NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 2013 AND 2012

1. NATURE OF OPERATIONS AND SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Organization

McCullough-Hyde Memorial Hospital, Inc. (the "Hospital") is an Ohio not-for-profit corporation which operates a 60 bed acute care hospital facility in Oxford, Ohio. The Hospital offers inpatient and outpatient health care services to patients in the Oxford vicinity.

The McCullough-Hyde Memorial Hospital Trust (the "Trust") was specifically organized to provide financial support to the Hospital. Under the Hospital's by-laws, the Hospital's Board shall consist of the same individuals serving on the Board of Trustees for the Trust.

The accompanying financial statements present only the financial position, operations, changes in net assets and cash flows of the Hospital. As the Trust controls the Hospital, the Hospital's financial statements are consolidated into the Trust's consolidated financial statements in a separate report.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make certain assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

For the purposes of the accompanying financial statements, the Hospital considers all highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less to be cash equivalents.

Financial instruments which potentially subject the Hospital to concentrations of credit risk consist principally of cash and cash equivalents and patient accounts receivable.

The Hospital places its cash and cash equivalents with high credit quality financial institutions. The Hospital periodically maintains cash balances which are in excess of those insured by the Federal Depository Insurance Corporation. The Hospital has not experienced losses in such accounts. The Hospital believes they are not exposed to any significant credit risk on cash and cash equivalents.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 2013 AND 2012

Inventories

Inventories, which consist of pharmaceutical, medical and surgery supplies, are stated at the lower of cost or market determined by the first-in, first-out method.

Property and Equipment

Property and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation and amortization are provided over the estimated useful lives of the assets using the straight-line method. The Hospital capitalizes all equipment (1) costing more than \$2,000 and (2) having a useful life of two or more years.

Patient Accounts Receivable and Net Patient Service Revenue

The Hospital recognizes net patient service revenues on the accrual basis of accounting in the reporting period in which services are performed based on the current gross charge structure, less actual adjustments and estimated discounts for contractual allowances, principally for patients covered by Medicare, Medicaid, and managed care and other health plans. Gross patient service revenue is recorded in the accounting records using the established rates for the type of service provided to the patient. The Hospital recognizes an estimated contractual allowance to reduce gross patient charges to the estimated net realizable amount for services rendered based upon previously agreed-to rates with a payor. The Hospital utilizes the patient accounting system to calculate contractual allowances on a payor-by-payor basis based on the rates in effect for each primary third-party payor. Another factor that is considered and could further influence the level of the contractual reserves includes the status of accounts receivable balances as inpatient or outpatient. The Hospital's management continually reviews the contractual estimation process to consider and incorporate updates to laws and regulations and the frequent changes in managed care contractual terms that result from contract renegotiations and renewals.

Payors include federal and state agencies, including Medicare and Medicaid, managed care health plans, commercial insurance companies, employers, and patients. These third-party payors provide payments to the Hospital at amounts different from its established rates based on negotiated reimbursement agreements. Payment arrangements include prospectively determined rates per discharge, reimbursed costs, discounted charges, and fee schedule payments. Retroactive adjustments under reimbursement agreements with third-party payors are accrued on an estimated basis in the period the related services are rendered and adjusted in future periods as final settlements are determined.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 2013 AND 2012

Allowance for Doubtful Accounts

Accounts receivable are reduced by an allowance for doubtful accounts based on the Hospital's evaluation of its major payor sources of revenue, the aging of the accounts, historical losses, current economic conditions, and other factors unique to their service area and the healthcare industry. For receivables associated with self-pay payments, which includes both patients without insurance and patients with deductible and copayment balances due for which third-party coverage exists for part of the bill, the Hospital records a significant provision for bad debts in the period of service on the basis of its past experience, which indicates that many patients are unable or unwilling to pay the portion of their bill for which they are financially responsible. The difference between the standard rates (or the discounted rates if negotiated) and the amounts actually collected after all reasonable collection efforts have been exhausted is charged off against the allowance for doubtful accounts.

The December 31, 2013 and 2012 allowance for doubtful accounts of \$8,059,531 and \$7,973,000, respectively, relates to reserves for self-pay balances.

The allowance for doubtful accounts represents 90 percent of self-pay accounts receivable at December 31, 2013 and 2012, respectively. The Hospital's self-pay provision for bad debts increased \$32,912 from \$6,851,141 in 2012 to \$6,884,053 in 2013. The increase in the provision for bad debts was a result of increased self-pay revenue. Bad debt allowances at December 31, 2013 increased due to the increased balance of self-pay accounts at year end.

