

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Advisors Charitable Gift Fund, Inc. (the Fund), which comprise the statements of net assets as of October 31, 2013 and 2012, and the related statements of changes in net assets and cash flows for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles; this includes the design, implementation and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Nature of the Fund

i

Advisors Charitable Gift Fund, Inc. (the Fund) was created to promote and engage in charitable giving in the areas of education, culture, religion, health science, low-income housing and economic development, social services and overcoming poverty. The Fund also educates donors about the benefits of charitable giving to facilitate and simplify charitable giving by the public consistent with the foregoing purposes, reserving full control, ownership and discretion over donations.

1. <u>Summary of Significant Accounting Policies</u>

Basis of Presentation

The Fund is required under U.S. generally accepted accounting principles (U.S. GAAP) to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets, and permanently restricted net assets. The Fund had no temporarily or permanently restricted net assets at October 31, 2013 or 2012.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

The Fund maintains its cash in a bank deposit account which, at times, may exceed federally insured limits. The Fund has not experienced any losses in such account and believes it is not exposed to any significant risk with respect to this account. The Fund considers all highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less at the time of purchase to be cash equivalents.

Contributions

Contributions received are recorded as unrestricted, temporarily restricted, or permanently restricted depending on the existence or nature of any donor restrictions. Donor-restricted contributions whose restrictions are met in the same year are reflected as unrestricted contributions in the accompanying financial statements. The Fund had no temporarily or permanently restricted contributions for the years ended October 31, 2013 and 2012.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are stated at fair value, with the difference between cost and fair value being included in unrealized gains or losses. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividend income is recorded on the ex-dividend date. Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade date basis. Realized gains or losses on investments sold are calculated using the average cost method.

Income Taxes

The Fund is a not-for-profit corporation and is recognized as income tax exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (the Code).

Risks and Uncertainties

The Fund provides for various investment options in actively managed funds. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the various risk factors, in the near term, could materially affect the amounts reported in the financial statements.

2. Funding of the Fund and Description of Expenses

Funding a Donor Account

Gifts may be received from individuals, corporations, partnerships, trusts, other donor advised fund accounts or estates. Receipt of contributions by the Fund may be limited from time to time by government rules and law. The effective date of a charitable gift is the date the Fund has effective control of the asset contributed. A Donor Account may be funded from multiple sources. The minimum gift accepted by the Fund is established by the Directors and may change from time to time. As of October 31, 2013 and 2012, the minimum gift is \$5,000. There is no maximum gift limit set by the Fund. After a Donor Account is established, additional contributions may be made in amounts of \$500 or more.

The following gifts are accepted:

- Cash
- Securities (i.e., publicly traded stocks, bonds and mutual funds)
- Annuities
- Bequests
- · Charitable gift annuity residual
- Charitable remainder trust assignments
- Charitable lead trust assignments
- Life insurance beneficiary designations
- Retirement plan distributions and beneficiary designations including traditional IRA (Individual Retirement Accounts)

All gifts, including the gift of property, to the Fund are irrevocable and nonrefundable. The assets of a Donor Account are a portion of the Fund's endowment and property of the Fund.

Fees and Expenses

Grants

The Fund recognizes an expense for grants to be paid, once they have been authorized by the Donor and management under the methods approved by the Directors for payment. Approved grants are recorded when the recipient organization meets all conditions set forth by management.

Expenses Associated with Gifts

Some gifts incur transaction costs. For instance, publicly traded stock is typically sold upon receipt. In addition, a Donor may incur expenses prior to the gifting of an asset. The gift of restricted securities may require legal and appraisal services. These costs are borne by the Donor.

Donor Accounting Services

A Donor Account is assessed a fee for the administration of the Fund and record keeping accounts. A Donor with multiple Donor Accounts is assessed a fee for each account based on the assets in that account. The fee schedule is as follows:

Initial (minimum) annual fee \$140	
\$20,000 through \$499,999	0.85% of average daily balance
\$500,000 through \$999,999	0.70% of average daily balance
\$1 million through \$2,499,999	0.50% of average daily balance
\$2.5 million and greater	0.40% of average daily balance

Each fee is prorated quarterly and withdrawn from Donor Accounts on the last day of each month.

Custody and Investment Expense

Custody of the Fund's endowment is maintained by a trust company. Custody expenses are passed through to the Donor Account. The endowment may be invested in one or more mutual funds. Mutual funds charge for investment and financial expertise.

3. Donor Advisement

A Donor may be an individual, corporation, partnership, trust, other donor advised fund account or estate. A Donor can:

- Advise the Fund on the investment of his/her account's assets;
- Advise the Fund on the granting of his/her account's assets to qualified public nonprofits;
- Appoint a successor to advise the Fund on the investment and granting of the funds in his/her accounts; and
- Advise the Fund regarding charitable beneficiary(ies) (qualified public nonprofit) for receipt of the assets of his/her account upon death or in the event that the named successor is unable to fulfill his or her responsibility.

The Fund's Directors administer the program. Improper use of the Fund such as use of the Fund in a manner that is inconsistent with regulations found in Sections 170(b)(1)(A)(iv) and 501(c)(3) of the Code can cause a Donor's ability to advise the Fund to be restricted or ended.

5. Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures

Fair value is the exchange price that would be received for an asset or paid to transfer a liability (an exit price) in the principal or most advantageous market for the asset or liability in an orderly transaction between market participants on the measurement date. A fair value hierarchy requires an entity to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs when measuring fair value. The three levels of inputs that may be used to measure fair value are:

Level 1: Quoted prices (unadjusted) for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the entity has the ability to access as of the measurement date.

Level 2: Significant other observable inputs other than Level 1 prices, such as quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities, quoted prices in markets that are not active, and other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data.

Level 3: Significant unobservable inputs that reflect the Fund's own assumptions about the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing an asset or liability.

6. Related Party Transactions

The Fund is a philanthropic holding vehicle for donor advised funds, contributions to which are taken as a tax deduction in the year given and can accumulate to be granted out in the future. Northeast Retirement Services, Inc. (NRS), a related party through common management control, has a contract with the Fund for the provision of services. Deposits in the amount of \$2,200 were paid by NRS on behalf of the Fund and are payable on demand. As of October 31, 2013 and 2012, no amount of the deposits has been repaid to NRS.

Administrative fees to NRS for the years ended October 31, 2013 and 2012 were \$26,001 and \$22,590, respectively. There were no administrative fees owed to NRS as of October 31, 2013 and 2012.
