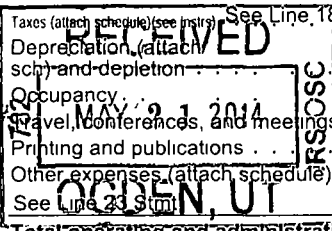

The Foundation has no paid staff. The directors meet only once a year, for the annual meeting of directors, usually in December, at which time unsolicited requests for grants are brought to their attention.

The Foundation does not make grants to individuals and does not accept unsolicited applications for funds from individuals.
