Notes to Financial Statements

Note 1. Significant Accounting Policies

Organization

Baton Rouge General Medical Center (the Hospital) is a private, community-owned, nonprofit hospital located in Baton Rouge, Louisiana. The Hospital primarily provides health care services, including acute care, rehabilitative services, skilled nursing care, and psychiatric services, all of which are designed to meet the health care needs of the southeast Louisiana area.

The Hospital is an affiliate of General Health System (GHS). The Hospital purchases certain services from GHS, including management services, information services, financial accounting, cash management, human resources, employee benefits, insurance, audit, legal and consulting services, printing, mailing and courier services, and such other services as are mutually agreed.

Income Tax Status

The Hospital is a not-for-profit organization as described in Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3) and is exempt from federal income taxation under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(a)

Revenue, Gains, and Losses

The Hospital's mission is to provide a broad range of innovative health care services delivered in a caring, consumer-oriented, and cost-effective manner through a quality-driven system. As such, activities related to this purpose are classified as revenue

Revenue is generated from direct patient care, related support services, and other revenue related to the operation of the Hospital. In addition, earnings on interest-bearing deposits and marketable securities that are used in conjunction with providing health care services are reported as revenue. Other activities that result in gains or losses unrelated to the Hospital's primary mission are reported as non-operating gains or losses.

Excess of revenues over expenses, as stated on the consolidated statement of operations, is considered the System's performance indicator as it is indicative of the Hospital's results from operations

Cash Equivalents and Investments

Cash equivalents include investments in money market accounts and highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less when purchased, excluding amounts whose use is limited by Board designation, under trust agreements, or amounts pledged to third parties. Fair values are based on cost. Investments that can be readily traded are considered current assets.

Net Patient Service Revenue and Related Receivables

The Hospital has entered into agreements with third-party payors, including government programs and managed health care plans, under which the Hospital is compensated for care based upon established charges, the cost of providing services, predetermined rates per diagnosis, fixed per diem rates, or discounts from established charges

Notes to Financial Statements

Note 1. Significant Accounting Policies (Continued)

Net Patient Service Revenue and Related Receivables (Continued)

Net patient service revenue is reported at the estimated net realizable amounts due from patients, third-party payors, and others for services rendered, including estimated retroactive adjustments under reimbursement agreements with third-party payors. The allowance for uncollectible accounts at September 30, 2013 and 2012 was approximately \$31,678,000 and \$22,066,000, respectively

Retroactively calculated contractual adjustments arising under reimbursement agreements with third-party payors are accrued on an estimated basis in the period the related services are rendered and adjusted as final settlements are determined. Actual results could differ from those estimates

The health care industry is subject to numerous laws and regulations of federal, state and local governments. These laws and regulations include, but are not necessarily limited to, matters such as licensure, accreditation, government health care program participation requirements, and reimbursement for patient services. Government activity has continued with respect to investigations and allegations concerning possible violations of fraud and abuse statutes and regulations by health care providers. Violations of these laws and regulations could result in expulsion from government health care programs together with the imposition of significant fines and penalties, as well as significant repayments for patient services previously billed. Management believes that the Hospital is in compliance with fraud and abuse, as well as other applicable government, laws and regulations. Compliance with such laws and regulations can be subject to future government review and interpretation as well as regulatory actions unknown or unasserted at this time.

To ensure accurate payments to providers, the Tax Relief and Healthcare Act of 2006 mandated the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) to implement a Recovery Audit Contractor (RAC) and Medicaid Integrity Contractor (MIC) programs on a permanent and nationwide basis. The programs use RACs and MICs to search for potentially improper Medicare and Medicaid payments that may have been made to health care providers that were not detected through existing CMS program integrity efforts, on payments that have occurred at least one year ago but not longer than three years ago. Once a RAC and MIC identifies a claim it believes to be improper, it makes a deduction from the provider's Medicare and Medicaid reimbursement in an amount estimated to equal the overpayment.

Notes to Financial Statements

Note 1. Significant Accounting Policies (Continued)

Net Patient Service Revenue and Related Receivables (Continued)

The Hospital will deduct from revenue amounts assessed under the RAC and MIC audits at the time a notice is received until such time that estimates of net amounts due can be reasonably estimated. Management has evaluated the Hospital's experience with RAC and MIC audits and believes that the financial statements are fairly presented Management has not accrued an additional reserve related to the ongoing RAC and MIC audits. Actual results could differ from these estimates.