The Hospital does not maintain a material allowance for doubtful accounts from third-party payors, nor did it have significant write-offs from third-party payors relating to doubtful accounts.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 2013 AND 2012

Physician Recruitment Agreements and Physician Advances Receivable

Consistent with the Hospital's policy on physician relocation and recruitment, the Hospital provides income guarantees to certain physicians who agree to relocate to the community to fill a need in the Hospital's service area and commit to remain in practice for a specified term. Under such agreements, the Hospital is required to make payments to the physicians in excess of amounts earned in their respective practices up to the amount of the income guarantee. Income guarantee periods are generally two years. Such payments are recoverable from the physicians in the event that their commitment period is not met, which is typically three years. The Hospital also advances monies to physicians under various loan agreements. These loans are unsecured and are forgiven systematically in accordance with the loan agreements. Should the arrangement between the Hospital and the physician be terminated prior to the end date agreed upon by both parties, the Hospital will pursue collection of any outstanding advances.

The Hospital recorded a liability for guarantees of approximately \$132,000 and \$263,000 in other liabilities at December 31, 2013 and 2012 for the estimated obligation to the Hospital under these arrangements with an offsetting asset recorded in prepaid expenses and other within the accompanying balance sheets.

Income Taxes

The Hospital is exempt from income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the United States Internal Revenue Code. Accordingly, no provision for income taxes has been recorded in the financial statements.

The Hospital has filed its federal and state income tax returns for periods through December 31, 2012. These income tax returns are generally open to examination by the relevant taxing authorities for a period of three years from the later of the date the return was filed or its due date (including approved extensions).

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Hospital and recognize a tax liability if the Hospital has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by various federal and state taxing authorities. Management has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Hospital, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2013 and 2012, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the accompanying financial statements. The Hospital is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 2013 AND 2012

Excess of Revenues over Expenses

The statements of operations and changes in net assets include excess of revenues over expenses as its performance indicator. Included in excess of revenues over expenses are investment income, unrestricted gifts and gain on disposal of assets.

Charity Care

The Hospital provides care without charge or at amounts less than its established rates to patients who meet certain criteria under its charity care policy. Because the Hospital does not collect amounts deemed to be charity care, they are not reported as revenue.

Of the Hospital's total reported expenses (approximately \$55,739,000 and \$55,063,000 during 2013 and 2012, respectively), an estimated \$712,000 and \$990,000 arose from providing services to charity patients during 2013 and 2012, respectively. The estimated costs of providing charity services are based on a calculation which applies a ratio of costs to charges to the gross uncompensated charges associated with providing care to charity patients. The ratio of cost to charges is calculated based on the Hospital's total expenses divided by gross patient service revenue. The Hospital participates in the Hospital Care Assurance Program which provides for additional payments to hospitals that provide a disproportionate share of uncompensated services to the indigent and uninsured. Net amounts paid under this program totaled approximately \$27,000 and \$91,000 for 2013 and 2012, respectively, and are reported as net patient service revenue in the financial statements.

Concentrations of Credit Risk

The Hospital grants credit without collateral to patients, most of whom are local residents and are insured under third-party payor agreements. The mix of receivables from patients and third-party payers in 2013 and 2012 follows:

Electronic Health Records (EHR) Incentive Payments

The Hospital receives EHR incentive payments under the Medicare program. To qualify for these payments, the Hospital must meet "meaningful use" criteria that become more stringent over time. The Hospital periodically submits and attests to its use of certified EHR technology, satisfaction of meaningful use objectives, and various patient data. These submissions generally include performance measures for each annual EHR reporting period (ending on September 30th). The related EHR incentive payments are paid out over a four year transition schedule and are based upon data that is captured in the Hospital's cost reports. The payment calculation is based upon an initial amount as adjusted for discharges, Medicare utilization using inpatient days multiplied by a factor of total charges excluding charity care to total charges, and a transitional factor that ranges from 100% in first payment year and thereby decreasing by 25% each payment year until it is completely phased out in the fifth year.

The Hospital recognizes EHR incentive payments as grant income when there is reasonable assurance that the Hospital will comply with the conditions of the meaningful use objectives and any other specific grant requirements. In addition, the financial statement effects of the grants must be both recognizable and measurable. During 2013 and 2012, the Hospital recognized approximately \$1,139,000 and \$1,008,000, respectively, in EHR incentive payments as grant income using the cliff recognition method. Under the cliff recognition method, the Hospital records income at the end of EHR reporting period in which compliance is achieved. EHR incentive income is included in other revenue in the statements of operations and changes in net assets. EHR incentive income recognized is based on management's estimate and amounts are subject to change, with such changes impacting operations in the period the changes occur.

Receipt of these funds is subject to the fulfillment of certain obligations by the Hospital as prescribed by the program, subject to future audits and may be subject to repayment upon a determination of noncompliance.

Subsequent Events

The Hospital has evaluated events or transactions occurring subsequent to the balance sheet date for recognition and disclosure in the accompanying financial statements through the date the financial statements are issued, which is April 17, 2014.

The Hospital provides charity care to patients who meet certain criteria under the Hospital's charity care policy without charge or at amounts less than established rates.

A summary of the payment arrangements with major third-party payors follows:

Medicare

Inpatient acute care services rendered to Medicare program beneficiaries and defined capital costs related to Medicare beneficiaries are paid at prospectively determined rates per discharge. These rates vary according to a patient classifications system that is based on clinical, diagnostic, and other factors. Medicare outpatient services are primarily paid on a prospective basis. The Hospital's Medicare cost reports have been audited and finalized by the Medicare fiscal intermediary through 2010.

