Educational Operating Grants and Scholarships: * The largest program of OBA is the MaaSAE Girls Secondary School (MGLSS) in Monduli, Tanzania. Student sponsorships provided funding for the 275 students at this residential school. In its nineteenth year, the school continues to provide an opportunity for pastoralist girls to be educated in a safe and nurturing environment. A monthly grant to the school supports teacher and staff salaries, food, textbooks, utilities and other expenses at the school. * Additional scholarship funds were provided to students attending four other secondary schools in Tanzania, including Moringe Sokoine Secondary School. * In Madagascar, a grant was provided to pay teacher salaries at five primary schools. These teachers taught more than 325 students last year in one of the most impoverished areas of the country.

4b (Code:) (Expenses \$ 144,978 including grants of \$ 130,055) (Revenue \$ 0)
Leadership Development: * The OBA post-secondary program provides scholarships for graduates of the MaaSAE Girls' School through sponsor support. This year, more than 80 MGLSS graduates pursued degrees at colleges, universities, and vocational schools in Tanzania with full scholarships through Operation Bootstrap Africa. Without these scholarships students would be unable to train for professions in education and health care. Due to lack of financial resources, fewer than 3% of all Tanzanian students are able to attend institutions of higher learning. * An additional 10 graduates from other secondary schools also received post-secondary scholarships through OBA.

4c (Code:) (Expenses \$ 67,416 including grants of \$ 58,671) (Revenue \$ 0)
Construction and other school projects: * Funding for several hundred desks was sent to Moringe Sokoine Secondary School in Monduli, Tanzania. Funding for new blackboards was sent to Olchoki Primary School in Ngateu, Tanzania. Books and uniforms were funded at Bassodowish Primary School near Karatu, Tanzania. * Initial funding for the construction of a school dispensary was made to Masange Primary School in Lushoto, Tanzania. * At MaaSAE Girls Secondary School in Monduli, a new water system was installed to connect the school with a municipal water source. Funding was also provided for a vehicle, tractor repair, coffee plant pruning, and for a chicken raising project. A new teacher duplex was also completed, as well as electrical updates to existing teacher houses.

NOTE 1 - NATURE OF ORGANIZATION AND SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Nature of Activities

Operation Bootstrap Africa (Organization) is incorporated as a Minnesota non-profit corporation to raise funds to assist self-help educational and select primary health care projects in the African countries of Tanzania and Madagascar.

Basis of Presentation

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Revenues, expenses, gains and losses, and net assets are classified based on the existence or absence of donor imposed restrictions. Accordingly, net assets of the Organization and related changes are classified and reported as follows:

Unrestricted Net Assets - Resources over which the Board of Directors has discretionary control.

Temporarily Restricted - Reflects resources received with donor stipulations that limit the use of the donated assets. When a donor restriction expires, that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported in the statement of activities as net assets released from restrictions.

Permanently Restricted - Consist of resources subject to a donor imposed restriction that they be maintained permanently by the Organization. The donors of these resources permitted the Organization to use all or part of the income earned, including capital appreciation, on related investments for unrestricted or temporarily restricted purposes.

Accounting Estimates

The presentation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Subsequent Events

In preparing these financial statements, the Organization has evaluated for recognition or disclosure the events or transactions that occurred through January 8, 2014, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Pledges Receivable

Pledges receivable that are expected to be collected within one year are recorded at their net realizable value. Pledges that are expected to be collected in future years are recorded at the present value of the amount expected to be collected. The discounts on those amounts are computed using an imputed interest rate applicable to the year in which the pledge is received. Amortization of the discount is included in contributions when the Organization has multi-year pledges.

Investments

The Organization carries its marketable securities at fair market value based on quoted prices in an active market. Realized and unrealized gains and losses from marketable securities are included in the statement of activities.

Donated investments are recorded as contributions at their fair values, as determined on the date of donation.

Property and Depreciation

Property and equipment are recorded at original cost. Additions, improvements or major renewals are capitalized. If items of property are sold, retired or otherwise disposed of, they are removed from the asset and accumulated depreciation accounts and any gains or losses thereon are reflected in operations. Donated property and equipment are carried at the approximate fair value at the date of donation.

