

#### Note 1 - Organization and Significant Accounting Policies

#### **Organization**

Sacred Heart Health Services (Organization), which operates as Avera Sacred Heart Hospital, is a voluntary not-for-profit Corporation that is licensed as a 144-bed acute care hospital, a 187-bed long-term care facility, and rural health clinics located in Yankton. South Dakota and the surrounding communities The Organization also operates a 23-bed acute care hospital and 47-bed long-term care facility, and rural health clinics in Creighton. Nebraska and the surrounding communities The Organization is structured as a South Dakota nonprofit corporation and is exempt from federal income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue code. The Organization operates under the tenets of the Roman Catholic Church and in accordance with the philosophy and values established for Avera Health, the sole member of the Organization and a sponsored ministry of the Benedictine and Presentation Sisters

#### Consolidation

The consolidated financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2013 and 2012 include the accounts of Sacred Heart Health Services and the accounts of the following controlled organizations

- Health Management Services, a nonprofit organization (corporate sponsorship and control ended on April 9, 2013)
- Lewis and Clark Health Education and Service Agency d/b/a
   Avera Education and Staffing Solutions, a nonprofit organization
  - Valley Health Services, a for-profit corporation

Significant inter-company accounts and transactions have been eliminated in the consolidation

#### Use of Estimates

The preparation of consolidated financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the consolidated financial statements. Estimates also affect the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

#### Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include highly liquid investments with an original maturity of three months or less, excluding assets limited as to use

#### Patient and Resident Receivables

Patient and resident receivables are uncollateralized patient, resident and third-party payor obligations. Unpaid patient and resident receivables, excluding amounts due from third-party payors, with service discharge dates over 90 days old have interest assessed at 1 percent per month. Interest charges are recognized as income when charged to the patient or resident. Payments of patient and resident receivables are allocated to the specific claims identified on the remittance advice or, if unspecified, are applied to the earliest unpaid claim.

Patient and resident accounts receivable are reduced by an allowance for doubtful accounts. In evaluating the collectability of accounts receivable, the Organization analyzes its past history and identifies trends for each of its major payor sources of revenue to estimate the appropriate allowance for doubtful accounts and provision for bad debts. Management regularly reviews data about these major payor sources of revenue in evaluating the sufficiency of the allowance for doubtful accounts. For receivables associated with services provided to patients who have third party coverage, the Organization analyzes contractually due amounts and provides an allowance for doubtful accounts and a provision for bad debts, if necessary. For receivables associated with self-pay patients, which includes both patients without insurance and patients with deductible and copayment balances due for which third-party coverage exists for part of the bill, the Organization records a significant provision for bad debts in the period of service on the basis of its past experience, which indicates that many patients are unable or unwilling to pay the portion of their bill for which they are financially responsible. The difference between the standard rates and the amounts actually collected after all reasonable collection efforts have been exhausted is charged off against the allowance for doubtful accounts.

The Organization's process for calculating the allowance for doubtful accounts for self-pay patients has not significantly changed from June 30, 2012 to June 30, 2013. The Organization does not maintain a material allowance for doubtful accounts from third-party payors, nor did it have significant write offs from third-party payors. The Organization has not significantly changed its charity care or uninsured discount policies during fiscal years 2013 or 2012. Patient and resident receivables are shown net of estimated uncollectibles, charity care, and other allowances of approximately \$13,606,000 and \$16,743,000 as of June 30, 2013 and 2012, respectively

### Physician Notes Receivable

The Organization has entered unsecured notes at market rates with physicians as part of its recruitment process. Notes are repayable over a minimum of a one-year period to a maximum of a four-year period and are issued at prime interest rates plus 2%. The notes are issued with forgiveness provisions over the life of the note to encourage retention. Based on historical analysis, it is anticipated that the balance of the notes will be forgiven. Notes receivable with physicians totaled \$1,294,097 and \$1,013,129 as of June 30, 2013 and 2012, respectively. Physician notes receivables are classified as other noncurrent receivables in the consolidated balance sheets.

#### **Supplies**

Supplies are stated at lower of cost (first-in, first-out) or market

#### Assets Limited as to Use

Assets limited as to use include assets set aside by the Board of Directors for future capital improvements and debt redemption, over which the Board retains control and may at its discretion subsequently use for other purposes, assets held by a trustee under indenture agreements, and donor-restricted and other assets held by the Foundation Division. Assets limited as to use that are available for obligations classified as current liabilities are reported in current assets.

