<p>1 The Foundation For Middle East Peace (FMEP) is a Nonprofit organization dedicated to informing Americans about the Israeli-Palestinian conflict and assisting in a peaceful solution that brings security for both peoples. The report on Israeli settlement in the occupied territories, published bimonthly by FMEP, provides up-to-date information on Israel's settlement policies as well as the ongoing negotiations with the Palestinians over the future of the West Bank, Gaza Strip, and Jerusalem. The Foundation also has a media outreach program. The Foundation shares data and analysis concerning settlement activity and related subjects with the media, scholars and others in the United States and abroad. Philip C.
