In 2013, around 30,000 toys and clothing items and 16,000 pounds of food were contributed in exchange for raffle tickets. The toys and clothing items are valued at \$10 a piece and the food is valued at \$1.67 a pound. The toys, clothing and food are then donated to selected public charities that distribute the items to needy and military families.
1b	The golf tournament is held at the beginning of "Operation Santa Claus" and provides funds that are donated to selected public charities. In 2013, through sponsorships and entry fees, the golf tournament's net revenue was \$36,926 (Gross revenue of \$69,535, less direct costs of \$32,609).
1c	The silent auction is also held at the start of "Operation Santa Claus" to provide funds that are donated to selected public charities. The event includes live headline entertainment donated by the artists and auction items donated by various entities including local professional sports teams. In 2013, the event provided \$1,377 in net revenue (Gross revenue of \$7,500, less direct costs of \$6,123).