Depreciation is computed using the straight-line method at rates based on the estimated service lives of the various assets as follows:

Program Grants

Unconditional grants are recorded as expense when approved by the Organization's Board of Directors. Grants that are subject to conditions are recorded when the conditions have been substantially met.

Contributions

The Organization records contributions when it has been determined that there is a legal right to the contribution and the amount is subject to reasonable estimation. Unconditional promises are recorded as revenue at the time the promise is made. Conditional promises are recorded when the condition has been satisfied.

Revenue Recognition

Contributions received and unconditional promises to give are measured at their fair values and are reported as an increase in net assets. The Organization reports gifts of cash and other assets as restricted support if they are received with donor stipulations that limit the use of the donated assets, or if they are designated as support for future periods. When a donor restriction expires, that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported in the statement of activities as net assets released from restrictions.

In-Kind Donations

Donated materials are recorded as contributions, when received, at their fair market value when such value can be objectively and accurately determined. Donations of in-kind services that create or enhance non-financial assets or that require specialized skills, are provided by individuals possessing those skills, and would typically need to be purchased if not provided by the donation, are recorded at their fair value in the period provided. In 2013 and 2012, in-kind donations were \$2,954 and \$14,768, respectively.

Income Taxes

The Organization is exempt from federal and state income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Accordingly, no provision for income taxes is included in these financial statements. The Organization had no tax expense in 2013 and 2012.

The Organization reviews income tax positions taken or expected to be taken in income tax returns to determine if there are any income tax uncertainties. This includes positions that the entity is exempt from income taxes or not subject to income taxes on unrelated business income. The Organization recognizes tax benefits from uncertain tax positions only if it is more likely than not that the tax positions will be sustained on examination by taxing authorities, based on the technical merits of the positions. The Organization has identified no income tax uncertainties.

The Organization files information returns as a tax-exempt organization. Should that status be challenged in the future, all years since inception could be subject to review by the Internal Revenue Service.

The Organization's federal and state income tax returns are open to examination for tax years 2010 through 2012.

Fair Value Measurements

Under generally accepted accounting principles as outlined in the Financial Accounting Standards Board's *Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820*, fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The accounting standards establish a three-level fair value hierarchy that prioritizes information used in developing assumptions when pricing an asset or liability as follows:

Level 1 - Observable inputs such as quoted prices in active markets;

Level 2 - Inputs, other than quoted prices in active markets, that are observable either directly or indirectly; and,

Level 3 - Unobservable inputs where there is little or no market data, which requires the reporting entity to develop its own assumptions.

The Organization uses observable market data, when available, in making fair value measurements. Fair value measurements are classified according to the lowest level input that is significant to the valuation.

The Organization holds certain assets that are required to be measured at fair value on a recurring basis. The fair values of the Organization's beneficial interest in funds held by others and long-term investments were determined based on inputs as presented in Note 2.

Functional Allocation of Expenses

The Organization allocates its expenses on a functional basis among its various program and support services. Expenses that can be identified with a specific program are allocated directly according to their natural expenditure classification. General and administrative expenses that are common to several functions are allocated based on the proportion of each program's direct and personnel expenses to the total program direct and personnel expenses.

Credit Risk

Financial instruments which potentially subject the Organization to concentrations of credit risk consist principally of cash and temporary cash investments. The Organization places its cash and temporary cash investments with high credit quality financial institutions and, by policy, generally limits the amount of credit exposure to any one financial institution. As of August 31, 2013, the Organization had a credit risk concentration as a result of depositing \$260,300 in a single local bank.

The fair value of the Organization's mutual funds are determined by reference to quoted market prices and other relevant information generated by market transactions. These investments are classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.

Fair value measurements of investments which utilize inputs classified as Level 2 consists of investments held by others in equity and fixed income securities. The investments held by the Lutheran Community Foundation are based on quoted market prices for the underlying securities which comprise the net asset value of the investment or the capital balance reported by the Lutheran Community Foundation. The investment composition of the Lutheran Community Foundation Fund remains diverse, but follows an asset allocation plan elected by the Organization and described in Note 5.

