1. Opening Remarks by Miner Alumni Association President:

A. Introduction of Katie Jackson, new Assistant Director.

B. Recognition of Past Presidents in Attendance - Darlene Ramsay, Bob Bay, Matt Coco, Zeb Nash, and Susan Rothschild.

2. Remarks by Chancellor Cheryl Schrader

Chancellor Schrader presented six themes for our university:

- (1) Develop and inspire creative thinkers and leaders
- (2) Integrate teaching, learning, research, and application
- (3) Enhance reputation and raise visibility
- (4) Foster global competency and inclusion
- (5) Advance an environment of success, support, and community engagement
- (6) Achieve sustainable growth and ensure best return on investment

Also discussed were the "levers" to ensure success.

Fall 2012 student enrollment was 7647 total students (as compared to 4626 in 2000). This included 6760 on-campus students and 887 distance/EEC students.

Chancellor Schrader reported that Missouri S&T is a finalist for the "Climate Leadership Award." Voting is open until 1 May 2013.

3. University Advancement Report (Vice Chancellor Joan Nesbitt)

Vice Chancellor Nesbitt announced new staff joining University Advancement. Fund-raising effort by fiscal year was presented and status of Hasselmann Alumni House donations was discussed. We currently have \$2,036,520 in donations or pledges. A \$500,000 bequest from Beverly Koepfel provides for a 1:2 match for new naming gifts. Hopefully, the challenge will raise an additional \$1.5 million toward the \$3.8 million goal.

Donor acquisition vs. donor renewal efforts were also discussed. We have about a 15% attrition rate in donor renewals. On-line giving challenges were also discussed. Goal is to achieve 10,000 active donors by 2020. June 30th is the deadline for annual giving recognition.

4. Board of Trustees Report (John Eash)

John Eash gave a brief report of the Board of Trustees meeting to include a business model for the campus, enrollment management, recruiting, and financial aid.

5. Minutes from the October 13, 2012 Board of Directors' Meeting (Keith Wedge)

Minutes were approved as presented

6. Treasurer's Report (Jerry Bayless)

Jerry Bayless presented the treasurer's report for the year ending December 31, 2012. Total income for 2012 was \$499,590 (a decline of \$4,588.18 from 2011). Expenses for 2012 totaled \$527,062.98 and included \$175,566 for student financial assistance, \$31,123 for university support, and \$320,373.98 for operations (a deficit of \$27,472.98 for 2012 compared to a deficit of \$48,834.83 in 2011). Unrestricted giving has been declining.

7. Executive Committee Report (Rich Eimer)

Rich Eimer presented a summary of the December Executive Committee meeting emphasizing continuing financial challenges, declining number of donors, and Alumni House fund-raising efforts. OGS Executive Committee reports 34 new and 31 advancing members this year. This will bring membership to 1625 members representing 952 households. Tentative plan for future OGS meetings are 7 June 2014 in Kansas City and Big Cedar Lodge in 2015, date to be determined.

8. Comments from Student Representatives

Ryan Beck (Student Council) described new software to help campus organizations communicate with each other. Reported that the students passed a resolution that they are willing to help pay for athletic renovations. Ryan also described the “safe rides” program and the council’s push to award students credit hours for work on student design teams. Ryan also gave a brief report for Student Union Board President Ian Lee who was unable to attend.

Mohammad Alkazimi (Council of Graduate Students) reported that he represents approximately 1700 graduate students at Missouri S&T. The council’s role is to help bridge the gap between university administration and the grad students.

Matt Crinnian (Students Today-Alumni Tomorrow) described STAT’s new mission and focus to better engage students. He has been working with Miner Alumni Association board member Kurt Haslag. STAT has added more officer positions and extended terms to a full year. Members volunteer to help with freshman orientation.

9. Committee Reports:

A. Alumni Engagement (Helene Hardy Pierce)

The Alumni Engagement Committee discussed a variety of strategies for increasing alumni participation. Initially, the committee reviewed a list of advantages for engaging with the Miner Alumni Association. This was passed along to the Marketing and Communications Committee. Next, strategies for inclusion and recognition of young alumni were discussed, including membership cards and integration of Facebook authentication into the on-line community. Then, opportunities for enhancing Homecoming were explored including the implementation of class/student activity coordinators, and group pictures for MSM, UMR, and S&T grads. The use of a contact-information sharing board was also discussed. The committee also discussed means of support for section officers including revision of the section officers’ handbook and an on-line discussion forum for section officers via Linked In.

