NOTE 1 -- NATURE OF ACTIVITIES AND SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

a. Nature of Activities

The Monroe Foundation, Inc. (the "Foundation") is a not-for-profit organization, incorporated in the state of New York on May 4, 1993. Funding consists primarily of contributions received from outside sources and fundraising events held during the course of the year for the purpose of awarding scholarships and other aid to various qualified individuals, thereby enabling them to attend institutions of higher education and to further their educational experience.

b. Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Foundation have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles.

c. Basis of Presentation

The financial statement presentation follows the recommendations of the Financial Accounting Standards Board in its FASB ASC 958-205 *Not-for-Profit Entities: Presentation of Financial Statements*. Under FASB ASC 958-205, the organization is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets, and permanently restricted net assets.

d. Use of Estimates

Management uses estimates and assumptions in preparing these financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. Those estimates and assumptions affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities, and the reported revenues and expenses. Actual results could vary from the estimates that were used.

e. Revenue Recognition

Contributions received are generally available for unrestricted use, unless specifically or implicitly restricted by the donor.

Grants and other contributions of cash and other assets are reported as temporarily restricted support if they are received with donor stipulations that limit the use of the donated assets. When a donor restriction expires, that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported in the statement of activities as net assets released from restrictions. Contributions received with donor-imposed restrictions that are met in the same year in which the contribution is received are classified as unrestricted contributions.

Contributions of donated noncash assets are recorded at their fair values in the period received.

f. Cash, Cash Equivalents and Concentrations of Risk

Cash and cash equivalents consist of cash on hand, cash held in bank checking accounts, and cash held in money market or savings accounts.

The statement of cash flows classifies changes in cash and cash equivalents (short-term, highly liquid investments readily convertible into cash with an original maturity of three months or less) according to operating, investing, or financing activities.

Financial instruments which potentially expose the Foundation to concentrations of risk consist principally of cash and other investments.

The Foundation places its cash and investments with a financial institution and a brokerage firm which management considers to be of high quality; however, at times deposits may be in excess of the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) and the Securities Investor Protection Corporation (SIPC) insurance limits. As of August 31, 2013, cash balances in excess of the FDIC and SIPC limits totaled \$79,181.

One fund-raising event generated 73% of revenues from contributions.

g. Income taxes

The Foundation is exempt from federal and state income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The Organization's Form 990, *Return of Organization Exempt from Income Tax*, is subject to examination by the IRS, generally for three years after filing.

h. Investments

The Foundation carries investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair value and all investments in debt securities at their fair values in the statement of financial position. Unrealized gains and losses are included in the change in net assets in the accompanying statement of activities. Investment income is reported as an increase in unrestricted net assets.

i. Subsequent Events

Management has evaluated subsequent events through June 24, 2014, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

j. Contributed Support

Donated goods and services are recognized as contributions, in accordance with FASB ASC 958-605, *Not-for-Profit Entities: Revenue Recognition*, if the services (a) create or enhance nonfinancial assets or (b) require specialized skills, are performed by people with those skills, and would otherwise be purchased by the Foundation. Monroe College, Inc., a related entity (see Note 2), provides all of the donated goods and services to the Foundation.

The value of donated goods and services provided by Monroe College, Inc., received in connection with a fundraising event, is included in contributed support in the statement of activities, and supporting services for the year ended August 31, 2013, as follows:

NOTE 2 -- RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The principals of Monroe College, Inc. are also members of the Board of Directors of the Foundation. The Foundation awarded scholarships of \$319,193 to students attending the College.

Funds are occasionally advanced between the Foundation and the College. The amount owed by the Foundation to the College at August 31, 2013, is \$2,553, which is included in accounts payable and accrued expenses.

FASB ASC 820, *Fair Value Measurements*, establishes a fair value hierarchy which prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value into three broad levels:

- Level 1 inputs are quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities the Foundation has the ability to access,
- Level 2 inputs are inputs (other than quoted prices included in Level 1) that are observable for the assets or liability, either directly or indirectly,
- Level 3 are unobservable inputs for the asset or liability and rely on management's own assumptions about the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability. (The unobservable inputs should be developed based on the best information available in the circumstances.)

The Foundation uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its instruments. When available, the Foundation measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value.

The Foundation's policy is to recognize transfers into and transfers out of fair value hierarchy levels as of the date of the event or change in circumstances that caused the transfer. There were no transfers in or out of any fair value levels during the year ended August 31, 2013.

NOTE 4 -- TEMPORARILY RESTRICTED NET ASSETS

Temporarily restricted net assets were donated to the Foundation by The 11-10-02 Foundation to fund four \$1,000 scholarships to students at Monroe College who have completed the Associates Degree in Baking and Pastry or Culinary Arts at the College, and have clearly stated their intent to work in the culinary industry. The scholarships must be granted by January 30, 2014.