#### **Donor-Restricted and Other Assets of Foundation Division**

The Organization holds and invests donor-restricted funds and other assets that remain unspent. Due to the restricted nature, the investments and cash and cash equivalents are classified as limited as to use in the consolidated balance sheets.

#### **Investments and Investment Income**

Investments with readily determinable market values are stated at fair value. The fair value of all debt and equity securities with readily determinable fair values are based on quotations obtained from national and foreign securities exchanges. The Organization has adopted Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) Topic 825. ASC 825 permits entities to choose to measure many financial instruments and certain other items at fair value. All investment are classified as trading securities, therefore investment income or loss (including interest income, dividends, net changes in unrealized gains and losses, and net realized gains and losses) is included in revenues in excess of expenses unless the income or loss is restricted by donor or law. Investment income on funds held under indenture agreements is recorded as other operating revenue while all other investment income is recorded as nonoperating revenue in the consolidated statements of operations.

The Organization, through its affiliation with Avera Health, participates in the Avera Pooled Investment Fund, a fund administered by Avera Health. The Pooled Investment Fund has a portion of its holdings in alternative investments, which are not readily marketable. These alternative investments include partnerships and other interests that invest in hedge funds, real asset funds, and private equity/venture capital funds, among others. Many of these alternative investments have fair values that are determined using the net asset value (NAV) provided by the investment manager. NAV is a practical expedient to determine the fair value of investments that do not have readily determinable fair values and prepare their financial statements consistent with the measurement principles of an investment company or have the attributes of an investment company. Investment income, including interest, dividends, realized gains and losses, and unrealized gains and losses are allocated to participants of the Avera Pooled Investment Fund based upon their pro rata share of the investments.

# **Property and Equipment**

Property and equipment acquisitions in excess of \$1,000 are capitalized and recorded at cost. Depreciation is provided over the estimated useful life of each depreciable asset and is computed using the straight-line method. The estimated useful lives of property and equipment are as follows.

Land improvements	3 - 25 years
Buildings and improvements	5 - 40 years
Equipment	3 - 20 years

Gifts of long-lived assets such as land, buildings, or equipment are reported as additions to unrestricted net assets and are excluded from revenues in excess of expenses unless explicit donor stipulations specify how the donated assets must be used. Gifts of long-lived assets with explicit restrictions that specify how the assets are to be used and gifts of cash or other assets that must be used to acquire long-lived assets are reported as restricted net assets. Absent explicit donor stipulations about how long those long-lived assets must be maintained, expirations of donor restrictions are reported when donated or when acquired long-lived assets are placed in service.

#### **Impairment of Long-Lived Assets**

The Organization considers whether indicators of impairment are present and performs the necessary analysis to determine if the carrying values of assets are appropriate. No impairment was identified for the years ended June 30, 2013 and 2012.

#### **Investment in Affiliated Organizations**

Investments in entities in which the Organization has the ability to exercise significant influence over operating and financial policies but does not have operational control are recorded under the equity method of accounting Under the equity method, the initial investment is recorded at cost and adjusted annually to recognize the Organization's share of earnings and losses of those entities, net of any additional investments or distributions. The Organization's share of net earnings or losses of the entities is included in other operating revenue.

#### Goodwill

Goodwill represents the excess of cost over the fair value of the net assets acquired from business acquisitions

On an annual basis and at interim periods when circumstances require, the Organization tests the recoverability of its goodwill. The Organization has the option, when each test of recoverability is performed, to first assess qualitative factors to determine whether the existence of events or circumstances leads to a determination that it is more likely than not that the fair value of a reporting unit is less than its carrying amount. If the Organization determines that it is more likely than not that the fair value of a reporting unit is greater than its carrying amount, then additional analysis is unnecessary. If the Organization concludes otherwise, then a two-step impairment analysis, whereby the Organization compares the carrying value of each identified reporting unit to its fair value, is required. The first step is to quantitatively determine if the carrying value of the reporting unit is greater than its fair value. If the Organization determines that this is true, the second step is required, where the implied fair value of goodwill is compared to its carrying value.

The Organization recognizes an impairment charge for the amount by which the carrying amount of goodwill exceeds its fair value. The fair value of the reporting unit is estimated using the net present value of discounted cash flows, excluding any financing costs or dividends, generated by each reporting unit. The discounted cash flows are based upon reasonable and appropriate assumptions about the underlying business activities of respective reporting unit. The Organization performs its test for recoverability for goodwill at the same time each year, unless circumstances require additional analysis. There have been no impairment charges resulting from this review for the years ended June 30, 2013 and 2012.

