# EXHIBIT A (By-Laws)

#### **BY-LAWS**

OF

### VITAL PROJECTS FUND, INC.

(formed under the New York Not-for-Profit Corporation Law)

(Amended as of April 16, 2013)

#### ARTICLE I

#### Members

Section 1.1. Who Shall be Members; Qualifications. The members of the Corporation shall consist of Robert B. Menschel and such other individuals as may be elected to membership from time to time by the then-acting members (either by majority vote at any meeting in accordance with Section 1.11 of these By-Laws, or on unanimous written consent, in accordance with Section 1.12 of these By-Laws), and such other individuals as may accept designation as successor members as provided in Section 1.3. Any member shall be at least eighteen years of age. New members shall accept their position by written acceptance delivered to the Secretary of the Corporation. If at any time there shall be no members of the Corporation as hereinabove provided, and no persons designated as successor members as provided in Section 1.3, the board of directors shall elect such individuals (who may include, without limitation, individuals who are then serving on the board of directors) in such number as the board of directors selects to serve as members hereunder.

Section 1.2. <u>Transfer and Term of Membership</u>. Membership in the Corporation shall not be transferable. Unless a shorter term shall be specified by the other members at the time of a member's election as provided in Section 1.4 hereof, the term of office of any member shall end upon such member's death, resignation or incapacity. Any member may resign at any time by mailing or delivering written notice to the Secretary of the Corporation (any resignation to take effect as specified therein or, if not specified, upon receipt by the Secretary).

Section 1.3. <u>Successor Members</u>. In addition to the power of the then-acting members to elect new members by majority vote, each member shall have the power to designate one person to succeed such member in membership, effective when, for any reason, such member ceases to be a member. Robert B. Menschel shall have the special power under this section to designate as many individuals as he selects to succeed him in membership, such individuals to serve as members or as limited members (as defined in Section 1.4), depending upon the terms of his designation for each member so selected. All designations

- Section 1.4. <u>Limited Members</u>. The members of the Corporation shall have the power to designate certain members upon their election as limited members, to serve for a term as specified at their election. Such limited members shall have all of the rights and powers of a member under these By-Laws, except that no limited member shall have the power to vote to appoint any other person as a member, to designate a successor member or to vote to extend the membership term of any limited member.
- Section 1.5. <u>Annual Meeting</u>. The annual meeting of the members shall be held on the second Wednesday in April in each year for the purpose of electing directors and transacting any other business authorized to be transacted by the members. If the day so designated falls upon a legal holiday, then the meeting shall be held at the same time on the first business day thereafter.
- Section 1.6. <u>Power of Members to Elect and Remove Board of Directors</u>. The members of the Corporation shall have the power to elect the members of the board of directors pursuant to Sections 2.3 and 2.9 hereof and to remove members of the board of directors pursuant to Section 2.8 hereof.
- Section 1.7. <u>Special Meetings</u>. Special meetings of the members may be called at any time for any purpose by the Chairman of the Board and shall be called by him or her whenever so requested in writing by one of the directors or a majority of the members.
- Section 1.8. <u>Place of Meetings</u>. The annual meeting and any special meeting of members may be held at the principal office of the Corporation or at such other place within or without the State of New York as may be designated in the notice of such meeting.
- Section 1.9. Notice of Meetings and Waiver. Notice of the annual meeting or of a special meeting of members shall state the time, place and purpose or purposes thereof, and shall be given to each member of record no less than ten (10) nor more than forty (40) days prior to the meeting if an annual meeting, and not less than five (5) days prior to the meeting if a special meeting. Notice shall be deemed effectively given when mailed if sent by regular mail addressed to the member for whom intended at such member's last address appearing on the records of the Corporation, or when actually received by such member if given in any other manner. Any notice hereinabove required may at any time be waived in writing by the member entitled thereto or by such member's duly authorized representative.
- Section 1.10. Quorum. Unless otherwise provided by law, it shall be necessary for a majority of the members to be present in person or by proxy to constitute a quorum at any meeting of the members.
- Section 1.11. <u>Voting</u>. At all meetings of members each member may vote in person or by proxy and shall, for all purposes, have one vote. All questions, the manner of deciding which is not specifically regulated by statute, shall be determined by a majority of the members.
- Section 1.12. <u>Action by Members Without a Meeting</u>. Whenever all members, or all members entitled to vote on any action, are required or permitted to take any

action by vote, such action may be taken without a meeting on written consent, setting forth the action so taken, signed by all of the members entitled to vote thereon. Written consent thus given by all members entitled to vote shall have the same effect as a unanimous vote of members and any certificate with respect to the authorization or taking of any such action which is delivered to the Department of State shall recite that the authorization was by unanimous consent.