NOTE 3 - BENEFICIAL INTEREST IN FUNDS HELD BY OTHERS

The Organization is the beneficiary of a designated fund at the Lutheran Community Foundation (LCF) which was funded by a transfer of the Organization's assets. According to the terms of this agreement establishing this fund, LCF makes distributions to the Organization in accordance with LCF's spending policy. LCF has the right to distribute the investment income to another not-for-profit organization of LCF's choice if the Organization ceases to exist or if the governing board of LCF votes that support of the Organization is no longer necessary or is inconsistent with the needs of the community. The values of these funds were recorded at fair value in the statement of financial position and at August 31, 2013 and 2012 were \$35,787 and \$31,987.

Temporarily restricted net assets of \$567,253 and \$491,315 were released from restrictions in 2013 and 2012 due to satisfaction of program restrictions.

Permanently restricted net assets of \$23,945 were released from restrictions by the original donors during 2012 to allow the Organization the ability to invest the funds with other investments managed by the Lutheran Community Foundation.

NOTE 5 - ENDOWMENT FUNDS

The purpose of the Organization's endowment fund is to provide support for post-secondary scholarship funding for graduates of the MaaSae Girls Lutheran Secondary School (MGLSS) in Monduli, Tanzania. In 2011, the endowment consisted entirely of a donor-restricted endowment fund. On December 9, 2011, the donors of the Nellerhoe Endowment Fund waived all restrictions on the fund balance allowing the Organization to transfer the fund to an endowment fund at the Lutheran Community Foundation (the Foundation).

On January 13, 2012, the Board of Directors designated the unrestricted assets of the former Nellerhoe Endowment Fund as the Operation Bootstrap Africa Nellerhoe Endowment Fund (the Fund) and transferred all assets under the Fund to the Foundation. Net assets associated with the endowment fund are reported based on the existence or absence of donor-imposed restrictions.

The Board of Directors of the Organization has interpreted the State Prudent Management of Institutional Funds Act (the Act) as requiring the preservation of the fair value of the original gift as of the gift date of the donor-restricted endowment funds absent explicit donor stipulations to the contrary. As a result of this interpretation, the Organization classifies as permanently restricted net assets (a) the original value of gifts donated to the permanent endowment, (b) the original value of subsequent gifts to the permanent endowment, and (c) accumulations to the permanent endowment made in accordance with the direction of the applicable donor gift instrument at the time the accumulation is added to the fund. The remaining portion of the donor-restricted endowment fund that is not classified in permanently restricted net assets is classified as board designated unrestricted net assets until those amounts are appropriated for expenditure by the Organization in a manner consistent with the standard of prudence prescribed by the Act.

In accordance with the Act, the Organization considers the following factors in making a determination to appropriate or accumulate donor-restricted endowment funds:

- (1) The duration and preservation of the fund.
- (2) The purpose of the Organization and the endowment fund.
- (3) General economic conditions.
- (4) The possible effect of inflation and deflation.
- (5) The expected total return from income and the appreciation of investments.
- (6) Other resources of the Organization.
- (7) The investment policies of the Organization.

The Organization has placed the Fund in an investment portfolio held by the Foundation with an investment policy and philosophy that concentrates on providing long-term support, balanced with a need for short-term grant distributions within a five-year time horizon. This is accomplished through a strategic plan that strives to maintain and grow the investment corpus and provide annual earnings to support the endowment's purpose. Under this policy, the endowment assets are invested in a manner that is intended to produce results that preserve the inflation-adjusted value of the fund and maximize total return. The elected investment portfolio targets a diversified asset allocation that places a 50% emphasis on equity-based investments and a 50% emphasis on fixed income based investments to achieve its long-term return objectives within prudent risk constraints.

The Board of Directors periodically reviews and recommends in writing to the Foundation the amount to be distributed from endowment assets. Under the fund agreement with the Foundation and the Foundation's current distribution policy, the Organization may request distributions from the Fund in any amount, so long as the distribution requests are submitted in writing no more often than once each calendar quarter and so long as making the requested distribution would not reduce the value of the Fund to less than \$25,000.
