# **“<sup>TM</sup> GOOD LIFE”**

## **~ Constitution and By-Laws ~**

### **Article I: Name**

The name of the group shall be known as "***The GOOD LIFE***".

### **Article II: Membership**

Members are any persons interested in music and willing to dedicate themselves to "***The GOOD LIFE***".

### **Article III: Meetings**

- (1) Meetings shall normally be conducted quarterly at a place and time to be determined by the President of the Board. These meetings will consist of the officers: President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Member-at-Large, Director, and Accompanist.
- (2) At such meetings, as a guide, Roberts Rules of Order may be followed, and open discussion from the floor on all measures shall be permitted and encouraged.
- (3) The Board may call a special meeting any time it deems necessary.
- (4) At meetings of the Board, a majority of the total Board shall constitute a quorum.

### **Article IV: Management**

- (1) The management of the group shall be vested in the President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Member-at-Large, Director and Accompanist.
- (2) The President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Member-at-Large, Director, and Accompanist shall be considered Office and have the power to establish, rules, committees, policy and determine other matters related to the operation of "***The GOOD LIFE***".

### **Article V: Elections**

- (1) The President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Member-at-Large will be elected by "***The GOOD LIFE***" membership. The President shall appoint a two (2) member nominating committee who will present a slate of nominees to the "***The GOOD LIFE***".
- (2) Elections will normally be held in April and take office in September.
- (3) Elected Officers and Member-at-Large shall serve a two (2) year term.
- (4) A simple majority of members present shall constitute a quorum.

## Article VI: Duties of Officers

### **(A) Board:**

- (1) The Board shall consist of five (5) elected members plus the Director and Accompanist.
- (2) The Board will manage all the affairs of "**THE GOOD LIFE**". It shall have entire jurisdiction over all matters pertaining to the conduct, control, supervision, and management of the group, and its finances and appropriations shall be made by it.
- (3) The Board may fill any vacancy of any unexpired terms among the officers or directors by a vote of the majority of those present at a regular meeting.
- (4) The Board shall have the following specific powers:
  - A. To make rules for conduct of the members.
  - B. To suspend or expel a member.
  - C. To appoint chairpersons.
  - D. To call special meetings.
  - E. To make, alter, and amend rules.

### **(B) President**

- (1) The president shall be the principal executive officer of the organization. He/she shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Trustees in general shall perform all duties incident to the office of president and such other duties as may be prescribed by the Board of Trustees from time to time. He/she may sign, with the secretary or any other proper officer of the organization authorized by the Board of Trustees, any deed, mortgages, bonds, contracts, or other instruments which the Board of Trustees have authorized to be executed, except in cases where the signing and execution thereof shall be expressly delegated by the Board of Trustees or by these bylaws or by statute to some other officer or agent of the organization.

#### Some duties of President

- Preside over meetings
- Create agenda
- Call special meetings of the Board as necessary
- Manage business of Good Life between meetings
- Report pertinent information to the Good Life membership

### **(C) Vice-President**

- (1) In the absence of the President, his/her duties shall be performed by the Vice-President and when so acting, shall have all the powers of and be subject to all the restrictions upon the president. In the event the President is unable to complete his/her term the Vice-President shall assume the duties to fill the unexpired term. The Board shall then elect a new Vice-President. The vice president shall perform such other duties as from time to time are assigned to him/her by the president or by the Board of Trustees. The vice president shall chair the Nominating Committee.

**(D) Secretary**

(1) The duties of the Secretary will be to keep the minutes and other official reports. The Secretary will conduct the official correspondence and keep all records, books, documents, and papers. The Secretary will perform other duties as from time to time may be assigned by the president or by the Board of Trustees.

Some duties of Secretary:

- Send notices of upcoming meetings
- Take minutes and read them at next meeting

**(E) Treasurer**

(1) The Treasurer shall have charge and custody of and be responsible for all money received in the group's name and issue payments for any bills approved by the Board, and file all appropriate federal, state and locally required tax and related reports. The Treasurer shall perform all the duties incident to the office of treasurer and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned by the president or by the Board of Trustees.

Some duties of treasurer:

- Collect and deposit monies from: dues, sponsor donations, singing engagements, concerts, and any other donations given to the Good life.
- Promptly pay all bills incurred by the Good Life throughout the year. Keep a record of each bill paid and what the expense was for.
- Keep checkbook current.
- Pay the Director and Pianist their stipend on the last Tuesday of each month
- Insurance payment comes due in January. Look it over and report any increase before payment is sent.
- Send a memorial check in the amount of \$35.00 to any current member who has lost someone from their immediate families ( husband, wife, child, mother, father).
- Keep a record of all sponsors and the amount they donated.
- Provide the list of sponsors for publication in the concert programs
- Look over all receipts and make sure that we are not going over the budget set for each project.
- Keep all receipts, cancelled checks, bank statements, insurance papers, etc., on file.
- Have bank statements reconciled with the president, or whoever has been designated to do this.
- Attend all board and financial meetings.
- Actively seek yearly sponsors
- Mail sponsor requests appreciations with Board approval
- Prepare annual budget for approval of the Board and Membership
- Prepare and submit Forms 990 and 1099 to IRS and Attorney General of State of OH in conjunction with the president.
- Submit books yearly to the audit committee

**Article VII: Amendments**

(1) Amendments may be made at any meeting of the Board with a majority vote of the Officers present.

## **Article IX: Gifts & Memorials**

### **(1) Policy:**

A memorial gift of \$35. will be sent to the immediate family when there is a death in the family of an active Good Life member. (Family is defined as mother, father, spouse, child, or “significant other”).

Cards will be sent to members who are ill when “The Good Life” Sunshine becomes aware or is informed of the illness.

Other situations will be handled by the Board on a case-by-case basis.

## **Article X: Purpose**

### **(1) The organization is organized exclusively for charitable, religious, educational, and/or scientific purposes under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.**

## **Article XI: Expenditure Restrictions**

### **(1) No part of the net earnings of the organization shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the organization shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in the purpose clause hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the organization shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the organization shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of this document, the organization shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by an organization exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (b) by an organization, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code.**

## **Article XII: Dissolution**

- (1) Upon the dissolution of the organization, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose.

## **Article XIII: Audits**

- (1) An audit of the organization's financial records will be conducted annually by the Board

## **(2) Article XIV: Open Meetings**

- (1) "**THE GOOD LIFE**" members are encouraged and welcome to attend Board Meetings.