#### ARTICLE II

#### **Board of Directors**

- Section 2.1. <u>Power of Board and Qualifications of Directors</u>. The Corporation shall be managed by its Board of Directors. Each director shall be at least eighteen years of age. Directors may also be members of the Corporation.
- Section 2.2. <u>Number of Directors</u>. The number of directors constituting the entire Board of Directors shall be at least three. The number of directors may be increased or decreased at any time and from time to time by amendment of these By-Laws, by vote of the members or by a majority vote of the entire Board, provided that in the event of conflicting actions by the members and by the Board of Directors, the action of the members shall prevail, provided that no decrease shall shorten the term of an incumbent director and provided further that the number of directors shall never be less than three.
- Section 2.3. <u>Election and Term of Directors</u>. At each annual meeting of the members, the members shall elect directors, each director to hold office for a term of one year until the next annual meeting of the members and until his successor has been elected, except as provided in Sections 2.7 and 2.8 hereof.
- Section 2.4. Quorum of Directors and Action by the Board. Unless a greater proportion is required by law or by the Certificate of Incorporation, one-third of the entire Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business or of any specified item of business, and, except as otherwise provided by law or by the Certificate of Incorporation or these By-Laws, the vote of a majority of the directors present at the meeting at the time of such vote, if a quorum is then present, shall be the act of the Board.

The Certificate of Incorporation or By-Laws may be amended to provide for a greater quorum or to provide for a greater number of directors that shall be necessary for the transaction of business or any specified item of business, provided such amendment is authorized by vote of two-thirds of the entire Board.

Section 2.5. <u>Meetings of the Board</u>. An annual meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held in each year directly after the annual meeting of members.

Regular meetings of the Board shall be held at such times as may be fixed by the Board. Special meetings of the Board may be held at any time whenever called by the

Chairman of the Board, if any, the Vice-Chairman of the Board, if any, the President or any two directors.

Meetings of the Board of Directors may be held at such places within or without the State of New York as may be fixed by the Board for annual and regular meetings and in the notice of meeting for special meetings.

No notice need be given of annual or regular meetings of the Board of Directors. Notice of each special meeting of the Board shall be given to each director either by regular or electronic mail not later than noon, New York time, on the fifth business day prior to the meeting or by written message hand-delivered to each director not later than noon, New York time, on the second business day prior to the meeting. Notices shall be deemed to have been given by regular mail when deposited in the United States mail, by electronic mail when such notice is sent and by messenger at the time of delivery by the messenger. Notices by mail or messenger shall be sent to each director at the address designated by such director for that purpose, or, if none has been so designated, at such director's last known residence or business address. Notices by electronic mail shall be sent to each director at the electronic mail address designated by such director for that purpose. Oral or telephonic notices of meetings shall not be permitted.

A notice, or waiver of notice, need not specify the purpose of any meeting of the Board of Directors.

Notice of a meeting of the Board of Directors need not be given to any director who submits a signed waiver of notice whether before or after the meeting, or who attends the meeting without protesting, either prior to or at the commencement of such meeting, the lack of notice to such director.

A majority of the directors present, whether or not a quorum is present, may adjourn any meeting to another time and place. Notice of any adjournment of a meeting to another time or place shall be given in the manner described above to the directors who were not present at the time of the adjournment and, unless such time and place are announced at the meeting, to the other directors.

Section 2.6. <u>Informal Action by Directors: Meetings by Electronic</u>

<u>Conference.</u> Unless otherwise restricted by the Certificate of Incorporation or these By-Laws, any action required or permitted to be taken by the Board may be taken without a meeting if all directors consent in writing to the adoption of a resolution authorizing the action. The resolution and the written consents thereto by the directors shall be filed with the minutes of proceedings of the Board.

Unless otherwise restricted by the Certificate of Incorporation or these By-Laws, the directors or any committee designated by the Board may participate in a meeting of the Board or of any committee, by means of conference telephone, video conference or similar communications equipment by means of which all persons participating in the meeting can hear each other at the same time, and such participation shall constitute presence in person at the meeting.

