General Conditions:

- 1. **Purpose.** The grant shall be used only for the described purpose or purposes and shall be so designated in the records of the Grantee.
- 2. Program Monitoring and Evaluation. The Trust, at its expense, may monitor and conduct an evaluation of all projects or operations funded by this grant. Grantee shall cooperate in such monitoring, which may include site visits by the Trustees of the Trust to observe the Grantee's procedures and operations.
- 3. Accounting and Financial Review. The Grantee shall maintain complete and accurate records of the funds received and expenses incurred by it in connection with the project funded by this grant. The Trust, at its expense and on reasonable notice to the Grantee, may audit or have audited the records of the Grantee to the extent they relate to the activities funded by this grant.
- 4. **Budget.** A copy of the budget establishing the basis for this grant is attached hereto as part of Exhibit A. No changes may be made in such budget without prior written approval of the Trust. Any funds received from the Trust and not spent in accordance with the approved budget shall be returned to the Trust, upon demand.
- 5. Tax Exemption and/or Foundation Status. The Grantee shall immediately give written notice to the Trust in the event that, prior to receipt of all or any portion of the grant, the Grantee ceases to