#### Fair Value Measurements

The Organization has determined the fair value of certain assets and liabilities in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles, which provides a framework for measuring fair value

Fair value is defined as the exchange price that would be received for an asset or paid to transfer a liability (an exit price) in the principal or most advantageous market for the asset or liability in an orderly transaction between market participants on the measurement date. Valuation techniques should maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

A fair value hierarchy has been established, which prioritizes the valuation inputs into three broad levels. Level 1 inputs consist of quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the reporting entity has the ability to access at the measurement date. Level 2 inputs are inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the related asset or liability. Level 3 inputs are unobservable inputs related to the asset or liability.

#### **Donor-Restricted Gifts**

Unconditional promises to give cash and other assets are reported at fair value at the date the promise is received Conditional promises to give and indications of intentions to give are reported at fair value at the date the gift is received. The gifts are reported as either temporarily or permanently restricted support if they are received with donor stipulations that limit the use of the donated assets. When donor stipulated time restrictions or purpose restrictions are met or accomplished, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified as unrestricted net assets and reported in the consolidated statement of operations as net assets released from restrictions. Donor-restricted contributions whose restrictions are met within the same year as received are reflected as unrestricted contributions in the consolidated statements of operations.

#### **Contributions Made**

Unconditional promises to give cash and other assets are reported at fair value and recorded as liabilities at the date the promise is made. Conditional promises to give and indications of intentions to give are reported at fair value at the date the conditions have been met or the date the gift is made.

#### **Deferred Revenue**

The Organization recognizes deferred revenue for amounts received for which the services have not yet been performed. Grants are also recorded as deferred revenue when the Organization receives grant money in advance of qualifying grant expenditures. Grant revenue is recognized and included in income at the time qualifying expenditures are made by the Organization.

### **Temporarily and Permanently Restricted Net Assets**

Temporarily restricted net assets are those whose use by the Organization has been limited by donors to a specific time period or purpose. Permanently restricted net assets have been restricted by donors to be maintained by the Organization in perpetuity.

#### **Income Taxes**

The Organization is organized as a South Dakota nonprofit corporation and has been recognized by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) as exempt from federal income taxes under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3) Certain consolidated subsidiaries, including Valley Health Services, are not tax-exempt entities and are considered partnerships or disregarded entities for tax purposes. The Organization is annually required to file a Return of Organization Exempt from Income Tax (Form 990) with the IRS. In addition, the Organization is subject to income tax on net income that is derived from business activities that are unrelated to its exempt purpose. The Organization files an Exempt Organization Business Income Tax Return (Form 990T) with the IRS to report its unrelated business taxable income.

The Organization believes that it has appropriate support for any tax positions taken affecting its annual filing requirements, and as such, does not have any uncertain tax positions that are material to the consolidated financial statements. The Organization would recognize future accrued interest and penalties related to unrecognized tax benefits and liabilities in income tax expense if such interest and penalties are incurred. The Organization's federal Form 990T and other tax return filings are no longer subject to federal tax examinations by tax authorities for years before 2010.

#### **Net Patient and Resident Service Revenue**

The Organization has agreements with third-party payors that provide for payments to the Organization at amounts different from its established rates. Payment arrangements include prospectively determined rates, reimbursed costs, discounted charges, and per diem payments. Net patient and resident service revenue is reported at the estimated net realizable amounts from patients, residents, third-party payors, and others for services rendered, including estimated retroactive adjustments under reimbursement agreements with third-party payors. Retroactive adjustments are accrued on an estimated basis in the period the related services are rendered and adjusted in future periods as final settlements are determined.

The Organization recognizes patient and resident service revenue associated with services provided to patients and residents who have third-party payor coverage on the basis of contractual rates for the services rendered, as noted above. For uninsured patients that do not qualify for charity care, the Organization recognizes revenue on the basis of its standard rates for services provided or on the basis of discounted rates, if negotiated or provided by policy. On the basis of historical experience, a significant portion of the Organization's uninsured patients and residents will be unable or unwilling to pay for the services provided. Thus, the Organization records a significant provision for bad debts related to uninsured patients and residents in the period the services are provided. Net patient and resident service revenue, but before the provision for bad debts, recognized for the years ended June 30, 2013 and 2012 from these major payor sources, is as follows.

