### The Hunt Institute 2013 Year-In-Review Summary

It's been another full year for The Hunt Institute in 2013. The year began with The Hunt Institute's 10<sup>th</sup> annual North Carolina Legislators Retreat (NCLR) on January 6-8, in Pinehurst, NC. More than 67 legislators and 35 national and state education experts convened to discuss key education topics, such as digital learning, STEM education, pay for performance and teacher tenure, teacher preparation, and implications for higher education. For the first time, The Institute held a pre-session for new legislators that addressed early childhood education and the shift to college- and career-ready standards.

For 10 years, the NCLR, co-hosted by former governors Jim Hunt and Jim Holshouser, has been a significant part of The Hunt Institute's work. It has provided a rich, non-partisan setting for legislators and experts to have a forthright dialogue about the state's critical education challenges. In honor of the role Gov. Holshouser has played throughout the years – and for his overall commitment to education – The Institute officially renamed the event *The Governor Jim Holshouser Legislators Retreat*.

The Institute hosted its **2013 Governors Education Symposium**: Advance America | A Commitment to Quality Education on June 10-11 in Chicago, IL. The Symposium, co-chaired by Governors Jim Hunt, Dannel Malloy (CT), and Terry Branstad (IA), focused on the importance of governors being at the helm of college- and career-ready reforms in their states. Eleven governors with their state teams attended the Symposium, which covered a series of discussions about coalition — building, teacher and leader effectiveness, implementation of college- and career-ready standards, and resource reallocation to advance student achievement and attainment. Governors were also joined by U.S. Secretary of Education Ame Duncan, who addressed early childhood education, college and career readiness, and higher education affordability.

To provide stakeholders a deeper understanding of college-and career-ready standards, The Hunt Institute joined The National Network of State Teachers of the year and Teachers Ignite to work in partnership with the National Education Association, the American Federation of Teachers, and the National PTA, to develop **four special episodes of The Ignite Show**. These 30-minute videos are centered on the Common Core State Standards (CCSS), and aired on the Georgia Public Broadcast Web Portal in October through November. Each episode takes the audience on an engaging journey with four Teachers of the Year and their students as they raise teaching and learning to exciting new levels through CCSS. The audience sees authentic examples of how CCSS mathematics and English language arts instruction excite students and engage them in collaborative learning, using higher-order thinking skills.

The year included several publications. An edition of *re:VISION*, The Institute's policy primer, was released in June. This issue provided an overview for policy leaders on why and how the Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS) were developed, how they are different from their current state standards, and what the considerations are as states determine adoption. There were also five issues of *Did You Know?* published, focusing on resources available to help teachers and parents, a North Carolina Broad Prize finalist, three NC school districts boosting student achievement, and topics on college readiness, student performance and teacher assessments.

In addition to its blog, *The Intersection*, YouTube, Twitter, and its website, The Hunt Institute added **FaceBook**. This is another outlet serving as a platform for thoughtful conversation on the CCSS, education policy, leadership, and student success.

The Institute continues to hold a strong presence at various events throughout the year. Hunt Institute officials have supported or presented at many functions, including the North Carolina Conference on Education, GE Foundation. Developing Futures in Education Conference, NBC's Education Nation, The SCORE Prize, The Broad Prize for Urban Education, The Woodrow Wilson National Fellowship Foundation Awards, 2013 National Summit on Education Reform, and The Education Trust National Conference.

The Hunt Institute continues its efforts to be a reliable, honest broker of information for partner groups, school districts, and grassroots organizations alike, and provide a platform to share resources or present new CCSS tools, materials, and leadership events as CCSS implementation continues to unfold in states across the nation – as well as the adoption of the new NGSS.

It's been a long and productive year, and The Institute will continue to drive the movement to transform American education, working at the intersection of policy and politics, supporting state and national policymakers and empowering them to drive education reform.