Medicaid

Inpatient and outpatient services rendered to the Ohio Medicaid program beneficiaries are paid at prospectively determined rates per case of services. Capital related costs are reimbursed on a reasonable cost basis. The Hospital is reimbursed at a tentative rate with final settlement determined after submission of annual cost reports by the Hospital and audits thereof by the Medicaid fiscal intermediary. The Hospital's Medicaid cost reports have been audited and finalized by the Medicaid fiscal intermediary through 2007. Inpatient and outpatient services rendered to the Indiana Medicaid program beneficiaries are reimbursed under prospectively determined rates per discharge and standard flat fees based on services provided, respectively.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 2013 AND 2012

Laws and regulations governing the Medicare and Medicaid programs are extremely complex and subject to interpretation. The Hospital believes that it is in compliance with all applicable laws and regulations and is not aware of any pending or threatened investigations involving allegations of potential wrongdoing. Compliance with such laws and regulations can be subject to regulatory action including fines, penalties and exclusions from Medicare and Medicaid programs.

3. FAIR VALUE OF FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

The frame work for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

- Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Hospital has the ability to access.
- Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.
- Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

There were no transfers between hierarchy levels during 2013 or 2012. The Hospital's policy is to recognize transfers, if any, between levels as of the actual date of the event or change in circumstances.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 2013 AND 2012

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value as of December 31, 2013 and 2012. Assets measured at fair value on a recurring basis as of December 31, 2013 and 2012 are as follows:

Mutual Funds: Valued at the daily closing prices as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Hospital are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Hospital are deemed to be actively traded.

Corporate Bonds: Valued using pricing models maximizing the use of observable inputs for similar securities. This includes basing value on yields currently available on comparable securities of issuers with similar credit ratings.

Assets measured at fair value on a recurring basis as of December 31, 2013 are as follows:

During 2013, the Hospital issued \$10,314,685 in County of Butler, Ohio Health Care Facilities Refunding Revenue Bonds Series 2013A and \$3,131,352 in County of Butler, Ohio Health Care Facilities Refunding Revenue Bonds Series 2013B, with interest rates at 3.35% through April 2016. The interest rate has a reset date of April 1, 2016. The Holder of the bonds has the option to tender the Series 2013A and 2013B bonds to the Hospital on the interest reset date. Should this option be exercised, the repayment of the Series 2013A and 2013B bonds would be \$5,970,627 and \$1,925,865, respectively.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 2013 AND 2012

The 2013 bonds were issued to refund the County of Butler, Ohio Health Care Facilities Revenue and Refunding Bonds Series 2009A and County of Butler, Ohio Health Care Facilities Revenue and Refunding Bonds Series 2009B.

The Hospital has pledged to the bond trustee a security interest in all present and future gross receipts as well as a mortgage on the property. The Hospital has also secured the bonds through an amended and restated sublease agreement with the county of Butler, Ohio. The sublease agreement is in effect as long as the bonds remain outstanding. The net book value of the secured assets is approximately \$24,529,000.

The Hospital is bound by the terms of the Master Trust Indenture to various operational and financial covenants. The Hospital is subject to certain restrictive covenants with respect to days cash on hand, fixed charge ratio and debt to capitalization ratio. The Hospital believes it is in compliance with all operational and financial covenants as of December 31, 2013.

7. PENSION PLAN

The Hospital sponsors a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees. Net pension cost including administrative expenses related to this plan was approximately \$322,000 and \$333,000 in 2013 and 2012, respectively.

8. PROFESSIONAL LIABILITY INSURANCE

The Hospital maintains professional liability insurance coverage with a commercial insurance carrier. The policy covers losses of \$1,000,000 individually and \$3,000,000 in the aggregate. In addition, the Hospital maintains commercial excess liability insurance with limits of \$5,000,000 per occurrence and in the annual aggregate. Management believes claims outstanding against the Hospital at December 31, 2013 are adequately covered by commercial insurance.

Although the methods used were appropriate, other methods may provide different results.

10. RELATED ORGANIZATION

The McCullough-Hyde Memorial Hospital Trust (the "Trust") was organized to provide financial support to the Hospital. The Board of Trustees of the Trust determines the amount of support to be provided, as well as how the funds are to be used.

Amounts due from the Trust approximated \$2,265,000 and \$1,913,000 at December 31, 2013 and 2012, respectively.

11. PURCHASE COMMITMENTS

During 2012, the Hospital entered into a contract with Roche Diagnostics Corporation (Roche) beginning in 2013. Under the term of the contract, the Hospital received equipment at no cost and is required to purchase approximately \$1,967,000 in supplies from Roche over the remaining six years of the agreement.

12. COMMITMENTS

The Hospital leases space and equipment for various purposes with Ross Medical Complex being the most significant, with terms ranging from 3 to 15 years. Future annual minimum lease payments under the leases are as follows:
