Taxpayer has self-assessed a \$15,575 excise tax for failure to distribute the required minimum distribution for FYE 10/31/2013. Taxpayer herein respectfully requests abatement of this tax as the failure to distribute was not based on wilful neglect but by a misunderstanding of the amount due, or reasonable cause. As soon as the tax preparer notified taxpayer of the shortage for FYE 2013, it was immediately corrected by taxpayer. All distributions are current as of this date, as they will be in the future. Taxpayer has not received a notification by the IRS of additional tax due as a result of this distribution shortage.

This foundation has been active for many decades and has never made less than the required minimum distribution in any year. In fact, in many years the distributions were in excess of the required amount. Due to confusion caused primarily by the fact that the Foundation has a fiscal year, the oral advice given by the tax preparer on October 15, 2013 to taxpayer was incorrect. It was based on the prior fiscal year's minimum distribution requirement, which was \$50,000. Thus, the taxpayer assumed that the amount stated as required of \$53,000 seemed in line. This is reasonable cause for the error in distribution amounts.

It is therefore respectfully requested that this first tier tax be abated under IRS Code Section 4962, as the under-distribution was caused by confusing advice from the tax preparer and not from taxpayer's wilful neglect. As stated above, this shortage was immediately corrected before April 3, 2014 by the taxpayer upon notification by tax preparer, or within a few months of year end. All future minimum distributions will be made timely and correctly.

Please notify taxpayer of this requested abatement, as payment is not being made with the Form 4720.