#### **Charity Care**

The Organization provides health care services to patients and residents who meet certain criteria under its charity care policy without charge or at amounts less than established rates. Since the Organization does not pursue collection of these amounts, they are not reported as patient and resident service revenue. The amount of charges foregone for services provided under the Organization's charity care policy were approximately \$2,364,000 and \$1,976,000 for the years ended June 30, 2013 and 2012. The estimated cost of providing these services was \$897,000 and \$788,000 for the years ended June 30, 2013 and 2012, calculated by multiplying the ratio of cost to gross charges for the Organization by the gross uncompensated charges associated with providing charity care to its patients

#### **Revenues In Excess of Expenses**

Revenues in excess of expenses excludes transfers of assets to and from related parties for other than goods and services, reclassifications of accumulated losses on interest rate swap, and contributions of long-lived assets, including assets acquired using contributions which were restricted by donors

### **Advertising Costs**

The Organization expenses advertising costs as incurred Advertising expenses totaled \$502,340 and \$545,194 for the years ended June 30, 2013 and 2012, respectively

#### **Electronic Health Record (EHR) Incentives**

The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 established incentive payments under the Medicare and Medicaid programs for certain professionals and hospitals that meaningfully use certified electronic health record ("EHR") technology. The Medicare incentive payments are paid out to qualifying hospitals over four consecutive years on a transitional schedule. To qualify for Medicare incentives, hospitals and physicians must meet EHR "meaningful use" criteria that become more stringent over three stages as determined by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services.

Medicaid programs and payment schedules vary from state to state. The Medicaid program in South Dakota requires eligible hospitals to register for the program prior to 2016, to engage in efforts to adopt, implement or upgrade certified EHR technology in order to qualify for the initial year of participation, and to demonstrate meaningful use of certified EHR technology in order to qualify for additional years of payments. The payment schedule is based on a formula of the overall EHR amount times the Medicaid share and is paid 40% in the first and second years and at 20% in the last year of participation based on a Federal Fiscal Year. For South Dakota, hospitals cannot initiate payments after 2016 and payment years must be consecutive after 2016 through 2021.

For eligible professionals. EHR incentive payments are based on a standard amount per professional Professionals that are eligible to participate in the Medicare EHR incentive program can be paid up to \$44,000 over a 4 year period and professionals that are eligible to participate in the Medicaid program are eligible to receive up to \$63,750 over a 6 year period Eligible professional are only allowed to participate in either the Medicaid or Medicare programs, not both

During the year ended June 30, 2013, the Organization recorded approximately \$1,351,664 related to the Medicare program and approximately \$-0- related to Medicaid programs in other revenue for meaningful use incentives. These incentives have been recognized when management becomes reasonably assured of meeting the required criteria.

Amounts recognized represent management's best estimates for payments ultimately expected to be received based on estimated discharges, charity care, and other input data. Subsequent changes to these estimates will be recognized in other operating revenue in the period in which additional information is available. Such estimates are subject to audit by the federal government or its designee.

#### Market Risk

The Organization's policy for managing risk related to its exposure to variability in interest rates and other relevant market rates and prices includes consideration of entering into derivative instruments (freestanding derivatives), or contracts or instruments containing features or terms that behave in a manner similar to derivative instruments (embedded derivatives) in order to mitigate its risks. The Organization recognizes all derivatives as either assets or liabilities in the consolidated balance sheets and measures those instruments at fair value.

#### Reclassifications

Reclassifications have been made to the consolidated financial presentation to make it conform to the current year presentation. The reclassifications had no effect on previously reported operating results or changes in net assets

#### Note 2 - Loan Guarantees

The Organization is a member of the Avera Health Obligated Group (Obligated Group) and is a party to a Master Trust Indenture that results in the Organization being jointly and severally obligated for various debt issues of the Obligated Group. The Obligated Group is comprised of Avera Health and six of its sponsored organizations including Avera McKennan. Avera St. Luke's, Sacred Heart Health Services, Avera Queen of Peace, Avera Marshall, and Avera St. Mary's (as of January 1, 2013). Avera McKennan and other Obligated Group members have recorded their allocable share of the par amount of these debt transactions based on their respective underlying proceeds from the various debt issuances. The Master Trust Indenture also places limits on the incurrence of additional borrowings and requires that the Obligated Group satisfy certain measures of financial performance as long as the debt is outstanding.

