NOTE A – NATURE OF ORGANIZATION AND SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Nature of Activities and Purpose

Racquet Up Detroit (the "Organization") is a Michigan non-profit Corporation organized to support and empower Detroit youth to achieve their full potential through a demanding and inspiring long-term extracurricular mentoring program of squash, academics, and community service.

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Basis of Presentation

The Organization reports information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets, and permanently restricted net assets.

Tax-Exempt Status

The Organization has been classified by the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") as a non-profit organization exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. Additionally, the Organization has been classified by the IRS as an organization that is not a private foundation. The Organization's management is not aware of any unrecognized tax benefits as of July 31, 2013 or 2012. The Organization is potentially subject to federal income tax examinations by the IRS for all years of the Organization's existence.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenue and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Concentration of Credit Risk

Financial instruments which potentially subject the Organization to concentrations of credit risk consist principally of cash, cash equivalents, and pledges receivable.

Concentration of Credit Risk (continued)

Cash and cash equivalents are maintained at financial institutions and, at times, balances may exceed the federally insured limit of \$250,000 per depositor at each financial institution. Cash and cash equivalents on deposit in excess of the federally insured limit as of July 31, 2013 approximated \$254,000. Pledges receivable are due from various individuals, corporations, and foundations located primarily in southeastern Michigan.

During the year ended July 31, 2013, the Organization utilized one supplier for purchases of \$14,390, or 18 percent of total purchases. No amounts were due to this supplier as of July 31, 2013.

Recognition of Contributions

All contributions are considered to be available for unrestricted use unless specifically restricted by the donor. Contributions with donor-imposed restrictions that are met in the same year as received or earned are reported as unrestricted support. Contributions that are designated for future periods or are restricted by the donor for specific purposes that are not met in the same year as received or earned are reported as temporarily restricted or permanently restricted support that increases those net asset classes. When a temporary restriction expires, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and are reported in the statements of activities as net assets released from restrictions.

Cash Equivalents

For purposes of the statements of cash flows, the Organization considers all short-term securities with original maturities of three months or less to be cash equivalents.

Fair Value Measurements

The Organization uses fair value measurements in the preparation of its financial statements, which utilize various inputs, including those that can be readily observable, corroborated, or are generally unobservable. The Organization utilizes market-based data and valuation techniques that maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. Additionally, the Organization applies assumptions that market participants would use in pricing an asset or liability, including assumptions about risk.

Fair Value Measurements (continued)

The measurement of fair value includes a hierarchy based on the quality of inputs used to measure fair value. Financial assets and habilities are categorized into this three-level fair value hierarchy, based on the inputs to the valuation technique. The fair value hierarchy gives the highest priority to quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and liabilities and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs.

The various levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

- Level 1 Financial assets and liabilities whose values are based on unadjusted quoted market prices for identical assets and liabilities in an active market that the Organization has the ability to access
- Level 2 Financial assets and liabilities whose values are based on quoted prices in markets that
 are not active or model inputs that are observable for substantially the full term of the asset or
 liability
- Level 3 Financial assets and liabilities whose values are based on prices or valuation techniques
 that require inputs that are both unobservable and significant to the overall fair value
 measurement

The use of observable market data, when available, is required in making fair value measurements. When inputs used to measure fair value fall within different levels of the hierarchy, the level within which the fair value measurement is categorized is based on the lowest level input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

As of July 31, 2013 and 2012, the Organization does not have any financial assets or liabilities subject to being classified in any of the above categories.

Subsequent Events

The Organization's management has evaluated subsequent events through January 16, 2014, the date that the accompanying financial statements were available to be issued.