- Section 2.7. <u>Resignations</u>. Any director of the Corporation may resign at any time by giving written notice to the Board of Directors or to the President or to the Secretary of the Corporation. Such resignation shall take effect at the time specified therein, and unless otherwise specified therein no acceptance of such resignation shall be necessary to make it effective.
- Section 2.8. <u>Removal of Directors</u>. Any one or more or all of the directors may be removed with or without cause at any time by unanimous action of the members, provided that written notice of such director's removal is given to the director so removed.
- Section 2.9. <u>Newly-Created Directorships and Vacancies</u>. Newly-created directorships, resulting from an increase in the number of directors, and vacancies, occurring in the Board of Directors for any reason, shall be filled by vote of the members at the next annual meeting or a special meeting called for that purpose.
- Section 2.10. <u>Purchase, Sale, Mortgage or Lease of Real Property</u>. No purchase of real property shall be made by the Corporation, nor shall the Corporation sell, mortgage or lease its real property, unless authorized by the vote of two-thirds of the entire Board of Directors.
- Section 2.11. <u>Annual Report</u>. The Board of Directors shall direct the President and Treasurer of the Corporation to present at the annual meeting of the members a report, verified by the President and Treasurer or by a majority of the members of the Board of Directors, or certified by an independent or certified public accountant or a firm of such accountants selected by the Board, showing in detail the following:
  - (1) the assets and liabilities, including the trust funds, of the Corporation as of the end of a twelve-month fiscal period terminating not more than six months prior to said meeting;
  - (2) the principal changes in assets and liabilities, including trust funds, during said fiscal period;
  - (3) the revenue or receipts of the Corporation, both unrestricted and restricted to particular purposes, during said fiscal period;
  - (4) the expenses or disbursements of the Corporation, for both general and restricted purposes, during said fiscal period; and
  - (5) the number of members of the Corporation as of the date of the report together with a statement of increase or decrease in such number during said fiscal period, and a statement of the place where the names and places of residence of current members may be found.

The annual report shall be filed with the records of the Corporation and a copy or abstract thereof entered in the minutes of the proceedings of the annual meeting of the members.

#### ARTICLE III

#### Committees

Section 3.1. Executive Committee and Other Standing Committees. The Board of Directors, by resolution adopted by a majority of the entire Board, may designate from among the directors an Executive Committee and other standing committees, each consisting of three or more directors, and each of which, to the extent provided in the resolution, shall have all the authority of the Board, except that no such committee shall have authority as to the following matters:

- (1) submission to members of any action with respect to which members' approval is required by law;
  - (2) filling vacancies in the Board of Directors or in any committee;
- (3) fixing compensation of the directors for serving on the Board or on any committee;
  - (4) amending or repealing the By-Laws or adopting new By-Laws;
- (5) amending or repealing any resolution of the Board which by its terms cannot be amended or repealed; or
  - (6) removing directors.

The Board may designate one or more directors as alternate members of any standing committee who may replace any absent member or members at any meeting of such committee.

Section 3.2. Additional Special Committees. The Board of Directors may create such additional special committees as it deems desirable, the members thereof to be appointed by the Chairman of the Board or the President of the Corporation if there is no Chairman of the Board, with the consent of the Board. Such special committees shall have only the powers specifically delegated to them by the Board and in no case shall have powers which are not authorized for standing committees.

Section 3.3. <u>Committees Other Than Standing or Special</u>. Committees other than standing or special committees of the Board shall be committees of the Corporation. Such committees may be elected or appointed in the same manner as officers of the Corporation. Provisions of these By-Laws and the Not-for-Profit Corporation Law applicable to officers generally shall apply to members of such committees.

Section 3 4. Committee Rules. Unless the Board of Directors otherwise provides, each committee designated by the Board may make, alter and repeal rules for the conduct of its business. In the absence of a contrary provision by the Board of Directors or in rules adopted by such committee, a majority of the entire authorized number of members of each committee shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, the vote of a majority of the members present at a meeting at the time of such vote if a quorum is then present shall be the act of such committee, and each committee shall otherwise conduct its business in the same manner as the Board of Directors conducts its business under Article II of these By-Laws. Unless otherwise restricted by the Certificate of Incorporation or these By-Laws, any action required or permitted to be taken by such committee may be taken without a meeting if all members of such committee consent in writing to the adoption of a resolution authorizing the action. The resolution and the written consents thereto by the members of the committee shall be filed with the minutes of proceedings of such committee.

Section 3.5. <u>Service of Committees</u>. Each committee of the Board shall serve at the pleasure of the Board. The designation of any such committee and the delegation thereto of authority shall not alone relieve any director of such director's duty under the law to the Corporation.

