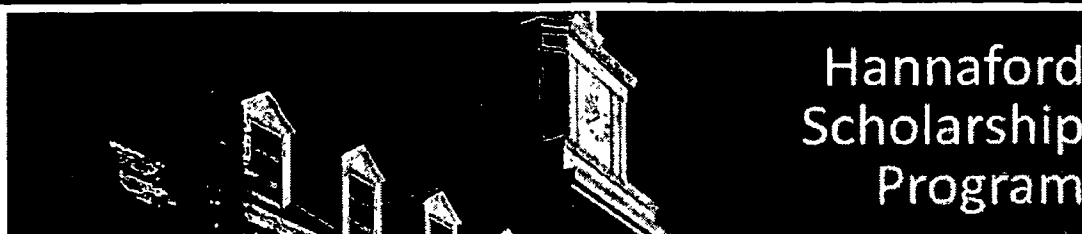

ELIGIBILITY

Applicants to the Hannaford Scholarship Program must be -

- Full-time or part-time associates of Hannaford or dependent children* of associates with a minimum of six-months service as of the application deadline date, and
**Child is defined as the son, daughter, stepson, stepdaughter, legally adopted child or legal ward supported principally by the associate.*
- High school seniors or graduates planning to enroll or students already enrolled in full-time study leading to a baccalaureate or master's degree at an accredited college or university, an associate degree at a junior or community college, or a certificate at an approved vocational-technical institute.

AWARDS

If selected as a recipient, the student will receive an award ranging from \$2,000 to \$5,000. Up to fifty scholarships may be awarded each year.
