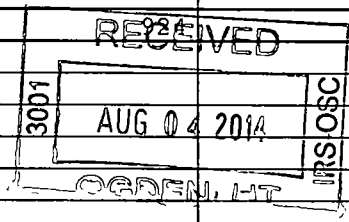

BACHMAN FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

ELIGIBILITY

To be considered for a scholarship under current selection procedures, a candidate:

- (1) Must be a high school senior (or academic equivalent) or have graduated from high school
- (2) Must be either qualified upon graduation to enroll in, currently enrolled in or eligible to currently enroll in an accredited four-year college or university or recognized and legitimate vocational training school.
- (3) Must submit to Bachman Foundation a chosen college major or other course of study.
- (4) Cumulative point average must be at least B.

BASIS FOR DETERMINING SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS

Applicants are required to submit their scores, if any, from the College Entrance Examination Board Scholastic Aptitude Test or American College Test.

Winners of scholarships are selected on the basis of scholastic ability and other available information, which indicates achievement, leadership, college, career potential, and financial need.

SELECTION OF SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS

The initial screening of applicants will be done by the Board of Directors of Bachman Foundation. Finalists will be interviewed by representatives of Bachman Foundation. The decision of this committee is final.

AMOUNT AND DURATION OF SCHOLARSHIPS

This scholarship provides payment of all or a part of the student's tuition, assuming satisfactory progress and grade averages. Payment is made directly to the college or university upon evidence that the student has qualified and been accepted for admission. Students must carry the college's minimum requirements to be classified as a full-time student.

It is expected that the scholarship will be continued through the normal four-year period of the student's college undergraduate studies or the normal period of the student's other course of study, subject to compliance by the grantee with all of the terms and conditions of the scholarship program. In the case of a four-year course of study, this contemplates tuition payments for eight (8) semesters or twelve (12) quarters, depending on the system used by the school attended. The student is encouraged to take the usual

rest periods from scholastic studies and, therefore, no provision will normally be made for summer sessions or for more than three quarters in any one school year.

SELECTION OF COURSE AND COLLEGE

Subject to the approval of Bachman Foundation, the scholarship recipient is required to enroll in any accredited four-year college or university or recognized and legitimate vocational training school in the first term following the award.

ADMISSION TO COLLEGE

It will be the responsibility of each scholarship winner to select his/her college, university, or other school and courses and to personally take all steps necessary for admission to the school of his/her choice.

In selecting a school, candidates should study the course offerings, the tuition and other costs, the closing date for filing of applications for admission and the tests (if any) which candidates for admission are required to take. If the chosen school requires specific tests, the scholarship winner will be responsible for making his/her own arrangements to take such tests.

OBLIGATIONS OF SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS

Recipients of the scholarship must enroll and provide Bachman Foundation with written confirmation of enrollment in an approved course and institution in the first fall term following award of the scholarship in order to qualify for scholarship benefits, and must continue to carry a full academic program toward graduation within the normal period of attendance. If personal or family problems necessitate a delay or interruption of enrollment, the student must obtain prior written approval from Bachman Foundation of such delay or interruption in order to retain scholarship benefits.

If it becomes necessary or desirable for a scholarship recipient to change or transfer to a different institution, advance written approval must first be obtained from Bachman Foundation. Tuition payments may be adjusted according to rates charged by various institutions; however, no such transfer may have the effect of increasing the total amount of scholarship benefits originally available to a scholarship winner. Transfers ordinarily are not permitted except at the end of regular academic year.

Each scholarship grantee must maintain academic progress and personal conduct acceptable to Bachman Foundation and to the college, university or other school in which enrolled. Unless special circumstances are present, Bachman Foundation will expect all scholarship grantees to maintain a grade average of B at the school in which enrolled.

In addition, each scholarship recipient is expected to contribute towards his/her own financial support by maintaining employment of at least ten hours per week during the school year and forty hours per week during summer vacation.

Scholarship recipients must each term authorize their school or college to furnish transcripts of their grades the previous term and proof of enrollment for the next term before any disbursement can be made under this scholarship grant, and must, upon request, authorize their institutions to provide any other information required by Bachman Foundation. Each scholarship recipient must at the beginning of each term provide Bachman Foundation with the name(s) and address(es) of his/her employer(s), the number of hours of employment per week and salary received since the last such report.

CONTINUANCE OF SCHOLARSHIPS

Provided that the student complies with all requirements of the Scholarship Program, including the obligations stated above, it is contemplated that a scholarship will be continued through the normal course of study or until the requirements for a degree or graduation are completed, whichever is earlier.

MILITARY SERVICE

A Bachman Foundation scholarship student who voluntarily enlists in one of the armed forces of the United States for one period of service may apply for reinstatement under the Scholarship Program upon his/her release from service. Normally such application should be made within three months of discharge, and re-enrollment in school should occur not later than the next succeeding school year.

GENERAL PROVISIONS

It is the intent of Bachman Foundation that no scholarship will be discontinued short of its full term except for failure of the student to maintain qualification in accordance with the conditions set forth in this report. However, Bachman Foundation reserves the right to modify or discontinue the program, in whole or in part, at any time.

No responsibility is assumed by Bachman Foundation for personal conduct of scholarship candidates or winners.

The mutual obligations of Bachman Foundation scholarship winners are limited to those set forth herein.
