SUBSEQUENT INSTALLMENTS OF THE SCHOLARSHIP FOR NINTH GRADERS IS AWARDED TWICE IN THE FOLLOWING SCHOOL YEAR WITH PROOF THAT THE STUDENT IS CURRENTLY STUDYING HIGH SCHOOL. THE ENTIRE PROGRAM IS CONTINUOUSLY MONITORED THROUGH A RANDOMIZED CONTROL TRIAL METHODOLOGY SO ESCALERA CAN DEFINITIVELY DETERMINE THE EFFECT OF THE PROGRAM.

PART I, LINE 2 General Response: Escalera's program strategy is to design (with empathy), prove (by testing), and scale (with evidence) solutions that end the school shortage in our lifetime. Empathy inspires design. We empathize with students to design solutions that work. PROVE BY TESTING. If it's not measured, it's not impact; and if it's not impact, it merits no investment. Results, not overhead ratios, are our metric for success. We're manics about metrics because of passion for mission. A mission without metrics is meaningless; like a ship without a rudder, aimlessly wandering the vast ocean of philanthropy. Evaluation is difficult to do well; few do it, and even fewer do it well. We do it well. You wouldn't take a drug that hadn't been clinically tested, and we wouldn't scale a program that hasn't been rigorously proven. We use clinical tests to prove programs. We randomize to measure impact. We randomly assign two groups to participate or not participate in our STAR and REACH programs in what experts call a randomized control trial (RCT). This provides us with a control group against which we can compare results. The control group allows us to determine whether we had an impact because we can exclude the effects of other things that are difficult to see, like a student's innate talent. All evaluation has flaws, and an RCT is no exception. We've just found that an RCT, when done correctly, is less prone to error than most other methods. As part of Escalera's RCTs, ongoing on-site evaluations and surveys not only monitor the grants but ensure that the grants are used as intended according to the program design. Escalera maintains detailed documentation of all of the evaluations, surveys, and awarding of grants to substantiate its evidence for success. For example, Escalera

keeps the original evaluations and surveys completed by its personnel, which include receipts signed by each student, their teachers, and parent representative upon receipt of their scholarship. Escalera is careful to collect data that ensures its programs are reaching the poorest of the poor. Selection criteria includes baseline and endline primary data collection including data from the marginalization index that is calculated using settlement level data on a variety of demographic and poverty indicators: proportion of population with earth floors, sanitary plumbing in the home, access to drinking water, access to electricity, refrigerators, over-crowded homes and adult rates of literacy and primary education.

PART III, LINE 3: Escalera's Benemerito Scholarship program was significantly changed after the closure of the Benemerito High School in Mexico City in June 2013. There were 131 scholarship students until June 2013. Escalera assisted all students who had not graduated in June 2013 enroll in a high school closer to home. 35 students continued to receive scholarships to attend their new high school, and Escalera will continue to assist them until they finish high school.

PART III, LINE 4d: Expenses \$46,397.00 including grants of \$14,400.00 After Benemerito High School's closure, Escalera helped 35 of its 131 scholarship students who had not yet graduated find a good school closer to home.
