
- Corporate debt securities are valued using quotes from pricing vendors based on recent trading activity and other observable market data.
- Mutual funds are valued at quoted market prices, which represent the NAV of shares held by the Foundation at year-end.
- Quoted market prices are used to determine the fair value of investments in publicly traded common stocks and equity securities.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Foundation believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 7 Related-Party Transactions

The Foundation had grants payable to St. Agnes Hospital, which is operated by Agnesian HealthCare, Inc., totaling \$675,639 and \$822,450 at June 30, 2013 and 2012, respectively.

The Foundation received donated management and general services of \$270,474 and \$277,283 from St. Agnes Hospital in 2013 and 2012, respectively. These amounts are reflected in the accompanying statements of activities as contributions and management and general expenses.

In addition, the Foundation received donated use of facilities from St. Agnes Hospital. The value of the use of facilities was not material and has not been recorded in the accompanying financial statements.

Note 8 Concentration of Credit Risk

The Foundation maintains depository relationships with area financial institutions insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC). Depository accounts at these institutions are FDIC-insured up to \$250,000. At June 30, 2013, the Foundation exceeded the insured FDIC limits by approximately \$1,550,000. In addition, other investments held by financial institutions are uninsured.
