GLOSSARY OF TERMS

PROGRAM INCOME & EXPENSES:

- Member Retention: Dues income from renewal of current membership.
- New Memberships: Dues income from new member sales through March 31.

 The next half of the year is put into the next fiscal year. Members joining April 1–September 30 receive 1½ year memberships.
- Annual Dinner: The LCRCC Annual Dinner and gala awards night.
- Ambassadors Project: Silent Auction held at March Business After Hours to raise funds for Ambassadors projects, LCRCC marketing activities, and the LCRCC scholarship fund for high school students.
- Seminars (Including Global): Seminars offered to Chamber members.
- Board Lunch: Monthly luncheons. Income from board members covers the expenses for the lunch for board members, guest speakers, and staff.
- <u>USA Triathlon</u>: The Chamber has entered into a two year agreement with USA Triathlon to host the 2011 and 2012 National Championships. The Chamber has sub-contracted with Run Vermont to coordinate the event. The Chamber will serve as the fiscal agent for the event.
- <u>Vermont Convention Bureau (VCB):</u> Statewide organization that is a division of the LCRCC and whose mission is to bring meetings and conferences to Vermont.
- Welcome Center Signs/Phones/Brochures: Sale of member and non-member advertising display space at the I-89 Northbound, Southbound Williston, Georgia Southbound and Welcome Centers.
- International Tours: Pleasure trips organized by the Chamber through an appropriate 3rd party vendor. This year's trips were to Italy November 2012 and Portugal September 2013.
- <u>Economic Development:</u> Initiatives to promote economic development in the area.
- Education Vermont: Education Vermont is a consortium of higher education and secondary institutions in Vermont that are committed to increasing inbound and outbound foreign exchange education experiences. LCRCC is managing the association, for a fee, for one year with options for the future.

- Taste of Vermont DC: This event was a partnership among the LCRCC and GBIC with Senator Leahy as our honored guest. The event showcased Vermont food manufactures as well as hotels, resorts and conference facilities. Attendees included acquaintances of Senator Leahy as well as meeting planners from the DC area.
- Golf Passes & Ski Passes: A program to sell discounted golf and ski passes to various resorts.
- Relocation Package: Sale of relocation packages to consumers via the Web site, phone orders, and the 60 Main Street Welcome Center.
- Pumpkin Regatta: The Giant Pumpkin Regatta & Festival is a benefit for PILOT (Program to Inspire Leadership, Opportunity, and Thought) a youth leadership program for area high school students run by Linking Learning to Life and the Lake Champlain Regional Chamber of Commerce. The festival occurs over the Columbus Day Weekend.
- <u>Information Welcome Center:</u> Contract to staff Burlington International Airport Welcome Center desk during all hours of airport operation 365 days per year.
- World Wide Web: Sale of advertising space and links to members on the LCRCC Web site.
- Government Relations: Expenses associated with lobbying and legislative education initiatives.
- <u>Legislative Breakfast:</u> Series of three breakfasts to promote dialogue on statewide legislative issues and to hear from and speak to our state legislators.
- <u>Labels:</u> Sale of membership labels, tourism labels, and relocation labels to Chamber members for their use in marketing.
- Leadership Champlain: Division of the LCRCC whose mission is to educate business leaders on civic leadership and involvement. Ten-month program includes opening retreat, nine day-long sessions around the state, leader interview project, and two major research projects for each participant.
- <u>Excellence in Executive Leadership (EXCEL):</u> A senior executive leadership program that is co-branded with Champlain College.

