### Annual Report for Dalton's Greater Works 2013

What another amazing year 2013 was for Dalton's Greater Works. Because of the support from the community, we were able to expand our services for the third year in a row. That means more support to our indigent and homeless community, and it means more work for the volunteers. Again this year, God allowed us to help, and be helped, by individuals needing service hours. Plus, he sent us more wonderful people to volunteer! He always provides what we need, when we need it, and as word continued to spread in the surrounding communities about our food pantry, clothing closet and meal programs, He brought more people to help with the ministry, and the group was more diversified in age and background than ever before!

Since the beginning of Dalton's Greater Works 18 years ago, the goal has been not to duplicate services already provided by other ministries such as Providence and Salvation Army. Our goal has been to provide services that are different either in physical needs met or scope of people served. Dalton's Greater Works is open to any person in need, but our friends base in the past has been mostly single people and families without children, often a single adult taking care of elderly parents. Our goals are to provide messages of God's truth and salvation and providing for the physical needs while treating each person with the respect and dignity that God wants for each of us. We daily serve individuals who physically live on the street or in one of the numerous camps located around this area. Most of these individuals suffer from mental health issues or some sort of trauma due to abuse to them by others or to themselves in the form of addiction. There is help in the community and we help these people receive these services, but many of them eschew formal help. This year, the number of families with children increased, mostly minorities, we've also again seen an increase in families made up of adults taking care of elderly parents, and we started seeing multiple generations living together to minimize expenses.

#### Services:


Last year we fed an average of 65 friends on Tuesday night and 50 on Sunday morning. This year the numbers are closer to 100 on Tuesday nights and 85 on Sunday. We still offer free laundry on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays and although we have added two days to our day center, we cannot meet the needs of the community. Our wonderful volunteer from the local barber shop continues to cut between 10 and 15 friends' hair every month. Our Food Pantry is one of the biggest draws. We averaged over 50 friends a week, almost double what we saw in 2012. It is our single largest pull on resources and God has provided us with a good group of donors who have kept us stocked in some of the items we cannot normally find at the Food Bank (peanut butter, meat and dinner mixes). Despite not always knowing how, when and where the food will come from, we still run the Food Pantry as Client's Choice.

Client's Choice means that the friend who comes to get food is given an item allowance and is allowed to pick the groceries. Studies of food pantries that use this method versus the normal pre-boxed method showed that more items were retained by the clients and the needs were met for a longer period of time. This style of providing against hunger also allows people to better manage medical issues like diabetes and high blood pressure. As long as low sodium and low sugar foods are available, our friends in need have been able to pick choices that help them live healthier lifestyles. Dalton's Greater Works Food Pantry also fills the gap that many of the food pantries in Dalton cannot provide for...single people and adult families without children. The pantry continues to be "manned" by some of our friends who want to give back for the help they have received and continue to receive.

Our Clothing Closet has grown and expanded in 2013. The family that maintains management of the Closet are bilingual, and have been able to help us in more ways than just helping people to pick out clothes. They also expanded our ministry into helping Mercy Door and several other shelters. We have been blessed by a large group of high school students who have started helping in the Clothing Closet and have made the daunting task of keeping donations sorted and the Clothing Closet stocked, into a manageable task for all involved.

Dalton's Greater Works continues to provide for necessary maintenance prescriptions, glasses, bus tickets for emergencies and to get back home, fuel for heaters and the occasional automobile, rent for someone who would be on the street, utilities to keep heat and lights going and sadly, the occasional funeral. Dalton's Greater Works lost two friends again in 2013, one was the mother of a member of this area's indigent community and the other was our dear friend who has been an integral part of the ministry since its start 18 years ago, our CFO Lorraine Raines. There are no words to express the loss of our treasured board member, just that God gives us strength to continue.

We ended 2013 with our third annual Christmas Toy Campaign. We were able to give 325 children gifts, serving the 132 families who came on Saturday, Dec. 14<sup>th</sup>. We suspect these numbers would have been much greater if Toys For Tots was not happening next door at the same time, and we were blessed with the opportunity to meet and talk with that wonderful team at the end of the day. Those of us who helped with the toy giveaway were over whelmed by the need in the area and humbled by the number of volunteers who showed up and gave graciously of their time, energy and friendship to help families make good choices.