As of June 30, 2012, the Organization has reserved investments equal to the amount of the outstanding guarantee for the Avera St. Anthony's Revenue Bonds. This amount is classified as assets limited as to use in the consolidated balance sheets as of June 30, 2012.

#### Note 3 - Net Patient and Resident Service Revenue

The Organization has agreements with third-party payors that provide for payments to the Organization at amounts different from its established rates. A summary of the payment arrangements with major third-party payors is as follows

Medicare – PPS: Inpatient acute care, outpatient and rehab services rendered to Medicare program beneficiaries are paid at prospectively determined rates per visit. These rates varied according to a patient classification system that is based on clinical, diagnostic, and other factors. The Organization is reimbursed for cost reimbursable items at a tentative rate with final settlement determined after submission of annual cost reports by the Organization and audits thereof by the Medicare fiscal intermediary. The Organization's Medicare cost reports have been audited by the Medicare fiscal intermediary through June 30, 2009.

Medicare – CAH: The Organization operates a facility that is licensed as a Critical Access Hospital (CAH) The facility is reimbursed for most inpatient and outpatient services on a cost-based methodology with final settlement determined after submission of the annual cost report by the hospital and is subject to audit thereof by the Medicare intermediary. The critical access hospital's Medicare cost reports have been audited by the Medicare fiscal intermediary through June 30, 2011

Medicaid – South Dakota: Inpatient acute care services rendered to Medicaid program beneficiaries are paid at prospectively determined rates per discharge. These rates vary according to a patient classification system that is based on clinical, diagnostic, and other factors. Clinical and outpatient services rendered to Medicaid program beneficiaries are reimbursed under a fee schedule reimbursement methodology based on historical costs, but not subject to retroactive settlement.

**Medicaid** – **Nebraska:** Inpatient acute care services rendered to Medicaid program beneficiaries are paid at prospectively determined rates per discharge. These rates vary according to a patient classification system that is based on clinical, diagnostic, and other factors. Clinical and outpatient services rendered to Medicaid program beneficiaries are reimbursed under a cost reimbursement methodology. The Organization's Medicaid cost reports have been settled by the Medicaid program through June 30, 2011.

**Blue Cross (Wellmark):** Services rendered to Blue Cross (Wellmark) subscribers are reimbursed under a prospectively determined percentage of charges and fixed payment rate methodologies

Medicare and Medicaid – Nursing Home: The Organization participates in the Medicare program for which payment for resident services is made on a prospectively determined per diem rate which varies based on a casemix resident classification system. The Organization is reimbursed for Medicaid nursing home resident services at established billing rates, which are determined on a cost-related basis subject to certain limitations as prescribed by the South Dakota Department of Social Services and Nebraska Department of Health & Human Services regulations. These rates are subject to retroactive adjustment by field audit

The Organization has also entered into payment agreements with certain commercial and managed care insurance carriers and other organizations. The basis for payment to the Organization under these agreements includes prospectively determined rates per discharge, discounts from established charges, and prospectively determined daily rates.

Revenue from the Medicare and Medicaid programs accounted for approximately 36% and 10% of the Organization's net patient service revenue for the year ended June 30, 2013 and 31% and 10% for the year ended June 30, 2012 Laws and regulations governing the Medicare. Medicaid, and other programs are extremely complex and subject to interpretation. As a result, there is at least a reasonable possibility that recorded estimates will change by a material amount in the near term.

During the year ended June 30, 2012, net patient service revenue increased by \$720,224 related to a legal settlement from Medicare Medicare had erroneously reduced payments to numerous hospitals across the nation that were paid under the inpatient prospective payment system by incorrectly calculating the effect of applying budget neutrality to the rural wage index floor for the years 1999 to 2006. By accepting the settlement from Medicare, the hospital agreed not to pursue any additional remediation from Medicare in regards to this specific calculation.

Avera Health, the sole corporate sponsor of the Organization, and Avera Marshall became members of the Obligated Group and became party to a Master Trust Indenture All members of the Obligated Group are jointly and severally obligated for various debt issues of the Obligated Group

Simultaneously with the changes to the Obligated Group discussed above. Avera Health, as agent for the Obligated Group, executed other financing transactions including the following

- Refinanced its Series 2002 bonds with proceeds from a portion of the Series 2012A bonds
- Refinanced its Series 2008A bonds with proceeds from Series 2012B bonds
- Executed a tender date extension on the Series 2008C bonds which are held by a financial institution
- Executed a term note with a financial institution dated May 1, 2012 (the "Series 2012C obligation") that was used to refinance the Series 2010A bonds that were issued for Avera Marshall

The financing transactions noted above were recorded by Avera Health, as Obligated Group agent, and sole corporate sponsor of the various members of the Obligated Group. Sacred Heart Health Services and other Obligated Group members have recorded their allocable share of the par amount of these debt transactions based on their respective underlying proceeds from the various debt issuances. The Organization recorded a loss of \$217,773 for the year ended June 30, 2012 in connection with the refinancing

Under the terms of the revenue bond loan agreements. Obligated Group members, including the Organization, have been required to maintain certain deposits with a trustee. The loan agreements place limits on the incurrence of additional borrowings and requires that the Organization satisfy certain measures of financial performance as long as the bonds are outstanding.

#### Note 11 - Interest Rate Swap

In accordance with its market-risk policy, the Organization has developed a risk management strategy to maintain acceptable levels of exposure to the risk of changes in future expected variable cash flows resulting from interest rate fluctuations. As part of this strategy, the Organization has entered into the following interest rate swap agreement

The Organization entered into Swap A to effectively convert \$2,552,781 of variable rate debt to synthetic fixed rate debt at a rate of 3 915%

Effective July 1, 2009, the Organization elected to discontinue the designation of Swap A as a cash flow hedge The net unrealized loss on the date of hedge accounting discontinuance of \$369,482 is being prospectively reclassified into revenues in excess of expenses as future interest payments are made over the remaining term of the swap agreement. For the years ended June 30, 2013 and 2012, \$22,247 was reclassified into revenues in excess of expenses related to the hedging discontinuance. The aggregate fair value of the swap agreement was recorded as a long term liability of \$486,830 and \$721,697 as of June 30, 2013 and 2012, respectively. The change in fair value of \$234,867 and \$(310,847) was recorded in revenues in excess of expenses for the years ended June 30, 2013 and 2012, respectively.

#### Note 13 - Endowments

The Organization's endowments consist of various individual funds established for a variety of purposes. Its endowments represent donor-restricted endowment funds. As required by generally accepted accounting principles, net assets associated with endowment funds are classified and reported based on the existence or absence of donor-imposed restrictions.

#### **Interpretation of Relevant Law**

The Organization's Board of Directors has interpreted the Uniform Prudent Management of Institutional Funds Act (UPMIFA) as requiring the preservation of the fair value of the original gift as of the gift date of the donor-restricted endowment funds absent explicit donor stipulations to the contrary. As a result of this interpretation, the Organization classifies as permanently restricted net assets (a) the original value of gifts donated to the permanent endowment. (b) the original value of subsequent gifts to the permanent endowment, and (c) accumulations to the permanent endowment made in accordance with the direction of the applicable donor gift instrument at the time the accumulation is added to the fund. The remaining portion of the donor-restricted endowment fund that is not classified in permanently restricted net assets is classified as temporarily restricted net assets until those amounts are appropriated for expenditure by the Organization in a manner consistent with the standard of prudence prescribed by UPMIFA. In accordance with UPMIFA, the organization considers the following factors in making a determination to appropriate or accumulate donor-restricted endowment funds

- (1) The duration and preservation of the fund
- (2) The purposes of the Organization and the donor-restricted endowment fund
- (3) General economic conditions
- (4) The possible effect of inflation and deflation
- (5) The expected total return from income and the appreciation of investments
- (6) Other resources of the Organization
- (7) The investment policies of the Organization

#### **Funds with Deficiencies**

From time to time, the fair value of assets associated with individual donor-restricted endowment funds may fall below the level that the donor requires the Organization to retain as a fund of perpetual duration. In accordance with generally accepted accounting principles, deficiencies of this nature are reclassified and reported in unrestricted net assets. These deficiencies typically result from unfavorable market fluctuations that occur. There were no such deficiencies that were deemed material as of June 30, 2013 and 2012.

# **Return Objectives and Risk Parameters**

The Organization has adopted investment and spending policies for endowment assets that attempt to provide available resources to programs supported by its endowment while seeking to maintain the purchasing power of the endowment assets. Endowment assets include those assets of donor-restricted funds that the Organization must hold in perpetuity. Under this policy, as approved by the Board of Directors, the endowment assets are invested in a manner that is intended to produce acceptable market returns while assuming a moderate level of investment risk. Actual returns in any given year may vary from this amount.