- Mailer Program: Sale of member brochures inserted into the LCRCC monthly newsletter and inserts of member brochures into tourism packages.
- <u>Front Desk Sales:</u> Sale of detailed street map for Chittenden County via the Web site, phone orders, and the 60 Main Street Welcome Center.
- Coffee: Revenue and expense associated with coffee at all welcome centers.
- <u>Business After Hours:</u> Monthly events held after business hours to encourage networking and to promote the host businesses.
- Member Special Events: Revenue and expenses related to our member events other than our monthly Business After Hours. Examples include our member ski days, UVM hockey events, etc.
- Burlington Young Professionals Group (BTV YPG): BTV YPG is an initiative of the Chamber with an intent of engaging a greater number of young professionals with the community. BTV YPG will create a platform for participants to build relationships, develop professionally, become politically and philanthropically active, and contribute to the economic development and high quality living of our community. This will be accomplished by hosting successful events, programs and seminars.
- <u>Burlington Young Professionals Group Seminars:</u> Revenue and expenses related to our BTV YPG seminar series.
- <u>Partners Program:</u> The Partners Program is a program of the Chamber intended to maximize member's investment (dues, advertising, sponsorship, etc.) in the chamber. By "packaging" the member's investment, we can offer greater value to the member and an increased predictability to the level of participation in chamber programs.
- <u>Experience Burlington:</u> Experience Burlington is the Chamber's flagship tourism publication.
- Workforce Investment Board (WIB): A division of the LCRCC whose mission is to enhance technical education and workforce training.
- ECOS Grant: This grant was funded by the Regional Planning Commission as part of their ECOS planning project. It is an implementation grant targeted towards academic and skills assessment for middle school youth along with remediation assistance. The Chamber is the lead organization and partners with the Boys and Girls Club, Burlington School District and Navicate.

- North Rest Area Information Center: Contract to staff I-89 Northbound Rest Area between Richmond and Williston for all hours of operation 365 days per year.
- South Rest Area Information Center: Contract to staff I-89 Southbound Rest Area between Richmond and Williston for all hours of operation 365 days per year.
- Georgia South Rest Area Information Center: Contract with the State of Vermont to staff Georgia South Bound 365 days per year.
- <u>Waterfront Information Center</u>: Contract with the Burlington Parks and Rec department to staff the information booth located on Burlington's waterfront. Revenue is earned from advertising sales, ATM and vending machine commissions.
- <u>Tourism Promo:</u> Tourism program to market Chittenden County (tradeshows and other advertising programs).
- <u>Business Alliance for a Clean Lake (BACL):</u> The Chamber serves as the fiscal agent for this conservation of businesses and individuals who are committed to maintain the health of our lake eco-system.
- Community Art Project: A cooperative project with the Church Street

 Marketplace and Burlington Business Association. The Chamber is the lead organization.
- <u>Islands Office:</u> This is our office and information center on Route 2 in North Hero. It is open on a part-time basis and also serves as a meeting place for Island's members.
- <u>Vermont Council on World Affairs (VCWA)</u> A 501c(3) organization that voted to affiliate with the LCRCC to both bring their organization administrative stability and greater depth and understanding of international business affairs to our members.

OTHER INCOME:

- Miscellaneous: Income from external Board stipends and use of boardroom.
- Health/Dental Insurance Commissions: Revenues from Vermont Association of Chamber Executives (VACE) for promoting and selling health insurance and Delta dental in Chittenden County.
- GBIC Rent Income: Represents GBIC's rent fees.
- Workers Comp Insurance Commissions: A program we are promoting through Hickok & Boardman of which the Chamber promotes and earns a commission on. This is similar to the VACE health and dental programs.
- <u>Long-Term Care Affinity Program:</u> Represents marketing fees earned from the Chamber's long term care affinity program with NBT Bank.
- Affiliate VCB: Rent and utilities revenue from the VCB as a division of the LCRCC.
- <u>Affiliate Leadership Champlain:</u> Revenues earned from management fee of Leadership Champlain.
- <u>Affiliate Islands Regional Development Corporation:</u> These are monies received to reimburse the Chamber for the proportion of salary and benefits attributable to the time that Island's staff dedicated to the RDC grant efforts.
- ATM Affinity Program: Revenue from fees earned from the ATM at the Williston rest areas information centers.
- <u>VEDA Rent Income</u>: Represents VEDA's rent fees for the office they occupy at 60 Main Street.

OPERATING EXPENSES:

<u>Salary and Wages</u>: Chamber salaries, payroll taxes, group insurance, pension, staff development and commission sales.