Inventories

Inventories are valued at the latest invoice price. This method approximates the lower of cost (first-in, first-out method) or market.

Property, Plant, and Equipment

All property, plant, and equipment acquisitions are recorded at cost, except for donated assets, which are recorded at fair market value on the date of donation. Capital leases are recorded at the present value of future minimum lease payments and the related amortization is included in depreciation and amortization expense in the statement of operations. Depreciation of plant and equipment is calculated using the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the assets. Estimated useful lives of the assets range from 3 to 40 years.

Prepaid Expenses and Deferred Financing Cost

Prepaid expenses are amortized over the estimated period of future benefit, generally on a straight-line basis. Deferred debt issuance costs and original issue premium on the Hospital's revenue bonds are being amortized over the term of the bonds using the bonds outstanding method.

Assets Whose Use is Limited

Several funds were established concurrent with the issuance of tax-exempt debt. Trustees maintain the capital improvement and debt retirement funds, which include cash, investments, and accrued interest receivable, as special trust accounts for the benefit and security of the holders and owners of the debt. The limited use assets as of September 30, 2013 and 2012 are as follows

Self-Insurance Liabilities

The Hospital is self-insured up to certain amounts for employee health, malpractice, general liability, and workers' compensation claims. The Hospital participates in the Louisiana Patients Compensation Fund, which limits the Hospital's exposure to malpractice losses. The Hospital limits exposure to general liability and workers' compensation claims through indemnity insurance purchased in the commercial market, which includes specific loss and aggregate limit thresholds.

The liabilities, which are recorded on the Hospital's parent company (General Health System), represent management's best estimate of the ultimate unpaid cost of all reported and unreported claims incurred, including estimated legal fees. The medical malpractice and workers' compensation claims estimates are based on actuarial projections of the historical loss development of claims incurred but not reported and case-basis estimates of claims reported prior to the end of the period. These estimates are continually reviewed and adjusted, as necessary, as experience develops or new information becomes known, such adjustments are included in current operations.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period

The significant estimates affecting the Hospital's net patient service revenue and provision for bad debts relate to the allowance for uncollectible accounts, provision for contractual discounts, and provision for retroactive adjustments under third-party payor arrangements Differences between original estimates and subsequent revisions are included in the statement of operations in the period in which the differences become known. These revisions decreased net patient service revenue by approximately \$163,000 in 2013 and increased net patient service revenue by approximately \$1,216,000 in 2012.

Fair Values

The following methods and assumptions were used by the Hospital in estimating the fair value of its financial instruments

Cash and cash equivalents: The carrying amount reported in the balance sheet for cash and cash equivalents approximates its fair value

Investments: Fair value, which are the amounts reported in the balance sheet, are based on quoted market prices, if available, or estimated using quoted market prices for similar securities

Note 1. Significant Accounting Policies (Continued)

Fair Values (Continued)

Assets limited as to use: These assets consist primarily of cash and short-term investments and interest receivable. The carrying amount reported in the balance sheet is fair value.

Accounts payable and accrued expenses: The carrying amount reported in the balance sheet for accounts payable and accrued expenses approximates its fair value

Estimated third-party payor settlements: The carrying amount reported in the balance sheet for estimated third-party settlements approximates its fair value

Long-term debt: Fair values of the Hospital's revenue notes are based on current traded value. The fair value of the hospital's remaining long-term debt is estimated using discounted cash flow analyses, based on the Hospital's current incremental borrowing rates for similar types of borrowing arrangements.

Advertising Costs

The Hospital's policy is to expense advertising costs as the costs are incurred. Advertising costs for the years ending September 30, 2013 and 2012 were approximately \$1,527,000 and \$918,000, respectively

Note 2. Community Benefits - Unaudited

The Hospital provides health care services to patients who are economically disadvantaged and medically underserved. These patients generally cannot afford health care because of inadequate resources or they are uninsured.

