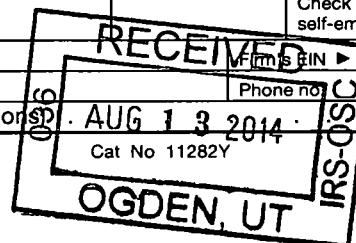

The fund is managed with the goal of generating enough funds to distribute scholarships while maintaining the long-term viability. Until the SSMF has a five year history of investment returns, the annual distribution rate will not exceed 4% of the prior year's principal balance.

The WFH Research Program encourages international collaborations to support epidemiological and clinical research that will build the evidence base for the optimal management of inherited bleeding disorders. It fills a unique need within the global community and has great potential to add value to the existing evidence base.

The Board of Directors of WFH USA agreed to designate the WFH Research Program as an Additional Approved Project as defined in the Fiscal Sponsorship agreement between the WFH USA and WFH.

In accordance with this agreement, the WFH USA solicited donors based in the United States to support the Research Program. Raised funds (\$150,000) were granted to the WFH to financially support the program.

Procedures for humanitarian aid shipments: Humanitarian aid donations are sent to either governmental hospitals where there is a Hemophilia Treatment Center or to Registered Hemophilia Associations in the recipient countries. They are sent by international couriers such as Fedex, DHL and Aramex. The international courier requires us to provide them with specific information such as the contact name, address and telephone number where the shipment will be sent.

The international courier provides us with an airway bill with a tracking number to track the shipment and to ensure that the shipment has been delivered and signed by the person it was addressed to in the recipient country. We require that the recipient countries send us an acknowledgment of receipt form that is to be signed by the person that the shipment was addressed to or their representative. The acknowledgment of receipt specifies what product has been sent, brand name, manufacturer, lot number, quantity of the product and expiry date. In addition to this we ask the recipient countries to provide a detailed utilization report.

Contributed services & grant for charitable state registrations

Effective January 1, 2011 World Federation of Hemophilia USA and WFH signed a Services Agreement whereby WFH provides certain administrative and other services to WFH USA, certain of those services are provided without compensation and the rest of those services are provided solely for reimbursement by WFH USA. In 2013, the administrative services provided by WFH without compensation totaled to \$161,349. In accordance with the same agreement, WFH issued a grant of \$10,000 to the WFH USA to cover state charitable registration costs.

Grant for approved projects

Effective January 1, 2011 World Federation of Hemophilia USA and WFH signed a Fiscal Sponsorship Agreement whereby WFH USA financially supports additional, specific projects or initiatives developed by WFH that have been approved by the Board of Directors of WFH USA ("Additional Approved Projects"). The Board of Directors of WFH USA has agreed that the WFH Research Program can be designated as an Additional Approved Project as defined in the Fiscal Sponsorship agreement.

The sole paid employee of the WFH USA is the National Director and his salary is listed in the Part IX, line 5.

Under the Services Agreement, the administrative and fund-raising services are provided by WFH without compensation. These services are recorded as expenses and the equivalent amount is shown as a grant-in-kind in the revenue section.

1. **Attraction of Public Support.** WFH USA is organized and operated so as to attract new and additional public support on a continuous basis. Through a Services Agreement with its Canadian affiliate, World Federation of Hemophilia ("WFH"), WFH USA maintains a continuous and *bona fide* program for solicitation of funds from the general public, as well as engaging in activities designed to attract in-kind donations of clotting factor and other pharmaceutical products from multiple sources. Hemophilia treatment products received as donations are distributed to as many as 50 developing countries each year for treatment of thousands of people with haemophilia and related bleeding disorders. This activity is namely called the Humanitarian Aid Program. Cash contributions are utilized to cover the operational costs related the Humanitarian Aid Program, to support other charitable activities and to pay WFH USA's administrative expenses. The scope of WFH USA's fund-raising activities is reasonable in light of its charitable activities. More specifically, the WFH USA employs a National Director and the WFH employs a full-time Development Director who is assisted by an Annual Giving Manager and a Fundraising Officer.
2. **The Charity's Percentage of Public Support.** WFH USA's total support from the public during the five-year period ending CY 2012 was at 10.40%; for the five-year period ending CY 2013 the ratio increases to 11.49%. As explained in Part III of Form 990, WFH USA's mission is to mobilize US support for the WFH's global mission to improve and sustain care for individuals with inherited bleeding disorders around the world. As also explained in Part III of Form 990, the primary way that WFH USA carries out that mission is through a Humanitarian Aid Program in which it receives product donations that are then distributed each year in as many as 50 developing countries for treatment of thousands of persons with hemophilia and related bleeding disorders. As a result, the great majority of WFH USA's support is received in the form of in-kind contributions of blood clotting factor or other related pharmaceutical products mainly from manufacturers of those products. As there are only a limited number of such manufacturers, the more successful that WFH USA is in obtaining substantial contributions from them, the lower WFH USA's public support percentage will be. Thus, WFH USA limits its activities to a special field and that inherently limits the number of its in-kind contributors. In other words, the nature of WFH USA's Humanitarian Aid Program is the reason that WFH USA's public support percentage is relatively low.
3. **The Charity's Sources of Public Support.** WFH USA's public support is derived from a representative number of persons. WFH USA does not receive most of its support from the members of a single family or from a single business. During the five-year period ending CY 2013, WFH USA received in-kind contributions of blood clotting factor or other related pharmaceutical products from 8 separate (and unrelated) sources. WFH USA also received cash donations from more than 300 different (and unrelated) individuals or organizations during that time period.