Darlene Ramsay reported on the plan to move the Saturday evening Homecoming Awards Banquet to a luncheon on Friday. There has been poor attendance at the Legends Banquet on Saturday evening. Awardees will attend a private dinner with the Chancellor on Saturday evening.

B. Finance (Ron Jagels / Steve Rector)

Ron Jagels presented a summary of investment performance.

Account balances as of 31 March 2013 are:

- (1) Main Account: \$11,252,846 (4.68% year to date)
- (2) Bertelsmeyer Endowment: \$414,085 (6.55% year to date)
- (3) Stevenson Endowment: \$388,160 (5.99% year to date)
- (4) Charitable Gift Annuity: \$193,116 (4.67% year to date)

Steve Rector presented the Miner Alumni Association Financial Report as of 28 February 2013 showing total assets (and total liabilities and equity) of \$15,302,151.11. Included in total assets is \$490,695.63 in fixed assets (buildings).

Steve also presented the proposed budget for FY 2014 which will begin 1 July. There will be a six-month transition as we change from calendar year budget to fiscal year budget. The proposed budget has income of \$452,600 and the following expense categories: Student Financial Assistance (\$14,250), University Support (\$29,850), Operations (\$333,500), and a \$75,000 contribution to the Alumni House.

A motion was made and passed to approve the proposed budget.

There was discussion on a proposed new distribution (spending) policy with the Executive Director administering the Endowment Pool spending distribution in conjunction with the Chairperson of the Financial Affairs committee. A 28-quarter trailing average of market values would be used to help ensure the corpus continues to grow. A motion was made and approved to accept the new distribution policy.

C. Student Engagement (Ernie Banks)

Ernie Banks gave a presentation on his committee's ideas to increase student engagement. Key recommendations were:

- (1) Increase number of engaged STAT students by 10%
- (2) Identify target student organizations to build a develop relationships
- (3) Identify key faculty/staff liaisons and develop a plan for engagement
- (4) Increase interaction and feedback between scholarship recipients and donors

D. Strengthening Campus Relationships (Mike McEvilly)

The Strengthening Campus Relations Committee met with a variety of campus constituents to explore opportunities for increased collaboration. The admissions staff addressed revitalizing the Alumni Ambassadors Program, which functions to recruit high school students at college fairs across the country. Student Affairs staff presented opportunities for alumni engagement including the Officers Summit, Greek Presidents' Dinner, Chancellor's Leadership Academy, and MinerRama. The committee plans to explore opportunities for alumni utilization of OrgSync, a new web module currently used by recognized student organizations. The committee also gained an overview of Missouri S&T Distance and Continuing Education offerings which include on-line degree programs and summer camps that may be of interest to alum's companies or families.

E. Communications and Marketing (Jon Schneider)

The mission of the Communications and Marketing committee is to support the goals and initiatives of the other committees through data collection and analysis, idea generation, integrated planning, and execution. Working notes on the "Benefits of the MAA" from the Alumni Engagement Committee were presented as a goal to start working on. After the data was reviewed, there was open discussion on how to polish our benefits and connect "new alumni" early. Ideas were generated on how to keep new alumni thinking about S&T and the alumni association, providing them with something useful, piloting it, and then gathering data to analyze and finalize the list of benefits. The committee summarized the list into two key categories: networking and services, and referenced a pocket card to hand out at Grand Finale as the means to communicate this. Conducting surveys at Grand Finales was also discussed as a way to gather data from young alumni and find out what services they will utilize and seek.

F. Jackling Endowment Fund (Chris Ramsay)

Jackling Endowment Fund Corpus: \$951,000

Current Balance in Spendable Account: \$28,000

Loan Balance: \$95,000 (\$33,000 cash, \$62,000 outstanding loans)

Support provided during summer 2012 included:

- (1) Mining/Explosives Camp: \$15,000
- (2) Jackling Introduction to Engineering: \$10,000
- (3) Materials Camp (Met and Cer Eng): \$15,000
- (4) Geo Eng Clean Water Project: \$19,000 (This is the final year of a three year program for a total of \$57,000 in support)

Support approved for summer 2013:

- (1) Mining/Explosives Camp: \$ 15,000
- (2) Jackling Introduction to Engineering: \$10,000
- (3) Materials Camp: \$ 15,000

G. Hasselmann Alumni House (Matt Coco)

Matt Coco presented a proposed schedule:

- (1) Committee present a firmer estimate of what house will cost - 1 July
- (2) Budget review at August Executive Committee meeting
- (3) Get proposals for financing
- (4) Approve at October meeting