The Hospital also recognizes the critical role of education in creating a more positive future for individuals and cultivating future clinician leaders. Through its robust training and education programs, BRGMC annually trains approximately 500 medical students, residents, fellows, nurses, pharmacists, physician assistants, nurse practitioners, certified registered nurse anesthetists, and radiation technologists.

Note 2. Community Benefits – Unaudited (Continued)

BRGMC operates the Baton Rouge General Medical Center School of Nursing and the School of Radiologic Technology and provides trained healthcare professionals to the Baton Rouge community. In response to the community need for registered nurses, BRGMC has increased the class size of its School of Nursing. BRGMC also has a PharmD program through the University of Louisiana-Monroe School of Pharmacy.

In addition, BRGMC is a Council of Teaching Hospital accredited community-based teaching hospital BRGMC has accredited residency programs in family medicine and internal medicine as well as a fellowship program in primary care sports medicine. This commitment to graduate medical education (GME) is important to both Baton Rouge and the State of Louisiana BRGMC has been active in GME for many years, working with the Louisiana State University School of Medicine (LSU) to enhance the quality of healthcare through medical education programs. BRGMC has collaborated with LSU in training physician residents in a variety of specialties, including internal medicine, emergency medicine and general surgery. In addition, BRGMC provides training for Tulane University anesthesiology residents.

BRGMC is also a satellite training campus for Tulane University medical students and is the first Tulane University School of Medicine satellite training campus outside of New Orleans Officially titled the Baton Rouge LEAD (Leadership, Education, Advocacy, and Discovery) Academy, the program is based on BRGMC's Mid City campus. In the program, Tulane medical students spend their third and fourth year clinical rotations in Baton Rouge BRGMC physicians serve as faculty members and mentor the students. Since the program was established in May 2010, 19 medical students have graduated from the program. The upcoming third and fourth year classes of medical students have grown and many of the program's graduates have remained in Louisiana for their residency training

Beyond ensuring access to high quality healthcare, BRGMC's medical education programs also help support viable communities across Louisiana through ancillary jobs and allied industry, as well as creating an economic halo that helps sustain local businesses. The economic impact of BRGMC's physician residents upon graduation is over \$63 million and 252 full-time jobs annually *

Another unique program to Baton Rouge General is its Regional Burn Center, recognized by the American Burn Association as the only burn center in southern Louisiana and, therefore, BRGMC provides critical burn care services to patients in the entire Gulf Coast region and petro-chemical corridor. The Burn Center's comprehensive range of services includes education and prevention programs for the patient, family, and community, with specific programs for work-related burn prevention and treatment. Burn treatment procedures use a team approach to care that involves physicians, nurses, occupational and physical therapists, clinical dietitians, respiratory therapists, and social and pastoral care.

The "Burn Camp" and the "Recovering Burn Support Group" are two examples of post-acute-care programs developed by the Company to meet the rehabilitative and psychosocial needs of this unique patient population

In addition, the Hospital also provides many free health screenings, health fairs and programs encouraging community wellness, including

- BRGMC offers free resources and support groups for cancer patients, including breast cancer, lymphedema, pancreatic cancer, and prostate cancer support groups
- BRGMC also offers preoperative classes, including classes on joint replacement and spine surgery, to members of the community that are designed to help ease fear and anxiety related to having a surgical procedure and to educate them on what to expect during and after surgery
- BRGMC offers Healthy Heartbeats, an education program for families with children ages 5 to 12 years old, focusing on the importance of living fit and wholesome lives through exercise, nutrition, and self-body image
- Through a specialized Healthy Heart Club, a cardiac reconditioning program, BRGMC offers an ongoing maintenance program in which the general public can exercise in our gym under the supervision of certified therapists and nutritionists
- BRGMC provides tours of our birth center and birth and baby classes to expectant parents that include childbirth preparation, breastfeeding basics, baby care basics, and CPR for friends and family
- BRGMC's Womack Heart Center and Pennington Cancer Center offers members of the community a free, seven-week, comprehensive Smoking Cessation Program several times a year to help aid smokers quit and to address real issues surrounding the lifestyle of a smoker
- BRGMC offers free, monthly Surgical Weight Loss Seminars to members of the community interested in learning more about obesity and options for medically managed weight loss, including surgery BRGMC also offers this seminar information through online educational videos to provide community members a virtual option to learn about obesity and surgical weight loss options
- Each year, Baton Rouge General provides free community health screenings to aid in early detection
 - In 2013, the Company provided a free skin cancer screening and screened a total of 51 participants
 - The Company also provided a free vascular screening series that included three vascular screening events and screened a total of 243 participants