# **Strategies Employed for Achieving Objectives**

To satisfy its long-term rate-of-return objectives, the Organization relies on a total return strategy in which investment returns are achieved through both capital appreciation (realized and unrealized) and current yield (interest and dividends). The Organization targets a diversified asset allocation that places a greater emphasis on equity-based investments to achieve its long-term return objectives within prudent risk constraints.

### Spending Policy and How the Investment Objectives Relate to Spending Policy

The Organization does not have a formal policy for appropriating for distribution any earnings from endowment assets. The Organization appropriates funds on a project by project basis during the year with the objective to maintain the purchasing power of the endowment assets held in perpetuity as well as to provide additional real growth through new gifts and investment return

#### **Note 14 - Self-Insurance Programs**

The Organization participates in various self-insured programs administered by Avera Health, including pooled-risk professional liability, pooled-risk workers compensation, and employee health and dental insurance

Under the programs. Avera Health has recognized an exposure to possible liability in an amount necessary to reasonably provide for the expected losses of the participants. The amount of the exposure, as determined by independent actuaries in consultation with Avera Health for the workers' compensation and professional liability programs and actuarial templates in the case of health and dental insurance, has been funded by payments into a custodial account to be used for payment of claims and related expenses.

The programs include a combination of self-insurance and commercial insurance. The expenses of the Organization for contributions to the self-insurance portion of the programs were as follows for the years ended June 30, 2013 and 2012.

Professional liability and workers' compensation claims have been asserted against the participating facilities and the program by various claimants. The claims are in various stages of processing and some may ultimately be brought to trial. Counsel is unable to conclude as to the ultimate outcome of the actions. There are other known incidents occurring through June 30, 2013, that may result in the assertion of additional claims and other claims may be asserted arising from services provided to patients in the past.

There are also known health insurance claims that have been submitted subsequent to June 30, 2013, and it is likely there are also other claims that still have not been submitted for services provided prior to June 30, 2013

The insurance programs noted above include additional commercial coverage to protect the Organization from loss. While it is possible that the settlement of asserted claims and claims which may be asserted in the future could result in liabilities in excess of amounts for which the programs have provided, management believes that the excess liability, if any, should not materially affect the consolidated financial position of the Organization at June 30, 2013.

#### **Note 15 - Employee Pension Plan**

The Organization has a defined contribution pension plan under which employees become participants upon reaching age 21 and completion of one year of service. Employees may elect to voluntarily contribute up to 10% of their compensation. Pension expense determined in accordance with the plan formula (4% of eligible covered compensation) was \$1.118.525 and \$1.287.251 for the years ended June 30, 2013 and 2012.

# **Note 20 - Contingencies**

#### **Malpractice Insurance**

As discussed in Note 14, the Organization participates in a self-insured professional liability and general liability program which provides malpractice and general insurance coverage for professional and general liability losses subject to a self-insured retention of \$2 million per claim and \$6 million annual aggregate. The Organization is also insured under an excess umbrella liability claims made policy with a limit of \$35 million. Should the claims-made policy not be renewed or replaced with equivalent insurance, claims based on occurrences during its term, but reported subsequently, would be insured subject to the self-insured retention only.

#### Litigation, Regulatory and Compliance Matters

The healthcare industry is subject to voluminous and complex laws and regulations of federal, state and local governments. Compliance with such laws and regulations can be subject to future government review and interpretation as well as regulatory actions unknown or unasserted at this time. These laws and regulations include, but are not necessarily limited to, the rules governing licensure, accreditation, government healthcare program participation, government reimbursement, antitrust, anti-kickback and anti-referral by physicians, false claims prohibitions, and in the case of tax-exempt organizations, the requirements of tax exemption. In recent years, government activity has increased with respect to investigations and allegations concerning possible violations by healthcare providers of reimbursement, false claims, anti-kickback and anti-referral statutes and regulations, quality of care provided to patients, and handling of controlled substances. In addition, during the course of business, the Organization becomes involved in litigation. Management assesses the probable outcome of unresolved litigation and investigations and determines the appropriate accounting recognition or disclosure based on their assessment. As of June 30, 2013 and 2012, management feels there are no asserted or unasserted claims that would have a material impact on the consolidated financial position, results of operations, or cash flows of the Organization.