4. **WFH USA's Governing Body.** WFH USA has a governing body that represents the broad interests of the public. Its governing body does not represent the personal or private interests of a limited number of donors. WFH USA's governing body is comprised of persons having special knowledge or expertise in the particular field or discipline in which WFH USA operates and/or other persons having knowledge of, and an interest in, WFH USA and its mission to improve and sustain care for people with inherited bleeding disorders. WFH USA's governing body represent a broad cross-section of the views and interests of persons with inherited bleeding disorders and persons devoted to treating those disorders. None of the members of WFH USA's governing body are selected by, affiliated with, or otherwise represent the interests of the manufacturers of blood clotting factor or other related pharmaceutical products that contribute such products to WFH USA.
 5. **WFH USA's Facilities and Services.** WFH USA provides facilities or services directly for the benefit of the general public on a continuing basis and maintains a definitive program to accomplish its charitable work on a world-wide basis. As already noted, each year, WFH USA's Humanitarian Aid Program benefits thousands of persons with hemophilia and related bleeding disorders in as many as 50 developing countries.

World Federation of Hemophilia USA ("WFH USA") was incorporated as a not-for-profit corporation in the State of New York on April 29, 1996. WFH USA is organized exclusively for charitable, educational and scientific purposes, and is qualified as a tax-exempt organization under Section 501(c) (3) of the *US Internal Revenue Code*.

The specific purpose of WFH USA is to mobilize US support for the World Federation of Hemophilia's global mission to improve and sustain care for individuals with inherited bleeding disorders around the world. As part of its activities, WFH USA receives product donations in the form of medicine from pharmaceutical companies and distributes these products to health organizations and other agencies located around the world.

WFH USA is an affiliated organization of the World Federation of Hemophilia ("WFH"), an international organization based in Montréal, Canada, and composed of representatives from hemophilia organizations in 122 countries.

1. Significant accounting policies:

The financial statements have been prepared by management in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations in Part III of the CICA Handbook.

(a) Revenue recognition:

WFH USA follows the deferral method of accounting for contributions. Restricted contributions are recognized as revenue in the year in which the related expenses are incurred. Unrestricted contributions are recognized as revenue when received or as receivable if the amount to be received can be reasonably estimated and collection is reasonably assured.

Donated products are recognized as revenue when received from donors and shipped to beneficiaries, and are recorded at their fair market value if those amounts can be reasonably estimated. Distributions of product donations are recognized as expenses when shipped on behalf of WFH USA to the beneficiaries, or sent directly by donating companies.

Endowment contributions are recognized as direct increases in net assets in the year. Investment income resulting from the contributions is reported on the statement of financial position as deferred investment income, and recognized in the statement of revenues and expenses on the basis of scholarships granted to recipients.

(b) Cash and cash equivalents:

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, bank balances less outstanding cheques and investments with a maturity period of three months or less when purchased. As at December 31, 2013 and 2012, there were no cash equivalents.

1. Significant accounting policies (continued):

(c) Financial instruments:

Financial instruments are recorded at fair value on initial recognition. Equity instruments that are quoted in an active market are subsequently measured at fair value. All other financial instruments are subsequently recorded at cost or amortized cost, unless management has elected to carry the instruments at fair value. WFH USA has not elected to carry any such financial instruments at fair value, except for its investments in mutual funds which are carried at fair value.