- BRGMC participated as a corporate sponsor of the Susan G Komen Race for the Cure and the American Cancer Society's Best Dressed Ball
- BRGMC also supports Cancer Services of Greater Baton Rouge, a community based agency that provides financial, emotional, educational support for cancer patients and their families. In 2013, BRGMC was a corporate sponsor and participated in the organization's Capitol Chef Showcase, a fundraising event that supports programs and services for children and adults in Baton Rouge's 10 parish area dealing with cancer.
- BRGMC hosts free community events to promote cancer awareness BRGMC hosted "Think Pink and Beyond," a free breast cancer awareness seminar for the community, which featured specialists on lung, stomach and other cancers, as well as interactive risk assessments and wellness/fitness tips
- BRGMC is the main corporate sponsor of the American Heart Association's Go Red for Women Luncheon The Company provided education activities that promoted heart health awareness and also had physician experts on hand to answer heart health questions
- BRGMC also participated as a corporate sponsor of the American Heart Association's Heart Walk
- BRGMC launched a free e-wellness health tool to enhance primary care and early detection as well as support the overall health of the community. The tool provides a customized annual email reminder with suggested screenings and topics (based on age and gender) to discuss with their physicians. To date, more than 1,400 people have signed up for the e-wellness tool.
- Reaching more than 10,000 Facebook fans, BRGMC uses its social media platforms to encourage healthy behaviors through responsible messaging with health information and wellness tips, such as nutrition and fitness videos
- BRGMC participated as a corporate sponsor of the "Walk from Obesity" and provided information on wellness programs and weight loss options
- BRGMC, in collaboration with other area hospitals, provided medical support for participants at the Louisiana Marathon event. Physicians, physician residents and nurses volunteered their expertise to provide medical support.
- BRGMC offers free wellness classes for the community focused on the special needs of seniors, including fitness, nutrition and safety classes for seniors and caregivers
- BRGMC participated in Baton Rouge's "Life Begins at 50" expo event for senior members of the community, providing information on senior health programs and resources, as well as, offering free blood pressure screenings to seniors

- BRGMC also participated as a major corporate sponsor of Pennington Biomedical Research Center's 2nd Annual Parkinson's Conference, an education event for community members living with Parkinson's disease and their families and caregivers The Company provided information on rehabilitation and physical medicine services for the community

Note 3. Third-Party Reimbursement

The Hospital has agreements with third-party payors that provide for payments to the Hospital at amounts different from established rates. The primary third-party programs include Medicare and Medicaid, which account for a significant amount of the Hospital's revenue. A summary of the payment arrangements with major third-party payors follows.

Medicare - The Hospital is paid for inpatient acute care services rendered to Medicare program beneficiaries under prospectively determined rates-per-discharge. These rates vary according to a patient classification system that is based on clinical, diagnostic, and other factors. Final settlement is determined after submission of the Hospital's annual cost reports and audits thereof by the Medicare fiscal intermediary.

The Hospital's Medicare cost reports have been audited by the Medicare fiscal intermediary through September 30, 2009

Medicaid - Inpatient care services rendered to Medicaid program beneficiaries are paid at prospectively determined rates per day. Certain outpatient services rendered to Medicaid program beneficiaries are reimbursed under a cost reimbursement methodology. The Hospital is reimbursed at a tentative rate with final settlement determined after submission of annual cost reports by the Hospital and audits thereof by the Medicaid fiscal intermediary.

The Hospital's Medicaid cost reports have been audited by the Medicaid fiscal intermediary through September 30, 2007

During the years ended September 30, 2013 and 2012, approximately 39% and 44% of consolidated net patient service revenue was derived from Medicare and Medicaid program beneficiaries. Laws and regulations governing the Medicare and Medicaid programs are extremely complex and subject to interpretation. As a result, there is at least a reasonable possibility that recorded estimates will change by a material amount in the near term

Note 3. Third-Party Reimbursement (Continued)

The Hospital has entered into payment agreements with certain commercial insurance carriers, health maintenance organizations and preferred provider organizations. The basis for payment under these agreements includes prospectively determined rates-per-discharge, discounts from established charges and prospectively determined daily rates.

