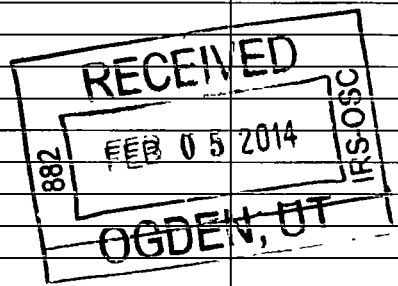

We attempt to accommodate as many charitable requests as possible. Due to the large volume of requests received, there are no exceptions to these guidelines. Please keep in mind that submitting an online request does not guarantee your organization will receive a grant or that your in-kind project will be donated.

Written, fax and email requests are no longer accepted by the Deacon Charitable Foundation.

Grants

Grants and In-kind Project Requests

Grants are awarded for a wide array of activities that serve children and families, teens, seniors and veterans including hunger, health, affordable housing, and education. We also support organizations dedicated to conservation and preserving the environment and animal protection. Our giving is guided by the interests of our employees.

Our grants generally range from \$500 to \$10,000. Our grants may be used to fund many kinds of projects, including core operating support, strengthening organizations, and building and renovating facilities.

Grant requests are accepted year-round via the Deacon Charitable Foundation on-line grant application. Once your application is received, it will be reviewed by the Giving Committee. If the proposal passes the initial review, a member of the committee will be tasked to contact you directly and in some instances schedule a site visit or presentation to the Giving Committee. Final decisions on all grant requests are made by the Giving Committee in each S D Deacon office. The review process can take 60-120 days.

- Fill out the on-line grant application form completely in order for your request to be considered
- Provide equal opportunity to all qualified individuals in leadership, staffing and service, regardless of race, color, citizenship status, national origin, ancestry, gender, sexual orientation, age, religion, creed, physical or mental disability, gender identity, marital status, veteran status or any other status protected by law
- Not require attendance at or participation in religious/faith activities as a condition of service delivery nor require adherence to religious/faith beliefs as a condition of service or employment
- Have no other pending proposals under consideration by the Deacon Charitable Foundation (only one application from an organization will be considered at one time)

The Deacon Charitable Foundation offers a grant program that is designed to meet needs identified and brought to our attention by nonprofit organizations and our employees. We recognize the importance of all charities and support many nonprofit agencies and community programs throughout Washington, Oregon and California.

The following information explains our procedures and guidelines regarding grants and in-kind projects. These procedures and guidelines are designed to assist you with submitting your request. We attempt to accommodate as many charitable requests as possible. Due to the large volume of requests received, there are no exceptions to these guidelines. Please keep in mind that submitting an online request does not guarantee your organization will receive a grant or that your in-kind project will be donated.

Written, fax and email requests are no longer accepted by the Deacon Charitable Foundation

Grants

- On-line applications ONLY
- No application deadlines
- One application per year
- Range from \$500 - \$10,000

In-Kind Projects

- Small construction, remodel or repair projects considered
- On-line applications ONLY
- No application deadlines

Grants and In-kind Project Requests

Grants are awarded for a wide array of activities that serve children and families, teens, seniors and veterans including hunger, health, affordable housing, and education. We also support organizations dedicated to conservation and preserving the environment and animal protection. Our giving is guided by the interests of our employees.

Our grants generally range from \$500 to \$10,000. Our grants may be used to fund many kinds of projects, including core operating support, strengthening organizations, and building and renovating facilities.

Grant requests are accepted year-round via the Deacon Charitable Foundation on-line grant application. Once your application is received, it will be reviewed by the Giving Committee. If the proposal passes the initial review, a member of the committee will be tasked to contact you directly and in some instances schedule a site visit or presentation to the Giving Committee. Final decisions on all grant requests are made by the Giving Committee in each S/D Deacon office. The review process can take 60-120 days.

If you have a small construction, remodel or repair project with at least a six-month lead time, submit your request by completing our on-line application.

Is Your Organization Eligible?

To be eligible to apply for a Deacon Charitable Foundation grant, organizations must

- Have 501(c)(3) tax-exempt status and you must enter your organization's valid Tax Exempt ID number on the online form
- Request support for work in Washington, Oregon or California
- Fill out the on-line grant application form completely in order for your request to be considered

SEARCH

- Provide equal opportunity to all qualified individuals in leadership, staffing and service, regardless of race, color, citizenship status, national origin, ancestry, gender, sexual orientation, age, religion, creed, physical or mental disability, gender identity, marital status, veteran status or any other status protected by law
- Not require attendance at or participation in religious/faith activities as a condition of service delivery nor require adherence to religious/faith beliefs as a condition of service or employment
- Have no other pending proposals under consideration by the Deacon Charitable Foundation (only one application from an organization will be considered at one time)

Due to the large volume of requests received, there are no exceptions to the above guidelines. Please keep in mind that submitting an online request does not guarantee your organization will receive a grant or in-kind donation.

We fund and make in-kind donations to a wide variety of projects in many fields of activity. Proposals should be strategic, state the organization's top priority at the time, its mission and capabilities, have clear outcomes, several different funding sources, and a credible plan for implementation.

Is Your Proposal a Match for a Grant or In-kind Project?

The Deacon Charitable Foundation has identified a number of items it generally does not fund:

- Direct grants, scholarships or loans to individuals
- Endowments
- General fund drives, annual appeals, special events or sponsorships
- Elimination of operating deficits
- Projects of sectarian or religious organizations that principally benefit their own members or adherents
- Direct replacement funding for activities previously supported by federal, state, or local public sources
- Grantee cannot expend any part of the grant in a way that violates its tax-exempt status
- Political parties and trade associations
- Organizations that discriminate by race, creed, gender, sexual orientation, age, religion or national origin, disability or veteran status
- Advertising and promotion
- Team sponsorships
- Individual teams
- Private or family foundations

Apply for a Grant or In-kind Project

We appreciate the time you give to assembling your information for a grant request and we want you to be as prepared as possible before you submit your proposal. The step-by-step instructions to apply for a grant are listed below and are available as a PDF you may download.

Proposals declined by the Deacon Charitable Foundation may not be resubmitted for at least 12 months after the date of declination, unless substantial changes in the project occur. It is best to email or call the Chair of the Giving Committee before resubmitting a proposal.

Step 1

Verify that your organization meets Deacon Charitable Foundation [eligibility requirements](#).

Step 2

Complete and submit the [online Grant application](#). The application questions are shown below. Grant applications are limited to a maximum total of 1,500 words. It is up to you to determine how to allocate the 1,500 words among the four sections. **Please read through the questions and have all of your information ready before you start. You can also [click here](#) to download the questions to assist in your preparation.** You will not be able to save the form and come back to it later. Once it is complete, hit the submit button. You will receive an email acknowledging receipt of your application.