Transaction costs incurred on the acquisition of financial instruments measured subsequently at fair value, if any, are expensed as incurred. All other financial instruments are adjusted by transaction costs incurred on acquisition and financing costs, which are amortized using the straight-line method.

Financial assets are assessed for impairment on an annual basis at the end of the fiscal year if there are indicators of impairment. If there is an indicator of impairment, WFH USA determines if there is a significant adverse change in the expected amount or timing of future cash flows from the financial asset. If there is a significant adverse change in the expected cash flows, the carrying value of the financial asset is reduced to the highest of the present value of the expected cash flows, the amount that could be realized from selling the financial asset or the amount WFH USA expects to realize by exercising its right to any collateral. If events and circumstances reverse in a future year, an impairment loss will be reversed to the extent of the improvement, not exceeding the initial carrying value.

(d) Contributed materials and services.

Contributed materials, including product donations, are recognized in the financial statements when a fair value can be reasonably estimated and when the materials and services are used in the normal course of operations and would otherwise have been purchased. The fair value is established at the date of shipment.

Contributions of volunteers are not recognized in the financial statements because of the difficulty of determining the fair value of the contributed services.

(e) Management estimates.

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements, and the reported amounts of revenue and expenses during the year. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

(f) Related party transactions:

Monetary related party transactions and non-monetary related party transactions that have commercial substance are measured at the exchange amount when they are in the normal course of operations, except when the transaction is an exchange of a property held for sale in the normal course of operations. When the transaction is not in the normal course of operations, it is measured at the exchange amount when there is a substantive change in the ownership of the item transferred and there is independent evidence of the exchange amount.

4. Net assets (continued):

The externally restricted net assets contain funds received on behalf of the Susan Skinner Memorial Fund ("SSMF"). This endowment fund has been established to support the training and education of women with bleeding disorders. Endowment contributions are a special type of restricted contribution where the externally imposed restriction is that the resources contributed must be maintained permanently. The SSMF is managed with the goal of generating enough funds to distribute while maintaining the long-term viability of the SSMF. The available earnings are presented as deferred investment income on the statement of financial position.

Included in the accounts receivable are donations receivable for the SSMF of \$18,130 (2012 - \$13,050).

5. Product donations:

The Humanitarian Aid Program of WFH provides donations of treatment products to people with bleeding disorders around the world. Donations obtained from US-based companies are distributed by WFH USA in collaboration with Hemophilia of Georgia, a not-for-profit organization in the United States, and are recorded in the financial statements of WFH USA. Other donations that are not from US-based companies are also recorded in the financial statements of WFH USA unless a Canadian charitable receipt would be requested or there are legal reasons not to channel these donations through WFH USA.

Product donations are priced using the current year's *Red Book*, a reference document used by pharmacists to help them, among other things, to determine the pricing of most common drugs. For products not listed in the *Red Book*, WFH USA establishes their prices based on products with similar characteristics listed in the *Red Book*.

6. World Federation of Hemophilia:

Effective January 1, 2011, WFH USA and WFH signed a Services Agreement whereby WFH provides certain administrative and other services to WFH USA. Certain of those services, such as expenses including program support, humanitarian aid, among others, are provided without compensation and the rest of those services are provided solely for reimbursement by WFH USA.

Under this Services Agreement, the services provided by WFH without compensation are treated as a grant in kind and recorded as follows:

These transactions are measured at the exchange amount, which is the amount of consideration established and agreed to by the parties.

7. Financial risk:

WFH USA manages its investments portfolio to earn investment income and invests according to its investment policy approved by the Board. WFH USA is not involved in any hedging relationships through its operations and does not hold or use any derivative financial instrument.

WFH USA is exposed to credit risk and liquidity risk arising from its financial instruments.

(a) Credit risk:

Credit risk refers to the risk that a counterparty may default on its contractual obligations resulting in a financial loss. WFH USA is exposed to credit risk with respect to the accounts receivable. WFH USA assesses, on a continuous basis, these receivables and provides for any amounts that are not collectible in the allowance for doubtful accounts.

(b) Liquidity risk:

Liquidity risk is the risk that WFH USA will be unable to fulfill its obligations on a timely basis or at a reasonable cost. WFH USA manages its liquidity risk by monitoring its operating requirements. WFH USA prepares budget and cash forecast to ensure it has sufficient funds to fulfill its obligations. There has been no change to the risk exposures from 2012.