#### Goals:

Due to help from a couple local churches, volunteers and individual contributors, we continued to meet several of our 2010 5-year goals. We still provide a bible for any person who requests one. We also continue to help people acquire their ID's and provided help with some legal work. That is solely dependent on the time of a couple of the board members and we continue not to publicize this service because those individuals have enough time to help the 3-4 a month that request help, but could not handle the numbers that would ask for help if they knew it was a free service. However, with the new requirements of Georgia to provide proof of citizenship to receive ID's, the requests for help acquiring birth certificates increased greatly in 2013. At the beginning of the year, we worked with the City of Dalton to get some of the disabled that are permanently homeless into permanent housing, closing the area officially known as Tent City. In the third quarter, we started working with the Dalton Whitfield County Housing Authority (DWCHA) to provide emergency shelter to those who meet DWCHA's criteria. With the DEO Clinic opening its own facilities under its own 501c3, we removed our goal of providing full medical services from our list, but continue to keep dental services since there is still no organization providing for this need in the community.

In the next five years, we would like to be able to provide job training, computer training, and financial management training. It is not our intent to be the largest food and clothing provider in the area, rather we would like to expand even further on the services that are unique to Dalton's Greater Works. We would like to be able to provide more laundry facilities, more hygiene related services, dental services and a way to take food and ministry to outlying areas, places we cannot reach with the van we acquired in 2010 or the bus that ChristChurch Presbyterian graciously allows us to borrow.


There are also some hopes and prayers that would make the "administrative" part of managing a homeless assistance program easier. We currently are given a great rent reduction, but we would like to have debt-free facilities and ownership of the entire premises. Dalton's Greater Works still cannot shelter men and women from the harsh elements of winter because the sprinkler system control panel is located in a part of the building that is leased by a night club. We were able to expand the areas of ownership to allow us places to store off-season clothing and furniture, although furniture normally goes back out as soon as it arrives. We now have a good group of volunteers to run the Day Center almost every day of the week, but having the volunteer staff available to help our friends apply for disability, learn how to use the computer, or train for job skills would be invaluable for getting many of these people out of the grip of hopelessness. God has proven Himself faithful month after month, and we know that our needs will always be met. This year we had more of a stable financial support base to help us to focus on using God's abundance to reach into the community in need, but we do not assume that any of these grants or donors are permanently going to provide funds, and are grateful for their continued support in 2013. We also would like to find a way to partner with grocers and other food pantries in the area to buy food at wholesale and provide for the needs of the area during this time when the major food banks in Atlanta and Chattanooga continue to experiencing shortages.

#### **Volunteers:**

We have an amazing group of volunteers at Dalton's Greater Works. The entire organization is run through the time and talents of those that freely give both of themselves and of their resources. There is not a single paid person at Dalton's Great Works. Darlene Hill is currently heading up our volunteer coordination and we welcome anyone. We do like to know what our volunteers are good at, and enjoy, so that they can be guided towards the areas they would get the most from, there are lots of areas of opportunity. This year our volunteer base grew by leaps and bounds, from around 70 to over 120, including youth from one of the local high schools and several of the smaller churches in the area. As I watch the work being done every week, I am amazed at how blessed we are with the diversity of individuals that gather as a team every week to see to this ministry. I can say that every single person was needed this year, and the increase in volunteers helped distribute the workload more evenly and allowed all of us to give more attention to those in need.


### Now to the boring part...the financials.


Here is the general breakdown of our expenses in 2013.



This year, we were again given a grant by a private foundation to pay for Operational Expenses. Because of that, we broke our Direct Services to our clients into Program and Operations in order to keep up with how monies were being applied. Operations for Dalton's Greater Works does not fall under the category of Overhead because everything in our facility is used directly for Client Support.

Everything that comes in goes back out. We do not charge for our services or for the food and clothing. Everything we receive from God is free, we are just giving as He gives. Because we want the people who support this ministry to feel confident in how the monies generously donated are used, here are breakdowns of the two categories.





This is a complete accounting of monies spent in 2013. At the end of the year, there was enough money to replace the heating system in the area of the building where the showers, laundry, food pantry and clothing closet are housed. We unexpectedly lost the HVAC unit the week of Christmas and were able to acquire a new one that came with a warranty, which will be installed in January. The security system purchased in 2012 was installed in early 2013 and was used to handle some issues with vandalism during the summer and helped to increase security on the premises.

We trust God to provide all our needs, and more; and hope that you feel we are being proper stewards of the talents and gifts we receive from you. Thank you for your support in 2013. Please continue to pray that we continue to follow God's heart in 2014. Sincerely,