For patients who meet certain criteria under the Hospital's charity care policy, care is provided without charge or at amounts that are less than established rates. Benefits to the indigent also include charges foregone and costs in excess of government payments for services provided to Medicaid beneficiaries. Technological advances offered at the Hospital for many patient care services have increased both the options and the cost of "appropriate" care

The Hospital also commits significant time and resources to others who may not qualify as indigent, but who still require special services and support. These benefits include charges foregone and costs in excess of government payments for care provided to Medicare beneficiaries.

The Hospital follows ASU 2010-23, Health Care Entities (Topic 954) Measuring Charity Care for Disclosure, which requires that costs be used as the measurement basis of charity care disclosures and that cost be identified as the direct and indirect cost of providing the charity care

Note 7. Business and Credit Concentrations

Financial instruments which potentially subject the Hospital to concentrations of credit risk consist principally of unsecured accounts receivable and depository accounts in excess of federally insured limits. The Hospital has not experienced any losses and does not believe that significant credit risk exists as a result of this practice.

The Hospital grants credit to patients, substantially all of whom are regional residents, and generally does not require collateral or other security in extending this credit, however, the Hospital routinely obtains assignment of (or is otherwise entitled to receive) patients' benefits payable under their health insurance programs, plans, or policies (e.g., Medicare, Medicaid, and commercial insurance policies). Note 8. Long-Term Debt

On December 8, 2004, the Louisiana Public Facilities Authority issued the Series 2004 Bonds, for which BRGMC is obligated. The proceeds of the Series 2004 Bonds were used in refunding previously issued bond series, together with providing funds for (a) funding a \$98.1 million capital expansion of the Bluebonnet campus, including capitalized interest during the construction period, (b) funding a debt service reserve fund, and (c) paying certain costs incurred in connection with the issuance of the bonds. These bonds were defeased on December 4, 2012.

Note 8. Long-Term Debt (Continued)

On December 4, 2012, the Louisiana Public Facilities Authority, ("Series 2004 Bonds"), were defeased and new Government National Mortgage Association ("GNMA") taxable bonds were issued. This bond defeasance resulted in a loss on refunding which is shown in the non-operating loss on the Statement of Operations. The proceeds of the bonds were used for the purpose of advance refunding and defeasance of the nontaxable Series 2004 Bonds.

Note 11. Contingencies

Malpractice claims that fall within the Hospital's adopted policy of self-insurance (see Note 1) have been asserted against the Hospital by various claimants. The claims are in various stages of processing and some may ultimately be brought to trial

The accrual for malpractice and general liability self-insurance reserves, which is recorded on the Hospital's parent company (General Health System), totaled \$4,717,000 and \$3,958,000 at September 30, 2013 and 2012, respectively, of which \$750,000 is included in current liabilities at each of those dates. Based on management's best knowledge and belief, it is the opinion of management that the ultimate resolution of malpractice claims and incidents will not have a material effect on the Hospital's financial statements.

Note 12. Related Party Transactions

As mentioned in Note 1, the Hospital is an affiliate of GHS and purchases certain services For the year ended September 30, 2013, the Hospital incurred \$55,075,000 in service fees with GHS. For the year ended September 30, 2012, the costs incurred totaled \$48,496,000.

Note 13. Accounting for Uncertainty in Taxes

The Company adopted the provisions of the Accounting for Uncertainty in Income Taxes Topic of the FASB ASC. The Company recognizes a threshold and measurement process for financial statement recognition of uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken in a tax return. The interpretation also provides guidance on recognition, derecognition, classification, interest and penalties, accounting in interim periods, disclosure and transition. The Company's tax filings are subject to audit by various taxing authorities. The Company's open audit periods are years ended September 30, 2010 through September 30, 2012. There are currently no returns under examination. Management evaluated the Company's tax positions and considered that the Company had taken no uncertain tax positions that require adjustments to the financial statements to comply with the provisions of this guidance.