#### ARTICLE IV

#### Officers

Section 4.1. Officers. The Board of Directors shall elect or appoint a President, a Secretary and a Treasurer, and it may, if it so determines, choose a Chairman of the Board and a Vice-Chairman of the Board from among its members. The Board may also elect or appoint one or more Vice-Presidents, Assistant Vice-Presidents, Assistant Secretaries, Assistant Treasurers and other officers and may give any of them such further designation or alternate titles as it considers desirable. Any two or more offices may be held by the same person except the offices of President and Secretary.

Section 4.2. <u>Term of Office and Removal</u>. Each officer shall hold office for the term for which such officer is elected or appointed and until such officer's successor has been elected or appointed. All officers shall be elected or appointed annually. Any officer may be removed by the Board of Directors or by the members, with or without cause at any time. Removal of an officer without cause shall be without prejudice to such officer's contract rights, if any, and the election or appointment of an officer shall not of itself create contract rights.

Section 4.3. <u>Powers and Duties of Officers</u>. Subject to the control of the Board, all officers as between themselves and the Corporation shall have such authority and perform such duties in the management of the Corporation as may be provided by the Board of Directors and, to the extent not so provided, as generally pertain to their respective offices. The Board may require any officer to give security for the faithful performance of such officer's duties.

Section 4.4. <u>Salaries of Officers</u>. The fixing of salaries of officers shall require the affirmative vote of a majority of the entire Board of Directors.

#### ARTICLE V

#### Indemnification and Insurance

Section 5.1. <u>Indemnification</u>. The Corporation shall indemnify each person made or threatened to be made a party to any action or proceeding, whether civil or criminal, by reason of the fact that such person or such person's testator or intestate is or was a director or officer of the Corporation, or serves or served at the request of the Corporation any other corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust, employee benefit plan or other enterprise in any capacity, against judgments, fines, penalties, amounts paid in settlement and reasonable expenses, including attorneys' fees, incurred in connection with such action or proceeding, or any appeal therein, provided that no such indemnification shall be made if a judgment or other final adjudication adverse to such person establishes that his or her acts were committed in bad faith or were the result of active and deliberate dishonesty and were material to the cause of action so adjudicated, or that he or she personally gained in fact a financial profit or other advantage to which he or she was not legally entitled, and provided further that no such indemnification shall be required with respect to any settlement or other nonadjudicated disposition of any threatened or pending action or proceeding unless the Corporation has given its prior consent to such settlement or other disposition.

The Corporation shall advance or promptly reimburse upon request any person entitled to indemnification hereunder for all expenses, including attorneys' fees reasonably incurred in defending any action or proceeding in advance of the final disposition thereof upon receipt of any undertaking by or on behalf of such person to repay such amount if such person is ultimately found not to be entitled to indemnification or, where indemnification is granted, to the extent the expenses so advanced or reimbursed exceed the amount to which such person is entitled, provided, however, that such person shall cooperate in good faith with any request by the Corporation that common counsel be utilized by the parties to an action or proceeding who are similarly situated unless to do so would be inappropriate due to actual or potential differing interests between or among such parties.

Nothing herein shall limit or affect any right of any person otherwise than hereunder to indemnification or expenses, including attorneys' fees, under any statute, rule, regulation, certificate of incorporation, by-law, insurance policy, contract or otherwise.

In case any provision in this By-Law shall be determined at any time to be unenforceable in any respect, the other provisions shall not in any way be affected or impaired thereby, and the affected provision shall be given the fullest possible enforcement in the circumstances, it being the intention of the Corporation to afford indemnifications and advancement of expenses to its directors and officers, acting in such capacities or in the other capacities mentioned herein, to the fullest extent permitted by law.

A person who has been successful, on the merits or otherwise, in the defense of a civil or criminal action or proceeding of the character described in the first paragraph of this By-Law shall be entitled to indemnification as authorized in such paragraph. Except as provided in the preceding sentence and unless ordered by a court, any indemnification under this By-Law shall be made by the Corporation if, and only if, authorized in the specific case:

- (1) By the Board of Directors acting by a quorum consisting of directors who are not parties to such action or proceeding upon a finding that the director or officer has met the standard of conduct set forth in the first paragraph of this By-Law, or,
- (2) If such a quorum is not obtainable or, even if obtainable, a quorum of disinterested directors so directs:
  - (a) By the Board of Directors upon the opinion in writing of independent legal counsel that indemnification is proper in the circumstances because the standard of conduct set forth in the first paragraph of this By-Law has been met by such director or officer, or
  - (b) By the members upon a finding that the director or officer has met the applicable standard of conduct set forth in such paragraph.

Section 5.2. <u>Insurance</u>. The Corporation shall have the power to purchase and maintain insurance to indemnify the Corporation for any obligation which it incurs as a result of the indemnification of directors and officers under the provisions of Section 5.1 hereof, to indemnify directors and officers in instances in which they may be indemnified by the Corporation under the provisions of Section 5.1 hereof, and to indemnify directors and officers in instances in which they may not otherwise be indemnified by the Corporation under the provisions of Section 5.1 hereof, provided that, in this latter case, all legal requirements be met with regard to the contract of insurance.

Section 5.3. <u>Conditions for Indemnification and Insurance</u>. This Article shall, in no event, be construed to authorize any act of self-dealing within the meaning of § 4941 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), any other act expressly prohibited by the Code or the New York Not-for-Profit Corporation Law, or any other applicable law.

#### ARTICLE VI

Section 6.1. <u>Interested Directors and Officers</u>. No contract or other transaction between the Corporation and one or more of its directors or officers, or between the Corporation and any other corporation, firm, association or other entity in which one or more of its directors or officers are directors or officers, or have a substantial financial interest, shall be either void or voidable, irrespective of whether such interested director or directors or officers are present at a meeting of the Board of Directors or of a

committee thereof which authorizes such contract or transaction and irrespective of whether his, her or their votes are counted for such purpose. In the absence of fraud any such contract or transaction may be conclusively authorized or approved as fair and reasonable by:

- (1) The Board of Directors or a duly empowered committee thereof by vote sufficient for such purpose without counting the vote or votes of such interested director or officer (although he, she or they may be counted in determining the presence of a quorum at the meeting which authorizes or approves such contract or transaction), if the material facts as to such director's or officer's interest in such contract or transaction and as to any common directorship, officership or financial interest are disclosed in good faith or known to the Board or committee as the case may be; or
- (2) The members entitled to vote thereon, if any, if the material facts as to such director's or officer's interest in such contract or transaction and as to any such common directorship, officership or financial interest are disclosed in good faith or known to such members.

If there was no such disclosure or knowledge, or if the vote of such interested director or officer was necessary for the authorization of such contract or transaction at a meeting of the Board of Directors or committee at which it was authorized, the Corporation may void the contract or transaction unless the party or parties thereto establish affirmatively that the contract or transaction was fair and reasonable as to the Corporation at the time it was authorized by the Board of Directors, a committee or the members. If the sole interest of a director or officer is that he or she is on the Board of Directors of a grantee, such interest does not constitute a conflict of interest.

Section 6.2. <u>Loans to Directors and Officers</u>. No loans, other than through the purchase of bonds, debentures or similar obligations of the type customarily sold in public offerings, or through ordinary deposit of funds in a bank, shall be made by the Corporation to its directors or officers, or to any other corporation, firm, association or other entity in which one or more of its directors or officers are directors or officers or hold a substantial financial interest except that the Corporation may make a loan to any corporation which is a Type B corporation under the Not-for-Profit Corporation Law of the State of New York.

Section 6.3. <u>Conditions for Loans or Other Transactions</u>. This Article shall, in no event, be construed to authorize any act of self-dealing within the meaning of § 4941 of the Code, or any other act expressly prohibited by the Code, the New York Not-for-Profit Corporation Law or any other applicable law.

ARTICLE VII

Miscellaneous

Section 7.1. <u>Fiscal Year</u>. The fiscal year of the Corporation shall be the calendar year or such other period as may be fixed by the Board of Directors.

Section 7.2. <u>Corporate Scal</u>. The corporate scal shall have the name of the Corporation inscribed thereon and shall be in such form as may be approved from time to time by the Board of Directors.

Section 7.3. <u>Books and Records to be Kept</u>. The Corporation shall keep at its principal office in the State of New York, (a) correct and complete books and records of account, (b) minutes of the proceedings of the Board of Directors and any committee of the Corporation and (c) a current list of the directors and officers of the Corporation and their residence addresses. Any of the books, minutes and records of the Corporation may be in written form or in any other form capable of being converted into written form within a reasonable time.

Section 7.4. <u>Amendment of By-Laws</u>. By-Laws of the Corporation may be adopted, amended or repealed by the Board of Directors or by the members at the time entitled to vote in the election of directors. Any By-Law adopted by the Board of Directors may be amended or repealed by the members.

If any By-Law regulating an impending election of directors is adopted, amended or repealed by the Board of Directors, there shall be set forth in the notice of the next meeting of the members for the election of directors the By-Law so adopted, amended or repealed, together with a concise statement of the changes made.
